DR. M. ARUMAIRAJ ENDOWMENT LECTURE

Report

The History Association organized **Dr. M. Arumairaj Endowment Lecture** on 25th August, 2022. **Dr. T. Asokan**, Associate Professor and Head, Department of History, Bharathidasan University, Tiruchirappalli delivered the Endowment Lecture on "Pluralism in Contemporary India".

Pluralism is an essential feature of Indian society, and it has been present for centuries. Dr. T ASOKAN, an Associate Professor and Head, department of History, Bharathidasan University has extensively researched THE HISTORICAL SKETCH OF PLURALISM IN INDIA .Dr. T.Asokan argues that pluralism has been present in India since ancient times. The Rig Veda, one of the oldest Hindu texts, speaks of the diversity of gods and goddesses worshipped by the people of that time. It also mentions the existence of different castes and occupations, which further highlights the diversity of Indian society. Under Emperor Ashoka was a time of religious tolerance and pluralism. Ashoka promoted the idea of religious co-existence and discouraged the persecution of other religions. He even sent missionaries to spread Buddhism beyond the Indian subcontinent. The Mughal Empire was also a time of religious pluralism in India. The Mughal emperors allowed Hindus to practice their religion freely, and some even patronized Hindu temples. Akbar, one of the most famous Mughal emperors, established a new religion called Dini-Ilahi, which attempted to combine the best aspects of different religions. The British colonial period, was marked by religious divide and communal tensions. The British introduced the policy of divide and rule, which pitted Hindus against Muslims. However, the Indian freedom struggle led by Mahatma Gandhi and other nationalist leaders emphasized the importance of religious harmony and unity in diversity. The Indian Constitution, adopted in 1950, guarantees religious freedom and prohibits discrimination on the basis of religion.Dr. T.Asokan argues that India's pluralistic society is evident in its cultural, linguistic, and religious diversity. There are more than 1,600 languages spoken in India, and the country is home to people of various religions, including Hinduism, Islam, Christianity, Sikhism, Buddhism, Jainism, and Zoroastrianism. The government recognizes these different religions and has even established separate personal laws for each community.

In conclusion, Dr. T.Asokan's research on the historical sketch of pluralism in India highlights the fact that India has been a pluralistic society for centuries. While there have been periods of religious tension and divide, the overall trend hasbeen towards religious co-existence and tolerance. India's diversity is a source of strength, and it is important to preserve and celebrate it.

One Day Seminar on

Reconstruction of Tamil Nadu History through Archaeological Evidences at Keezhadi

REPORT

The Department of History organized an One Day seminar on **Reconstruction** of **Tamil Nadu History Through Archaeological Excavations At Keezhadi** on 14th March, 2023. The seminar started at 9.40 am with Prayer dance by the Department Dance Group followed by Thamizhthai Vazhthu. **Dr. J. Santhosh Kumar, Head** of the Department welcomed the gathering and he briefly explained the theme and importance of the seminar. Inaugural Address was given by, **Rev. Dr. M Arockiasamy Xavier, SJ, Principal** who conveyed the information through his experience and made us understand the importance of the historical region, Tamil Nadu.

The resource person for the first session, **Prof. I. Soosai** was introduced by Dr. K. Lingammal, Assistant Professor of History. The first Academic Session was on the topic, "A Glimpse of Literary Sources that led to Keezhadi **Excavation**" and started at 10.00 am. The resource person threw light on the earlier misinterpreted ideas related to historical perception. He suggested us to read the proper historical works and he suggested Mayilai Srinivasan, Naa. Si. Kandhaiya Pillai's works. He mentioned the presence of the word "Yavanas" in the ancient literature and he safeguarded the forts and showcased through words the relation that the ancient people had with them. He electrified the students with the word "Dravida India" which led them to a completely different thought process. He also said about the seal that was imprinted on the products while exporting from Madurai to Korkai. He highlighted the written evidence, *Silapathikaram* in which the words related to various ornaments were written and he also explained the importance of Madurai Kaanji, Nedunalvaadai and

Kalladam which explains in detail the context of Madurai region in the ancient days and through these literary sources one can understand the civilized form of living that existed around the Madurai region. Through his explanation of the word "Puracheri", one comes to know that the people also lived in the outer areas and that eventually led the historians to excavate Keezhadi. He also mentioned about the rock paintings which dates back to 30,000 years which made us accept the presence of habitation long back in and around the Tamil Region. His explanation about the transition of folk literature into classical literature changed our perspective and he also gave us the information about Suduman Veedugal and he added that this concept was mentioned in Madurai Kaanji and Nedunalvaadai. He also said about Ed Gover's Collection of South Indian Folk Songs and also mentioned the contribution of European Scholars to South Indian History. The session ended at 11.00 am and it enriched the audience with abundant information. The next fifteen minutes was allotted for interaction and the students asked constructive questions which made us know some extra information than the discussed topic. After a break,

The second academic session started at 11.50 am and the resource person **Dr. V. Vedachalam, Senior Archaeologist** was introduced by Dr. M. Britto Stalin, Assistant Professor of History. The topic of the second session was "**Panoramic View of Keezhadi Excavational Evidences**". First the resource person shared his experience in the field of archeology and displayed the pictures through a power point presentation he excavated at Keezhadi and gave us detailed information about the objects. Why Keezhadi became very famous when compared to other sites is the question that made all the archaeologist and historians wonder. He shared that the Keezhadi excavation has more structures made out of bricks compared to other excavated sites. The archaeologists allowed the media to know about the excavation process that was going on at Keezhadi and that was the main reason for its reach all over the world and the

session ended at 1.00 pm and the next fifteen minutes was allotted for interaction and the students threw questions to know more about it.

