When the unprecedented Covid-19 pandemic struck the world like storm, it generated suffering of an unthinkable scale across the globe. It did not spare the field of education. Rather, it wrecked havoc on the student community by disrupting their academic and, social life and causing learning poverty. The pandemic brought into sharp focus the academic vulnerabilities of large section of the student community. Globally, over 1.2 billion in 186 countries were out of classroom during the initial phase of the pandemic. The nations of the world made desperate efforts to bring the students back into learning process by launching some form of remote learning strategies. However, the success was partial with dramatic inequality in access to education within and between the countries. According to UNICEF, the remote learning facilities were used just by less than half of the student population and the mechanism for monitoring the end-users namely students was less than satisfactory. The cumulative result was the rising learning poverty among the children of middle and low income countries. The impact of learning loss caused by pandemic is likely to continue for several years.

The Coronavirus had a profound impact on the functioning of SJC. It brought about unprecedented scale of disruption in teaching, learning and assessment process. It would be no exaggeration to say that the college reinvented itself by quickly adapting itself to newer technologies and teaching methodologies. The college relied on ICT and digital intervention to adopt to the new normals of lockdowns, learning away from educational institutions and Google and other software enabled online classes. The College created Google Classrooms with unique institutional e-mail ids for 7,231 students and brought them onboard to ensure continuous learning. At St. Joseph's College 'Flipped Classrooms' have become the order of the day, and faculty engaged in synchronous and asynchronous modes of teaching. Online classes were handled using innovative tools like Nearpod and Kahoot. During online teaching process the faculty developed 1,912 e-Content for hassle free learning.

The office of COE undertook several initiatives like online distribution of question papers without system encryption in GCRs for CIA and ERP for Semester Examinations, Digitalization and On-Screen evaluation of Answer Scripts, information retrieval mechanism and automation at office of the CoE. These were helpful enable students write the exams without disturbance.

Though the College was successfully in reaching out to the students residing in urban and semi-urban locations, it faced obstacles in reaching out to the students from rural areas with poor ICT penetration. However, these students were guided to attend the online classes from nearby places where uninterrupted network available.

The College is now better equipped for blended learning necessary to enhance entrepreneurial prospects of the student community and confident about the future opportunities and challenges

Admissions

This year, a total number of 2842 students out of 30196 applicants have been admitted to different programmes offered by the college. 974 students have been admitted to UG programmes in Shift I whereas 1061 were admitted to Shift II. In Postgraduate programmes, 299 have been admitted in Shift I and 378 in Shift II. 10 and 120 students have been admitted to M.Phil and MBA programmes respectively. The student e-attendance Mobile App (Android cum IOS) is a new initiative with the help of II MCA students integrating daily teaching plan. Another milestone is SBI E-Pay Integrations deployed for this semester. The new initiatives for this academic year are Faculty Profile's web page, Valanaayam website, Alumni website, NAAC - AQAR 20-21 website, MCA website revamp, LMS Server and Application Deployment, Server Maintenance for OOCOE.

Our college supports ERP for the following colleges; Montfort College Bengaluru, Loyola College of Arts and Science Mettala, Gonzaga College of Arts and Science Krishnagiri, Annai Vailankanni Arts & Science College Thanjavur, St. Xavier's College of Management & Technology Patna and Jesuit Madurai Province Higher Education Commission. The successful journey of consultancy continues to assist the neighboring academic institutions.

FR. EHRHART COMPUTER CENTRE

Fr. Ehrhart Computer Centre, known as ECC stands very tall with 192 latest computers distributed over three different labs, catering the essential needs of the students of Arts and Science disciplines. The ECC is proud of having the top level IBM server called 'Blade Server' with the latest zero down-time dual set circuits and Xeon E5504 processor with 1 TB hard disk and 16 GB RAM. To distribute the high end server power, 9 NetGear 24-port network switches and nine patch panels with power managers are installed. In order to switch over seamlessly among the server blades, KVM switch is fixed with which eight blades can be attached. The Lab 2 was furnished with TWENTY NEW COMPUTERS having i5 the latest, 11th Generation Processor, 500 GB NVME M.2 SSD, 16GB DDR 4 RAM and state-of-the-art LED monitors.

In order to maintain the process speed in accordance with the new high speed server and latest client machines, the aging 100 MB/Sec network cables are replaced with CAT 6 type cables with 1000 MB/Sec speed. The

EB lines are renewed and restructured for better safety of the students. For longer uninterrupted power supply, 30 KVA Alltech UPS, 20 KVA and 15 KVA CONSUL UPS are maintained with 81 brand new 40AH tubular batteries. In order to facilitate the final year project image outputs better, a multi-function Canon Image Runner 2520 laser printer, Lipi T6306 and T6050 are maintained.

R2C-SJC Learning Centre

A new initiative of the Department of Computer Science and Race2Cloud Technologies, Bangalore, was inaugurated on 21st February 2022. Rev.Fr. Principal, Rev.Fr.Secretary, Dr. Abhinna Chandra Biswal, Delivery Manager and the CEO, Mr.G.K Raju, Race2Cloud Technologies Pvt. Ltd. Bangalore, Head of the Department, faculty members and the students were present on the occasion.

