


## REPORT ON NATIONAL LEVEL WEBINAR

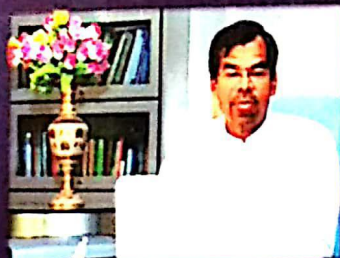

ENDOWMENT LECTURE**

The Department of History organized Inauguration of History Association and an Endowment Lecture on 03<sup>rd</sup> November 2020, (Tuesday) at 11. 30 a.m. Through Zoom meet. The title of the Endowment Lecture on **'The contribution of ASI for Heritage Preservation and Museums in India: with special reference to ASI site Museums'**. Resource Person for this meeting was **Dr. T. Arun Raj**, *Superintendent Archeologists, Govt. Of India, Ministry of Culture, Archeological Survey of India, Tiruchirappalli Circle.*

**Content of the Lecture:**

The proposal for a Museum in Madras was mooted by the Madras literary Society in 1846 A. D. And Sir Henry Pottinger, the then Governor obtained the sanction of court of Directors of the East Indian company in London. In January 1851 A. D. Dr. Edward Balfour, ( Medical officer of the governor's Bodyguard) was appointed as the first officer in charge of the Government Museum. The notification in Fort. St. George Gazetteer dated 29th April 1851 A. D. had contained first announcement regarding the opening of Madras Govt. Museum.


Explore Popular Museums in Tamil Nadu was Gandhi Museum at Madurai, Dakshina Chitra Museum at Muttukodu, A. P. J. Abdul Kalam House at Rameshwaram, India Seashell Museum at Mahabalipuram, Kanyakumari Wax Museum at Kanyakumari, Govt. Museum at Chennai, Gedee Car Museum at Coimbatore, Shembagamur Museum of Natural History at Kodaikanal.

## THE ORIGIN OF MUSEUMS IN INDIA (ARCHAEOLOGICAL EVIDENCE..)

- Labelled sculptures at the Buddhist sites of Bharhut, Bodhi-Gaya or Amaravati may indicate educational purpose though these can hardly be termed as the rudimentary stage of museums.
- The huge prakaras, 1000 pillared mandapas, paintings on walls and humpty numbers of sculptures in (any South Indian) temples also infer us these temples acted as living Museums in those days.
- There are records of royal antiquarians like Firuz Shah Tughlug (1351-81) who went to the extent of transporting two colossal Asokan columns from distant places.

BY DR. G. JOHN GILBERT**



**This event was presided by the Principal Rev. Dr. M. Arockiyasamy Xavier S.J, and department faculty members and students**