The third session of the day began at 2.pm. Professor. T. Beatinal Amalorpava Mary introduced the resource person Dr. C. Thomas, Former Head and associate professor, Thanthai Periyar Government Arts and Science College. The topic of the third session was based on "The Historical Reconstruction of the Tamil Nadu corroborating the excavation Evidences of Keezhadi". At the very first of his speech, he highlighted the scope of excavating historical spots in Tamil Nadu after excavating so many spots in India especially in the northern part of India. He said that the historical spots of Kodumanal and Porunthal in Tamil Nadu were very much appreciated for its scientific theories and mathematical concepts. Brahmi letters were the first one which emerged in this region. Other languages such as Sanskrit and Prakrit were borrowed from the language of Brahmi. Sanskrit and Prakrit were not well appreciated and written by the people. He also quoted the statement of V. A. Smith, "Indian History should be written from the river Thamirabarani which is located in the southern part of Tamil Nadu. He said that Indus Valley Civilization had an effect on only particular region where as the culture in Tamil Nadu has a vast effect in terms of education and culture which is about 800 BC to 300 AD. Some Indian Historians who demanded the evidence to prove the ancient culture in Tamil Nadu should refer the Sangam Literature which has more information about the culture. Nowadays, all the Sangam literary sources are proved that they are not myth no more as the new excavations are emerging around the Tamil Nadu. He also stated that the languages such as Sanskrit, Prakriti and were translated and written in the pots. All the people had the capacity of listening and writing. Thus it proved that they had no partial in education. Then he started highlighted some important points about the excavation site Keezhadi. "There is no sign of caste system and also there is no segregation in education. This is a custom that prevailed strongly in the society.

There was a sign of habitation of foreigners in and around Madurai. People were involved in agriculture and international trade with foreigners. So many foreign artifacts were excavated. Keezhadi is an industrial and urban center. Madurai was famous for weaving center. Many weavers lived the surroundings of Madurai. Chemicals for colouring the clothes were found and used it efficiently in colouring the cloths and pots. Arrow, trap and catapult were the weapons of the people. The Tamil literatures Perumppanattrupadai and Sirumppanattrupadai provide more information about how the economic conditions of the great kings of Cheras, Cholas and Pandiyas became weaker by having continues war among them. Water management was one of the best things that are being excavated in the Keezhadi spot. Excavation of well was appreciable. There were usage of ornaments prevailed among the people. Ornaments found in the Kodumanal were the finest ornaments. The secular concept was prevailed in the society. There prevailed worship of god Perumal which was mentioned in the literature Kalithogai". The next fifteen minutes was allotted for interaction. The session ended at 3.15 pm. Then, they screened the documentaries on "Pluralism in India". The program was followed by valedictory function. Rev. Dr. K. Amal, Secretary was the Chief Guest. He shared about his change of view towards history by sharing his own experience. Then there was prize distribution for documentaries. Mr. Kamal and team of I B.A. History got the first prize and the second prize was won by two teams, Ms. Anya Daffodil and her team of III BA History and Mr. Sivakathir and his team of III BA History. Dr. S. Manikandan, Assistant professor of History proposed the vote of thanks. The seminar came to an end at 4.15 pm.

Report

The History Association organized **Rev. Fr. Susai** Endowment Lecture on 21st March, 2023. The Endowment Lecture was delivered by **Dr. R.Ramachandran**, Adocate – Madras High Court, Social Activist – Director of PEARL Trust, Tiruchirappall on "Working of Human Rights in Current Scenario"

The resource person explaine some specific reasons for violation of Human rights at present society . Everyone needs access to medicine, food and water, clothes, and shelter. By including these in a person's basic human rights, everyone has a baseline level of dignity. Unfortunately, there are still millions of people out there who don't have these necessities, but saying it's a matter of human rights allows activists and others to work towards getting those for everyone. Human rights protect vulnerable groups from abuseThe Declaration of Human Rights was created largely because of the Holocaust and the horrors of WII. During that time in history, the most vulnerable in society were targeted along with the Jewish population, including those with disabilities and LGBT. Organizations concerned with human rights focus on members of society most vulnerable to abuse from powerholders, instead of ignoring them.Human rights allow people to stand up to societal corruption.

The concept of human rights allows people to speak up when they experience abuse and corruption. This is why specific rights like the right to assemble are so crucial because no society is perfect. The concept of human rights empowers people and tells them that they deserve dignity from society, whether it's the government or their work environment. When they don't receive it, they can stand up. Human rights encourage freedom of speech and expressionWhile similar to what you just read above, being able to speak freely without fear of brutal reprisal is more expansive. It encompasses ideas and forms of expression that not everybody will like or agree with, but no one should ever feel like they are going to be in danger from their government because of what they think. It goes both ways, too, and protects people who want to debate or argue with certain ideas expressed in their society.Human rights give people the freedom to practice their religion-Religious violence and oppression occur over and over again all across history, from the Crusades to the Holocaust to modern terrorism in the name of religion. Human right acknowledges the importance of a person's religion and spiritual beliefs, and lets them practice in peace. The freedom to *not* hold to a religion is also a human right.