This learning centre creates an environment for incubation for the MCA students to learn and experience the corporate culture in the college campus itself, with the company Race2Cloud. This year 10 MCA students are undergoing this training with six of the company employees providing them the training. Twelve computer systems were earmarked for the benefit of students in this centre. Internet connectivity is provided to all the systems and provisions are made to use the laptops also. The students who undergo the training will be offered the placements by the company if they meet the company's requirements for recruitment.

PU-SJC MBA Twinning Programme

In 2020-2021, 126 students successfully completed their MBA degree. Among them 106 students secured First class. At present 126 students are pursuing first MBA degree in PU-SJC Twinning Programme, PU-SJC introduced new specialisation namely Operations and Supply Chain Management during this year. In all five specialisations are offered to the students.

International Student Exchange Programmes

The MoUs signed with Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA), and International Skill Development Corporation (ISDC) are on functional mode. The ISDC has conducted 56 sessions during 2021 – 2022 as part of the MoU. Similarly ACCA organised orientation and lecture sessions for Honours Students. A Student of BCom Honours S. Nandakumar(20UCR512) secured 87% in the global ACCA examination in the course Financial Reporting while the global first rank is 92%. The college has functional MoU with Fu Jen Catholic University, Taiwan. It is in discussion with Binary University Malaysia.

Examination Results

The overall pass percentage of the PG students in Arts, Science and Commerce streams are 89.82, 98.74 and 93.49 respectively. Arrupe Library

Our library has 182,439 volumes of books including back volumes of journals as on date. In this academic year 1278 volumes of books were added. The library subscribes to 91 journals. About 12,000 books per month are circulated from the stack. P.G and U.G reference sections are used by more than 90 percent of the students. We provided practical training to MLIS students from Holy Cross College, Bishop Heber College and Bharathidasan University, Tiruchirappalli. Our college library is the institutional member of INFLIBNET and DELNET. We are providing Plagiarism report through OuriginalUrkundu Anti Plagiarism detection software from this academic year.

Rev.Dr.S.Lazar SJ webinar on “Data Analysis and Reference Management Tools” was organized by Arrupe Library on 9th October 2021 through Zoom Platform. The programme began with the Prayer song. Rev.Dr.Emmanuel Arockiam, SJ, Library Director, welcomed the participants. Rev.Dr.Leonard Fernando, SJ Rector of the College offered his blessings and expressed his views on the importance of the Webinar. Rev. Dr. S. Peter, SJ, the Secretary felicitated and opined about the Data Analysis and its relevance in research. Rev. Dr. M. Arockiasamy Xavier, SJ, the Principal in his Presidential Address highlighted the uniqueness of the Arrupe library and its usefulness to the researchers. Dr.M.Dorairajan, the Librarian proposed the vote of thanks. In the Session I Dr. G. Stephen Vincent, Former Head of the Department of Statistics, highlighted the important points relevant to the topic ‘Testing of Hypothesis’. In his lecture, he stressed upon the Research as searching for new knowledge. The research work should be new, innovative and useful to humankind. The research work always moves in the direction guided by the *objectives of the research work*, which, in turn, depends on *research questions*. The resultant product of any research work is the

scientifically **valid answers/conclusions** to the research questions obtained through scientific methodology. All the research conclusions are to be supported by the data to get the approval of the scientific community. The collected data need to be analyzed to get the valid solutions of the research questions. **Testing of hypothesis in Statistics** is one such tool. This tool is imperative when the answers of the research questions are of a dichotomous nature like true or false; accept or reject. Using this procedure, the 'research hypothesis' of the researcher is tested for its acceptance or rejection. The conceptual clarity and application is more vital for any researcher.

In the second Session on "Reference Management Tools," Dr.B.Jayapragash, Associate Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, Bharathidasan University, Trichy lucidly explained that the Reference management is perceived to be tedious and time-consuming by many researchers, especially when it is done manually. In the past, references used to be written on index cards and stored in boxes. Now, reference management software allows for the digitalization of a personal collection of relevant scholarly publications. The earliest programs to manage the basic task of storing references and adding them to manuscripts have been around for over 25 years (including Endnote and BibTeX/LaTeX-based programs which are still popular today), but each individual entry had to be typed by hand. In the last 15 years a number of significant developments that have made reference management much easier for the researcher in terms of

1. Retrieval of reference information from online bibliographic databases
2. DOIs (Digital Object Identifiers) and other persistent identifiers for bibliographic information
3. Automated management of PDF files
4. Open Access for easier access to full-text content
5. Web-based reference management for easier collaboration and use across multiple devices.

Social Citation-sharing tools are designed specifically to enable researchers to manage their references and to share information about what they are reading. It is specifically designed to be used by researchers and other information professionals. It allows researcher to store, organize and retrieve references. It allows the researcher to arrange the references in required bibliographical styles. It also allows researchers to write the notes about literature that they have read or seen. In addition to that, a reference management tool offers the ability to connect and share with others.