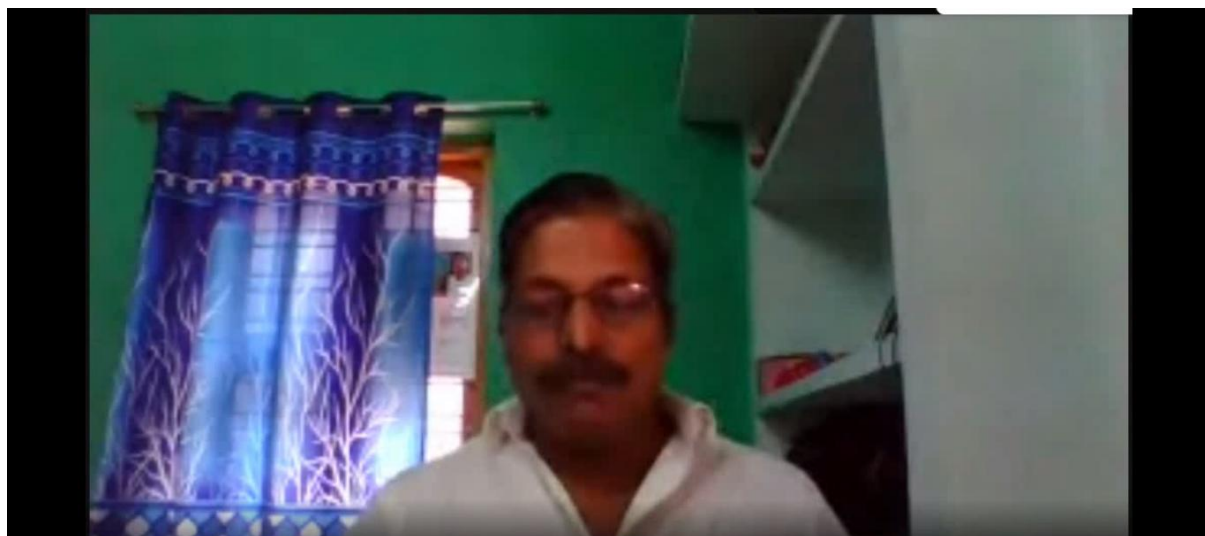
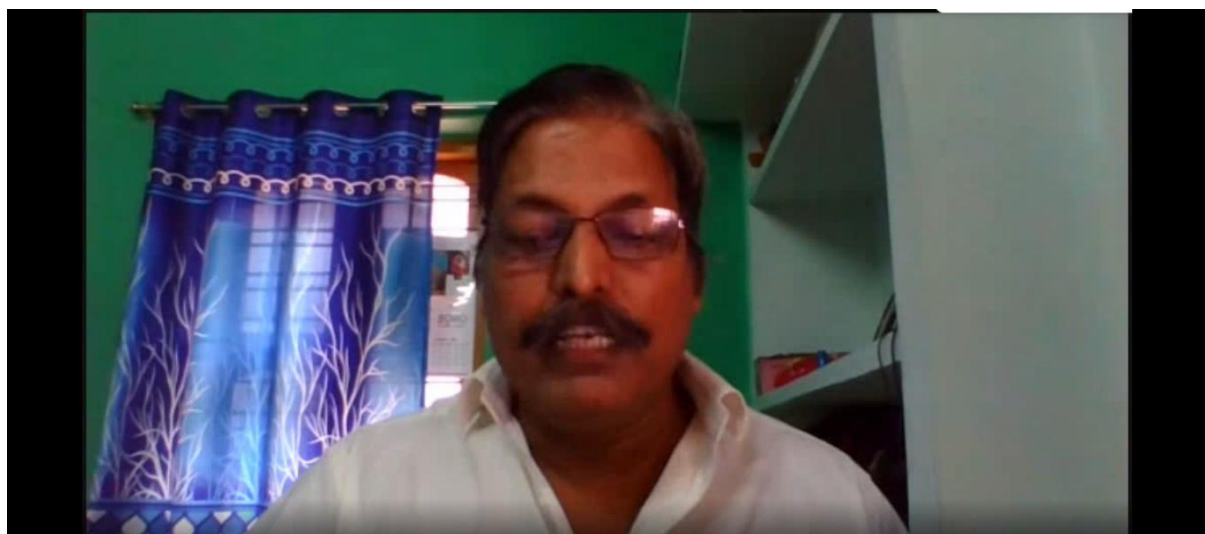
Students of I, II, III UG and PG students were participated.




## REPORT ON DR. T.SUNDARARAJ ENDOWMENT LECTURE

The Department of History organize Dr. T.Sundaraj Endowment Lecture through online on 16<sup>th</sup> February 2021 at 11.30 am it was presided by Rev.Dr. M.Arockiasamy Xavier SJ , Principal , St. Joseph's College . Dr. S.Rajavelu was the Resource Person delivered his lecture on Archaeological Excavations in Tamil Nadu .Welcome Address was given by Dr. K.Lingammal . Prof.S.Vadivel introduced the Chief Guest

The main idea highlighted by the resource person was as follows, they have excavated more than 175 sites , he said that temples play vital role , not only in worship it also served as an education centre , during flood period the people stayed in the temples. The inscriptions were written on the walls of the temple provides us lot of information. He also said that more than thousand sites were excavated in India .some of the foreign historians say that Indus Valley Civilization is a Dravidian culture , but some of the North Indian Historians are not accepting this point .The historians were decided to excavate sites of Korkai and decided to fix date for Sangam Literature . He also said that Romans had trade relations with Cholas , Pandyas and Cheras , lot of material remains were found to evidence it .

He said, most of the Indus Valley Civilization sites are found in Rajasthan and Afghanistan and also few sites are found in Gujarat and Rajasthan states of India . The resource person also said some places of Paleolithic sites , they are Vellore ,Tiruppatthur ,Tiruvannamalai and also he explained about Paleolithic age . They also have excavated palaces of Kattabomman , he was a palayakkarar of Panchalankurichi . He also said Thanjavur , Gangai Konda Cholapuram are some of world Heritage sites from Tamil Nadu . They are 24 world heritage sites in India. Alexander Gunningham (1848 -1872) father of Indian History.He excavated the first site from Indus Valley Civilization at 1860 . Sir John Marshal (1901- 1931) , he was the Director General of Archaeological department of India . In 1924 , he said Indus Valley Civilization is an Dravidian Culture . S.R.Rao , he was the father of Marine Archaeology . He excavated some parts of Kaveripoompatinam and some parts of Mamallapuram . He also discovered a Shipyard in Indus Valley Civilization . 




**REPORT ON AASA ENDOWMENT LECTURE AND PRICE
