Topic - "HINDI AS AN INTERNATIONAL LANGUAGE"




Topic - "LANGUAGE AND THE SOCIETY"



Report


On Wednesday 10th of March, 2021 the Department of Hindi, St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Tiruchirappalli organised a National Webinar on the topic: "Contribution of Dr. N. E. Viswanath Iyyer in Kerala Hindi Literature". The webinar was intended to investigate and assess the contributions of Dr. N. E. Viswanath Iyyer, a well-known Hindi litterateur, translator and scholar who has his roots in Kerala. He has done a lot of work in translation literature. The resource person of the webinar was Dr. Dhanya B., Assistant Professor in the Department of Hindi, Government College Attingal, Kerala. She had published several research ppers and had presented as well as chaired several national and international seminars and conferences. She is a renowned academician and writer, well versed in Hindi language and Literature. The webinar was conducted virtually through Google Meet platform from 9.00 am to 10.00 am and it was open to the students, research scholars, academia and public. The webinar was a huge success in terms of participation as approximately 200 people were in attendance even though it was delivered virtually. Dr. Dhanya B., during her address of the webinar mentioned that Prof. N. Vishwanath Iyer was not only a hardworking teacher and researcher, he was also an outstanding creator of fine essays. . 



On 27th of March, 2021 the Department of Hindi, St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Tiruchirappalli organised a National Webinar on the topic: "The Reflection of Women's Conflict in Hindi Poetry during 21st Century". The webinar focused on women's expressions in Hindi poetry, especially by way of evocating the conflicts and contradictions of being female in a society which is entirely patriarchal. The resource person of the webinar was Dr. Sreelatha P. V., a renowned academician and writer, having sound and in-depth knowledge in the theme of the webinar.


The webinar was conducted virtually through Google Meet platform from 5.00 pm to 6.30 pm and it was open to the students, research scholars, academia and public. The webinar was a huge success in terms of participation as approximately 250 people were in attendance even though it was delivered virtually. Dr. Sreelatha P. V., during her address of the webinar mentioned several female writers in Hindi poetry who revolutionised the portrayal of women. During her speech, she exemplified the poems of Savita Singh. The speaker opined that the poet is always keen in her poems to depict how a woman is always the second sex in the society by way of being a mother, sister, daughter, wife and all the other roles that she plays all the time and never a woman, never an individual. A woman is always understood with respect to the man. She is always treated as incomplete unless associated with the other individuals making her always and forever the second sex.


The speaker also made brilliant comments on the poems of poets such as Pratibha Katiyar, who portrayed women as against the classic stereotyping that is ever so prevalent. In her words, modern poems in Hindi depicting women have a subtle satirical tone, criticising the stereotypes society creates, the labels that women become under gaze of the neighbourhood aunties and uncles, and the ever present *samaj* (society) which constantly tells how to be a 'good' woman and what is acceptable.







On Monday, 29th of March, 2021 the Department of Hindi, St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Tiruchirappalli organised a National Webinar on the topic: "Transgender Discourses". The webinar was intended to examine transgender discourses in modern Hindi literature, the underlying circumstances, the nature of these discourses and the new realms discovered through these discourses on gender and identity. The resource person of the webinar was Dr. Rakhi Balagopal., Assistant Professor in the Department of Hindi, Government College, Perinthalmanna Kerala. She had published several research papers and had presented as well as chaired several national and international seminars and conferences. She is a renowned academician and writer, well versed in Hindi language and Literature.


The webinar was conducted virtually through Google Meet platform from 6.00 pm to 7.00 pm and it was open to the students, research scholars, academia and public. The webinar was a huge success in terms of participation as approximately 190 people were in attendance even though it was delivered virtually. Dr. Rakhi Balagopal., during her address of the webinar opined that, from the linguistic perspective, interest towards the topic of transgender and gender non-conforming identities in Hindi literature has been drawn only recently, despite the relevance language use has on the general understanding of these identity expressions.


The speaker noted that the study of language in reference to gender identities can be traced back to the beginning of the twentieth century. At that time, research in this area consisted mainly of looking at the differences between the way men and women spoke and behaved when communicating. Nowadays, research has moved from thinking about gender with a binary perspective (male vs. female). She also stated that Indian culture has a historically marked tolerance as regards androgynous appearance. In this view, she exemplified the writer Devdutt Pattanaik, for example, using examples of mythical characters such as Shikhandi to argue that Hinduism was tolerant of, and even celebrated, the use of the modern term, "queerness". However, this tolerance is not displayed towards hijras, defined as female-identified persons assigned male at birth.


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

National Webinar on "Environmental Discourses in Contemporary Hindi Poetry"

Report

On Tuesday, 30th of March, 2021 the Department of Hindi, St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Tiruchirappalli organised a National Webinar on the topic: "Environmental Discourses in Contemporary Hindi Poetry". The resource person of the webinar was Dr. M. Kala, Assistant Professor and Head of the Department of Hindi, Mar Ivanios College, Trivandrum Kerala. She had published several research papers and had presented as well as chaired several national and international seminars and conferences. She is a renowned academician and writer, well versed in Hindi language and Literature. The webinar was intended to rethink literary critical approaches to the "environment" in Hindi literature as a frame for narrative worlds as well as aesthetic senses of nature. The webinar was conducted virtually through Google Meet platform from 5.30 pm to 7.00 pm and it was open to the students, research scholars, academia and public. The webinar was a huge success in terms of participation as approximately 220 persons were in attendance even though it was delivered virtually. Dr. M. Kala, during her address of the webinar opined that, beginning with the era of decolonization, following Indian independence, the project inscribes environmental and material histories as an important, though neglected, constituent of the study of modern Hindi literature. She revisited critical debates on realism and the Hindi poetry; modernism in the context of the Hindi poetry and the poetics of nature in Hindi eco-poetry and shows how an attention to the environment might enrich questions of literary representation and form. She argued that, with more contemporary senses of environmental crises while emphasizing the underlying tensions between an aesthetic of nature in Hindi eco-poetry and the hybrid natures that have emerged in the wake of globalization. The speaker also noted that themes and arguments concerning the relationships between India's population and the complex meanings and materialities of the environment with reference to literary treatments in the Hindi poetry, drawing also on environmental, social-cultural and political literature. In her words, examples from Hindi poetry (e.g. The killing of a tree by Kunyar Narayan), can be drawn, which deals with civic indifference and the public sphere; environmental activism and ecological thinking; and environmental metaphors of creative writing. During the webinar, attendees shared opinions, thoughts and posed questions regarding the theme with the resource person after the lecture of the resource person. During the webinar, those participated had the opportunity to discuss all their queries and opinions with resource person and with the other participants of the webinar since the audience included eminent academicians, writers and researchers in Hindi language and literature.