The second Session focused on Free and Open Source Reference Management tool called MENDELEY and its features with practical approach. This webinar was very much relevant useful for research scholars to collect and organize their research articles in a systematic manner and also to provide the references in International bibliographical styles as per the requirements. was actively by more than 140 Researchers, Library Professionals and faculty members participated actively in the webinar.

Arrupe Library along with NDLI club and Department of MCA jointly organized a Seminar on Resources of National Digital Library of India on 22nd April 2022. Dr. A. Senthamil Selvi, Librarian, Holy Cross College, Tiruchirappalli explored the possibilities of accessing resources through NDLI.

LIBEX 2022 was organized by Arrupe Library from 15th to 17th March 2022. Booksellers from various parts of Tamil Nadu displayed their collections. More than 2000 visitors had an opportunity to go through the new publications.

IQAC

The IQAC was engaged in many activities for quality enhancement during the academic year 2021-2022, the major contributions being the establishment of JostEL, the institutional LMS, establishment of Joseph Start-up Centre and creation of documentation centre. It has trained 90 faculty in creating online courses and 800 students in taking online courses on LMS. The IQAC is also engaged in work related to Rankings and

Accreditation, and offering its support on the same to other institutions. It has also organised Awareness programmes for faculty, non-teaching staff and students.

- 1) A One Day Orientation for all the members of the faculty on **Good Teaching for Better Learning** was organised on 6th August 2021.
- 2) A One Day Workshop on **Criterion wise Data Verification for Mentee Institutions** was organised under the UGC Scheme of PARAMARSH on 27th September 2021 in which faculty from 6 mentee institutions participated.
- 3) A One Day Workshop on **Preparation for NAAC Accreditation – A Participatory Process** was organised on 29th September 2021.
- 4) A Health Awareness programme for Non-Teaching staff, **Health Awareness for Adults**, was conducted on 23rd October 2022.
- 5) A Two Day Workshop on **Developing Online Courses on LMS** was organised for the Teaching faculty of the college.
- 6) A One Day Orientation Programme on **Learning Management System** was conducted for the faculty engaged in the creation of Online Courses for the LMS of the college.

- 17) Two Orientation Programmes on **Healthy Relationships** and **Institutional Values** exclusively for female students and four for male students respectively were organised on 11th and 12th May 2022.

QUALITY AND SKILL ENHANCEMENT OF STUDENTS

Value Added Courses

A new vibrancy was given to the value added courses in the departments in which many students actively enrolled themselves.

REMEDIAL COACHING CLASSES

Fr. Principal constituted the following members to handle the Remedial classes for the slow learners and to the students who have failed in the CIA exams.

Dr. L. Arockiam (Coordinator), Rev. Dr. S.Arul Oli SJ, Dr. J. Maria Joseph,

Dr. D. R. Edwin Christy, Dr.ArockiaRajasekar, Dr. M. S. Xavier Pradeep Singh

The remedial coaching committee gathered together to formulate certain regulations and came out with concrete objectives to make the remedial classes more effective for the betterment of the students. As the outcome of the meeting, the committee members recommended the following suggestions.

Suggestions Made:

A. Defining the Remedial Coaching for our Students:

- Remedial coaching classes will be conducted for slow learners to provide necessary academic support to bridge the skill gap.

B. Plans for Implementation:

- Each department would identify minimum of 1 and a maximum of 3 remedial courses, depending on the number of failures in the courses offered by the department.
- Each department would assign a staff member for the identified remedial coaching classes.

- The assigned staff member would maintain the attendance and submit a brief report to the committee at the end of the course.
- The duration of the remedial coaching class could be 25 hours.
- The remedial coaching classes would be offered in the even semester of the current academic year.
- Procedure for evaluation will be decided by the department.

C. Funds from the College and Contribution by Students:

- ❖ Staff member who handles the classes could be paid Rs. 300/- Per hour.
- ❖ Students could be charged Rs. 100/- Per head.
- ❖ In addition, the committee appeals the College Management Rs. 5 Lakhs for both shifts towards the remuneration of the staff who would handle the classes.

Following are the Guidelines:

Keeping the above suggestions for implementations, the committee suggested the respective heads of the departments /coordinators to find out the courses and look and assign the respective professors for the remedial classes to be handled. Besides the above suggestions, few guidelines were also formulated such as the following.

1. The faculty-in-charge of the course would maintain the attendance of the students.
2. The faculty-in-charge would have to conduct at least two class tests (10 marks each) with a gap of 10 days (for the analysis of the course impact).
3. At the end of the remedial coaching classes, the faculty-in-charge would submit the following to the Remedial coaching committee:
 - a. a brief report including an analysis of the impact of coaching (based on the attendance and class tests)
 - b. at least five photographs shot on five different days
 - c. attendance record of the students

After the start of the remedial classes, the First Review Meeting of the Remedial course was held at 1.30 pm on 4th March, 2022 in the placement

office to share the points on the remedial classes. All the professors were very much appreciated for the good efforts taken by them to handle the remedial classes.

The Convener Dr. L. Arockiam explained the need and the guidelines of the remedial classes. He shared the decisions and suggestions that the Remedial Coaching Committee arrived at for the good conduct of the Remedial classes.

Most of the Professors expressed the need of class rooms and too many numbers of arrears in the foundation courses. The professors also expressed their willingness to take the remedial classes and some professors were ready to spend extra time for the welfare of the students.

The Second Review Meeting of the Remedial course was held at 11.45 am on 12th April, 2022 in the placement office. Rev Dr. S. Arul Oli SJ started the meeting with the thankful note and appreciated the efforts of all the members of the staff in handling the Remedial Classes. All the professors shared their experiences both positive and concern that they had gone through while conducting the classes.

The committee also confirmed that the management would give the remunerations to the professors who would be handling the remedial classes.

There were 18 courses conducted in which 230 students out of 352 students attended the remedial classes. Two tests were conducted by the respective professors during the 20 – 25 hours of classes, and the progress and attendance of the students were noted. The classes were very much helpful for the slow learners to get through the CIA exams.

UGC-NET/SET Coaching

St. Joseph's College, Trichy, organized an intensive state level two-day workshop on National Eligibility Test (NET) Paper-1 for the Lectureship/research aspirants on April 04-05, 2022. Around 200 participants comprising of faculty, scholars, and PG students of various Arts departments including MBA and Food and Nutrition participated in this coaching. Experts including Dr E Ramganesha, Former Registrar & Director IECD, Bharathidasan university, who inaugurated the program, trained the participants on Higher Education, data analysis and teaching, research, reasoning, verbal, and Mathematical aptitude. The current batch of CA Foundation course has strength of 22 students for this year 2022. (April 2022 - November 2023.)

St. Joseph's Institute of Tally Education (JITE) – 2021-2022

St. Joseph's Institute of Tally Education formally came into existence in the month of March 2021 and the Certificate course in Tally ACE was

launched in the third week of March and subsequently Covid-19 second lock down was imposed. Hence, classes were conducted on line and students took the online examination conducted by Tally Education Private Ltd, (TEPL) Bangalore.

Online classes were completed in the month of May 2021 and students were told to take up the three mock test for each module numbering three. In total, students took 9 mock tests before the final examination. Having gained confidence by appearing for the mock tests, students indicated their readiness to appear for the final certification examination. Then, the Centre Head, Dr.G.John would activate the test link for the final examination which would be alive for 24 hours within which a student has to finish her/his exam.

During the year 2020-21, a total of 89 students enrolled: 84 for TallyACE and 5 for Tally Comprehensive courses. Of these, 61 students took the final examination of which 59 successfully completed the course. Twenty four students got A+ Grade (Above 75%), 25 students got A Grade (60 -75 marks) and 10 students got B Grade (36-60 marks). Two students were not able to complete the tests due to connectivity issues. All the successful students received their certificates from TEPL.

During this year, in March 2022, Tally Essential – Comprehensive course was launched. Currently, we are running three batches, one in the morning meant for students of shift II, one in the afternoon meant for the students of shift I and one weekend batch (Saturdays and Sundays). There are 89 students enrolled in the morning batch, 45 students in the afternoon batch and 10 in the weekend batch, totaling 144 students from different colleges. A team of dedicated staff members comprising Dr. G. John, Dr. AntonyJesuraj, Dr. Julius Ceasar, Dr. Vinoth Kumar, Dr. Bastin, Dr. Georgia and Dr. Arul are handling classes. They are ably assisted by Joseph and Leo at the Ehrhart computer centre.

Students make use of Ehrhart Computer Centre which is equipped with original/licensed Tally Prime software costing Rs.65,000 and JCICT for doing practical.

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JASS Special Activities 21-22

1. FDP On professional Communication was organized by JASS, on August 7, 2021 for the faculty members teaching Soft skills in the college. 47 faculty members participated in the Webinar. Resource person Mr.AjithVikram, Co-Founder and Director, Cross roads, Bangalore was the resource person.

1. FDP- Soft skills for Capacity Building , Series 2 – A Five day International Webinar was hosted by Joseph’s Academy of Soft Skills, SJC from November 8, 2021 to November 12, 2021. The significance and relevance of Soft Skills Training for Faculty members in Higher Education has gained swift momentum in recent times. St. Joseph’s College, the first institute in India to begin a Soft Skills course for postgraduate students, and the first institute in the Bharathidasan University to begin a similar course for undergraduate students, has reaped rich rewards as the campus recruitment and placements have risen sharply in the college. Joseph’s Academy of Soft Skills (JASS), instituted by the college to train the staff and the students in soft skills expanded its activities in Feb. 2021 by organizing a Five-Day International Webinar on Soft Skills. The overwhelming response, active participation, exciting enthusiasm in daily assessment tests and highly positive evaluation given by the participants have encouraged us to organize another FiveDay International Webinar on Soft Skills duly accommodating all the suggestions given by the participants. A total number of 242 renowned professors from 25 states and three overseas countries Saudi Arabia, Malaysia and Sweden participated and benefitted from this FDP.

2. St. Joseph’s College and JRS (Jesuit Refugees in Higher Education) jointly organized a **six day** Soft skills Residential training programme for Srilankan Tamil Refugees in Higher Education from November 22, 2021 to November 27, 2022 in St.Joseph’s College Premises. 37 Srilankan students from 13 districts participated and developed their soft Skills. A first time

experience of such an intensive training programme of this kind. 25 Soft skills Faculty members of St. Joseph's College were involved in this residential training programme.

3. A two outdoor workshop on Soft Skills Training for JASS Faculty Members. On March 25, 2022 and March 26, 2022, a two day outdoor training programme was organized at Auxilium Provincial House, Salesian Sisters, Manikandam, Tiruchirappalli. A total number of 42 Staff members who are teaching soft Skills both from Shift One and Shift Two attended and benefitted from the highly interactive, participatory training programme. The Resource person for Day 1: Mr. Roger Joseph Lurshay, HR, consultant, Oracle , Bangalore and Day 2: Dr.K.Alex, Vice Principal and Dr.J. John Love Joy, Assistance professor , SJC.

Joseph's Academy of Soft Skills is profoundly thankful to Rev.Dr.Leonard Fernando SJ, Rector, Rev.Dr.Peter SJ, Secretary and Rev.Dr. M. Arockiasamy SJ, Principal for their enormous support and encouragement for the growth of Joseph's Academy of Soft skills.

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JIM (Joseph Institute of Management)

The academic year began on July 3, 2022 with a faculty orientation workshop conducted online by Prof. Hariharan. Academic thrusts are the way of life @ JIM. In spite of the on - off bouts of corona and its effects happening frequently, JIM never lost its ground in taking up academics to the next level. After a short course on communicative competence, bridge

courses in Accounting and Quantitative Methods conducted, the students got into the regular stream.

To increase diversity in the intake of the students, JIM reached out to other parts of India, through social media and emails to colleges and universities. This year, the admissions was done in 3 phases -April and in May. It worked well since the students had a choice of selecting their month/dates and again due to word of mouth, many aspirants applied for the MBA programme at JIM.

A record number of 69 lectures – online and offline were conducted in spite of the severe hardships faced due to Corona. This year, we were again working on our curriculum right from the start. An academic advisory committee consisting of eminent professionals from industry and business was onboarded to advice and suggest for changes in the new era of business. Logistics and supply chain management is brought as a new specialisation area from the next academic year onwards.

This year and again for the first time in JIM, a e-newsletter titled “JIM CONNECT” was rolled of in the month of November 2021. A student initiative, the newsletter enables the students to learn and write on contemporary issues in business. Parents Teacher interface was organised for both the first- and second-year students regularly. Take this opportunity to thank them for their whole-hearted cooperation extended to JIM in all possible ways.

This year, a special place for MDP centre and a dedicated office room for NBA and AICTE accreditations was inaugurated by Rev.Fr. Rector. Work has started to get NBA accreditation. An external expert has been put in place to advice and work on this project. Jim lawns was remade to add more pomp to its existing infrastructure and 2 additional kiosks were constructed this year. JIM library has more than 6500 titles and has subscribed to 22,000 e-books and data bases viz., EBSCO, J-Gate, Press Reader and India Business Insight. Two sessions per week are allotted to first year students and organized reading time in library is facilitated with a designated faculty.

Students were mentored and meetings with them were conducted as scheduled. Scholarships were given to 49 students with a total sum of Rs 14,95,450 dispersed.

Weekly once all the students will join in specific domain clubs and Rotaract and involve in self-learning activities. This year, again due to corona factor, club activities were done intermittently. Club day with all the four clubs joining together did separate events inviting other college students on April 13. Rotaract team conducted a sports event for the special children on the same day.

As in the past, JIMNESIA, a talent hunt event, was conducted to unearth the hidden talents of the students of both the first- and second-year students. An in-house sport was also conducted this year. Both the first year and second year students were taken to an Out-Bound Training (OBT) facility near Coimbatore and Chengalpattu respectively. The Village Extension Programme in JIM shares the ideals of SHEPHERD programme of the college and tailors it to suit the learning process of JIM.

JIM saw heightened activity in faculty learning through FDP's this year. Six professors underwent FDP programmes in leading management institutes such as XLRI, IIM Indore, NITIE and others in areas such as financial analytics, digital marketing, case writing, digital and HR analytics, to name a few. All the faculty were attended the 2 days FDP on Future Proofing B-Schools at Loyola Institute of Business Administration, Chennai for learning the best practices from LIBA. The faculty were completed more than 40 MOOC courses from different platform.

This year, forty-four companies have visited our campus. 104 students are placed till date and companies are in the pipe line to recruit the remaining 8 students. 5 students opted out of placement due to personal reasons. The average salary so far is 5.00 lakhs per annum. The highest package is 10.00 lakhs for the placed students. All the students have been selected by companies for summer internship placement and the remaining will be placed before the second week of May. This year, many companies and

financial institutions and banks are paying stipend to our students. This is yet another milestone we have achieved in the internship area.

For the first time, JIM got into MDP with much focus. We have conducted 30 development programmes for management and supervisory personnel coming from different industry domains such as textiles, hospitals, educational institutions and hotels. The total number trained is a staggering 1100. This is again a colourful feather to JIM's cap and now we are confident that we will be the most sought-after institute for providing quality training especially for the SME's and NGOs.

This year, we organised 4 conclaves in all the 4 domains spread-out throughout the year. The conclaves were surrounded by the central theme – "Digitisation of businesses." Participants from other colleges and the general public participated in good numbers. This has been very successful from a learning perspective and we wish to continue in the coming years too. This year, an online Union Budget analysis was conducted with experts in industry and business analysing the pros and cons of budget.

Periodical review meetings of research scholars were conducted. Two research scholars have been awarded PhD and one more scholar has registered for doing his Ph.D. Faculty have gone length this year to do research projects. A major project was awarded for conducting excel training for the students. Around 50 students participated and benefitted by this programme.

Start-up mela 4.00, held on April 8, was organised to showcase business ideas and plans of our own students and also other colleges including the general public. Around 35 teams participated and at the end cash prizes totalling 1.5 lakhs were given. This year, we have bagged a consultancy project from Jesuit Refugee Services, Dindigul. Two training programmes apart from a survey work has been conducted so far and many more are in the pipeline.

JIM usually shares its Christmas Joy with the less privileged sections of the Society. This year, we called the sanitary workers of Trichy Corporation and in particular our own zonal sanitary workers. In solidarity with them, dresses and gifts were given for their outstanding work during corona times.

CLUB ACTIVITIES

CONSUMER CLUB

On 13th September 2021, a webinar was arranged to provide insightful knowledge on the rights and duties of consumers. Dr. P. Mohan, State President, Consumer Movement, Chaired the meeting and spoke on **Creating Consumer Awareness** among the people. He stated that it is the need of the hour as there is consumerism at one side and on the other there is plenty of fraudulent practices that lead to big challenges to consumers. He quoted many examples in product deficiency, advertising strategies and other means of marketing. Dr.Prof.G.Yasodha from Seethan Lakshmi Ramasami College (Autonomous) Tiruchirappalli spoke on the **Rights and Duties of Consumers** which need to be practiced by the consumers of all segments beyond threats in the selling process. Nearly 100 members participated in the programme.

The members from Tamilnadu Consumer Protection and Environmental Research Centre created awareness on various deficiencies and disorders due to environmental problems.



The Participatory Institute was subject to initiate some of the community oriented projects through students in the adopted villages with guidance from concern coordinating team. This had been leading it to receive up to perennial fund from the Ministry of Human Resource Development (HRD). The below proposed project was successful and progressive to the needy community in neighborhood adopted villages as an income generation activity. This was made an attempt as one of the best referential modules for the higher education institutes. Participatory Institute (PI) - St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) organized UBA Cell meeting for functional group leaders 18.02.2022. It had already created a whatsapp group for UBA cell members. All the UBA Cell members of students updated village activities in this group with regard to Moringa value-added products installation. In this cell meeting, we insisted about ongoing conduction of Moringa products production and to discuss about

village development plan and project implementation with UBA cell members. The ways and means of farmers training was discussed.

- **Orientation and Saplings Distribution to UBA Village's Farmers**

A special orientation program on Income generation through Moringa cultivation was held at central herbal farm in Nagamangalam. The project was initiated under the scheme of Unnat Bharat Abiyan 2.0 (UBA) by Ministry of HRD New Delhi. Major objective of the program was to promote sustainable income among farmers through Moringa products.

Rev. Fr. Dr. S. Peter SJ, Secretary, St. Joseph's College presided over the program. He pointed out the value-added product of Moringa is burgeoning business in current trends of the world market. He asked the farmers to utilize the opportunities and possibilities of the herbal garden.

Rev. Fr. M. Berchmans SJ Director, Extension Department - SHEPHERD felicitated the gathering denoting commercialization of agricultural products such as Moringa meeting the needs of the present market values. Dr. S. R. Senthilkumar, Head, Department of Botany participated as Guest. He added values to the program emphasizing on the value-added of products by its marketing linkages. Moringa tablets are in great demand in both developed and the developing countries in therapeutic uses because of their great efficacy and no side effects.

Dr. S. J. Vijayalalitha, Professor, ICAR - KVK, Tamilnadu Agricultural University at Sirugamani in Trichy participated as a Chief Guest. She delivered a resourceful talk over strategies in producing organic products and ways to increase by products for profits. Mr. C. Jeyachandran, Senior Coordinator, Extension Department - SHEPHERD appreciated and made a special applauds from UBA Farmers to Mr. S. Jeyaseelan, Coordinator for his keen interest to lead successful project objectives. Moreover, he mentioned the importance of project plan especially for the farmers from UBA villages.

There were over thirty (30) selected agricultural farmers participated from Five UBA villages such as Yagappudaiyaanpatti, Thoppupatti, Inam Mathur, Nagamangalam and Sethurappatti. The session was well addressed by welcome speech of Mr. S. Jeyaseelan, Coordinator and thanks giving by Mr. S. Raja, Senior Coordinator, Extension Department - SHEPHERD. The program was mastered by Mr. S. Lenin, Senior Coordinator for great juncture of limelight event. Mr. T. Joseph Christu raja, Coordinator, Mrs. Ariyamala, Gardener and fifteen (15) BBA students participated. At the end, ten Moringa saplings distributed to each farmers.

- **Seedlings Production and Maintenance**

It was obviously for the increase of saplings in the central herbal garden and beneficiary villages. The seeds of the verity namely PKM1 were distributed to the farmers and self help group (SHG) members in order to promote the value-added products. The seedlings production units were designed to promote in the central herbal garden and in the campus herbal garden.

- **Emerging Entrepreneurship Opportunities in Plant**

Mr. C. Jeyachandran & Mr. S. Lenin, Senior Coordinators and Mr. S. Jeyaseelan and T. Joseph Christ Raja, Coordinators of Extension Department-SHEPHERD attended a seminar and exposure visit on Emerging Entrepreneurship Opportunities in plant held on 21.12.2021 at Entrepreneurship Development and Innovation Institute (EDII) and Periyakulam Horti Business Incubation Forum (PHBIF) of Horticulture College and Research Institute, TNAU, Periyakulam. The aim of the visit was to disseminate the Emerging Entrepreneurship Opportunities in plant to the farmers in the service villages of Extension Department-SHEPHERD under Unnath Barath Abiyan 2.0. They had observed on cultivation techniques, collection of raw materials, processing techniques and marketing strategies.

- **Machinery Purchase – (Pulverize & Sealing Solar Dryer)**

The pulverize machine was purchased after pre view of various quotations from the producers. The machinery cost expenditure was attached in the below column. The sealing solar dryer was also purchased for the installation in the production unit at Nagamangalam. The pulverize machine, sealing machine and solar dryer were installed in the central herbal garden after a proper arrangements of electricity and its safety measures. The leaves were collected from the neighborhood adopted villages and the farmers from the UBA villages with a nominal cost in order to sensitize their increase of income from the source. The collected leaves were dried up in the production room about four days and readied for the processing. The Self Help Group (SHG) members and the farmers were given orientation training on handling the pulverize machine and Sealing machine, safety measures, usage of head cover, gloves and apron at operation. They were also taught how to labeling, stickering and packing the products. About twenty five and over beneficiaries were benefitted by the project implementation.

- **Value-added Production Unit – Inauguration**

The inaugural function of value-added product production unit started on 02.03.2022 from 10.30am – 12.30pm at Central Herbal Garden, Nagamangalam. There were about forty (40) participants such as SHG members, Professors, Coordinators, students from BBA and B.Com participated.

Mr. C. Jeyachandran, Senior Coordinator described elaborately about the perennial fund of Moringa Value-added Products Promotion by Unnat Bharath Abiyan (UBA) 2.0. He told about various initiatives of preserving forty varieties of herbal medicines produced from herbal plants and trees in the garden since 1994. He mentioned about the UBA project initiatives were executed by Prof. L. Arokiam after consultation with experts at Delhi. Participatory institutes were asked to initiate the project at least of five villages around the vicinity from Central Herbal Garden which was accessible to implementation. He also emphasized the importance of the project which was mainly for students and self help group members from the UBA villages. Herbal medicines, Solar Powered Leaves Dryer, Moringa Value-added Products and its samples were displayed.

Rev. Fr. M. Berchmans SJ gave an inaugural talk mentioning the praise worthy notes about the dignified personalities for their valuable presence. He denoted the commencement of the project at 2017 by Human Resource Department (HRD) recommending higher education institutes to adopt five villages at least. He prioritized the importance of the training centre and its usages for creating hundreds of trainees from it since 1986. He told about the value-added products were much beneficial to SHG members and farmers and would be marketed as income generation program. He emphasized on the importance of joint activity always leading to success. He assured that the college would continuously support the initiatives. Above all he showed importance on at least ten (10) beneficiaries families would be the successive stories from the project.

Mr. K. Vellaichamy, President, Nagamangalam Panchayat gave a presidential address recognizing firstly the dignitaries, SHG members, staffs and students. He stated the contamination and adulteration of food lead to health challenges of the individuals and created medicinal dependency syndrome. He requested the Moringa promotion project might be implemented for the beneficial of their Panchayat SHG members at first. He assured that any help arising out of the project would be supported by the panchayat with immediate cause.

Rev. Dr. Leonard Fernando SJ, Rector appreciated the efforts of the team remembering the visionary thematic deeds of Rev. Dr. I Jesudasson SJ idealized Gandhian Philosophical concepts. He told about the founder and his educational contributory deeds for the students. He also praised that having the founder as his class professor during collage days was ever haunting in mind. He admired about unfamiliarity of the products, its usages and happy about getting known the all powerful parts of the trees were as valuable as precious ones. Iron content seventy five percent (75%) in the product was seven (7) times greater than the orange. He told that the good initiatives by SHEPHERD department were noteworthy on promotion of herbal saplings at home and neighborhood communities. He pointed out on any of the good deeds implemented might be appreciable and could be

useful to the campus nutri-corner. He offered the advisory points on importance of the moringa products to the farmers' families, their children and malnutrition persons. He felicitated the extension department staffs and alumnae for their exemplary contributions with regard to health promotional initiatives which represented the beneficial deeds to the public. He thanked the management and staffs of St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) for their good initiatives on value-added products. He shared about his hurdles in starting up a business though He and His wife were scientists. He told about that he was happy in succeeding the business internationally after 2016 grown up to millionaire. He emphasized on the arsenic deposit within the individuals who would consume paddy rice without soaking and washing it properly for hours. He told that it had poisoned many of the Indians who ate paddy rice inadequately referring from the latest BBC news article. He happily told about the valuable information on government grants and subsidies for the promotion of agriculture sector organic businesses. He told that an individual could receive about twenty five lacs of amount for doing business. He shared about consumption of Moringa capsules were more familiar in the European and Western countries though the Indians were less aware of it. Two students will be permitted to attend the inauguration ceremony from a class. The products will be given to the staffs and students for the promotion of marketing strategies. The products can be channeled through the students to Siddha, Ayurvedha and medical shops for selling. The products uses and its promotional videos can be created and shared to the separate youtube or instagram web pages. It can be promoted to online store for the easy access of the customer to buy in their regular monthly home groceries pack. The products rates can be minimized for selling at the initial stage which can be affordable by the students. Also, it can be promoted to SJC school teachers. The quality assessment of the product will be done at the earliest with an adequate license. The product can be pretested with samples within the department or in the campus on 'World Safety Day'. The products can be promoted to the old age homes and orphanages in the districts. Students' expertise groups in marketing will have to be formed on 24th and 25th before 28th February 2022 of the month. The products will be given or handed over to students and staffs on the coming 28th March 2022.

Students sharing: The students from each department asked for suggestions. They are below, Daily or weekly ads of the products will be encouraged in the campus It can be added in the immunity booster packs and promoted to the district level medicine agencies, clinics and medical representatives with commissions in the initial stage. Face book page can be created for transportation at the digital market. The products can be promoted through the students who do imports and exports for the international standard of markets. It is better to make an expertise group and group wise classification fixing up with the target. It is better to link with at least three NGOs with MOUs for the sale promotions. The products can be promoted to the sick patients' daily served meal as a health drink appetizer in the esteemed private hospitals. The differentiation of the product weights such as 30g, 50g, 75g and 100g for the product easy purchase.

- **Sale Units**

Promotion of sale units were planned to establish in the nutri-corner, central herbal garden and Extension department – SHEPHERD. The sale units would promote its intensified product promotion beginning from students and from the staffs in the campus. The central herbal garden would act as core centre for the sale promotion of the products.

UBA-2.0 Marketting Cell: The value-added products were promoted in the marketing cell which could act as major component namely Extension department-SHEPHERD and Central Herbal Garden.

WhatsApp Group: The advisory committee members from college such as professors, students, experts and coordinators were all included in the whatsapp up group in order to be easy accessible to further communication to succeed the project output.

• **Advertisement, Market Places & Customers Feedback & Conclusion**

The both ends met at the point of success with expertise coordination of the project implementation team. The PI would garb its praise worthy progressiveness in dealing with multiplicity of community based assignments through various projects from esteemed higher education department from Ministry of Human Resource Development (HRD). These above standardized strategically methods of working might inspire the project scrutinizer hopefully to sanction further more expected projects to be implemented for sustainable promotion of higher education policies.

Central Herbal Garden, Nagamangalam

• Introduction

The ethno botanical activities and herbal promotion initiated in the year 1994 at the Nagamangalam college herbal farm. The aim of the programme was to popularize and promote indigenous health tradition among the people and improve access to basic health care. In this academic year (2021 - 2022), the department has organized various activities and training programs in the Nagamangalam herbal farm.

• Herbal Resource Centre

The Extension Department-SHEPHERD cultivated and maintained two hundred and twenty (220) medicinal floras with eight categories and that is maintained in fifty two (52) inner plots of the garden at Nagamangalam. It has maintaining Herbal medicine preparation unit, Moringa powder production unit, Moringa hybrid PKM 1 variety trial plot nursery raising unit, organic farming, vermi-compost, panchakavya and bio-pesticide demonstration unit. It has maintained with the help of college students and need-based labors.

• Herbal Medicine Unit

There are eleven (11) types of need-based herbal medicines prepared for health and well-being. The herbal medicines are prepared under the supervisions of reputed Sidha Doctor. The herbal medicines are Ammukara Soorana, Thiribala, Thirikadugu, Kumari Legiyam, Hair Oil, Minsarathilam, Mathan Thailam, Soodhaga Vayu Sooranam, Thudhuvalai Legiyam, Pinda Thailam and Panch Deepakani Sooranam.

Major Saravanan Memorial Day

Major Saravanan, graduated from [St. Joseph's College, Tiruchirapalli](#) in 1992. Saravanan was also the president of the student union at St. Joseph's College in 1992. He was an officer in the prestigious Bihar Regiment of the Indian Army who was martyred during the Kargil War. He was killed in hand-to-hand combat with intruders after killing four intruders in the Batalik area of Kargil Sector on 29 May 1999, along with 33 soldiers and four other officers. Saravanan had just completed four years of service on 10 March 1999. Major Saravanan was possibly the first officer killed in the Kargil War. His actions have led to him being referred to as the "Hero of Batalik".
