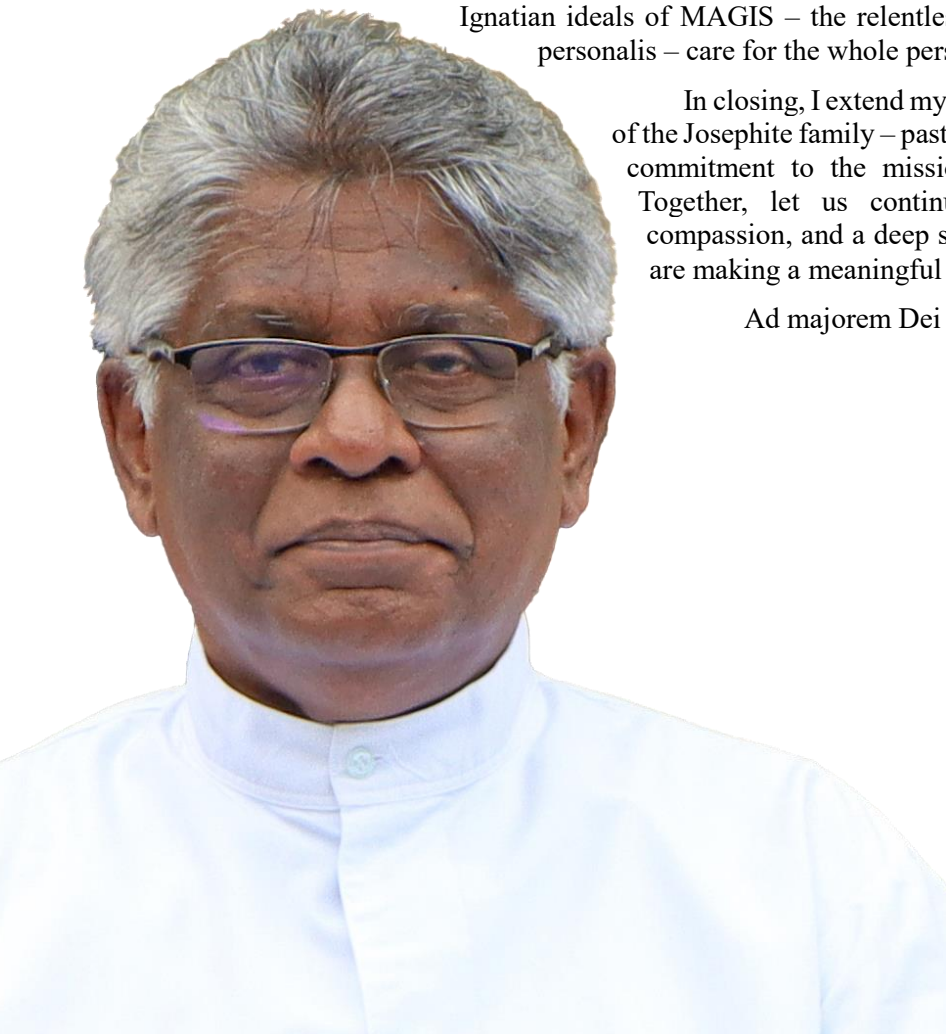

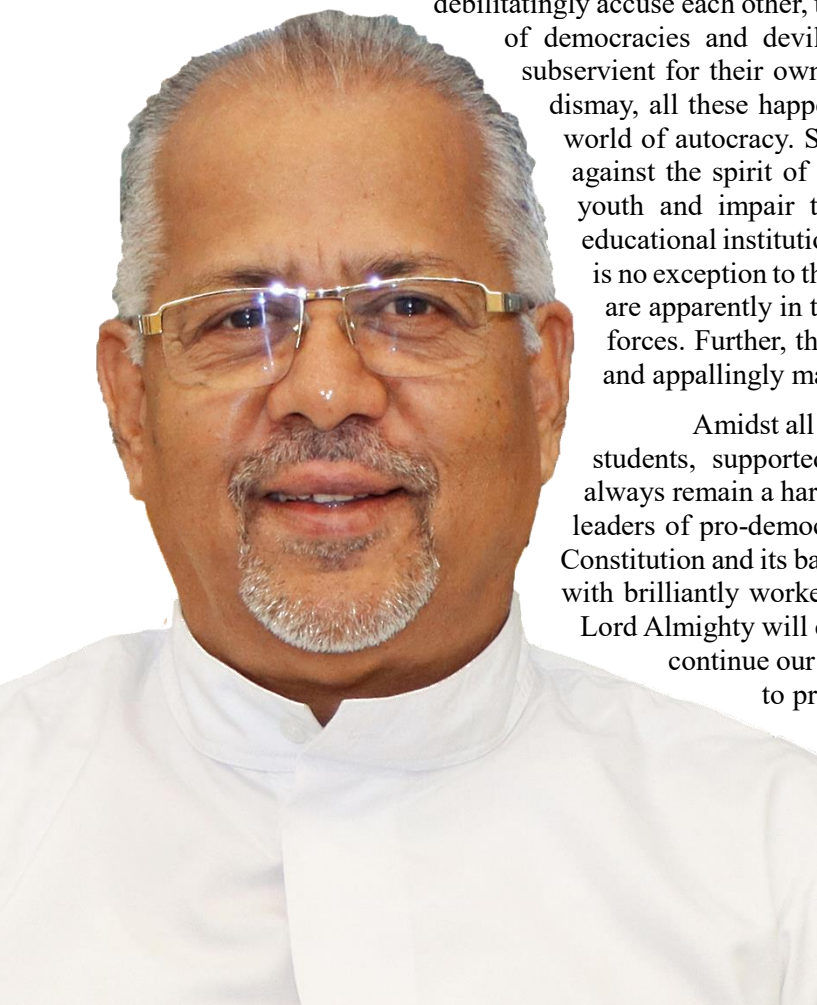

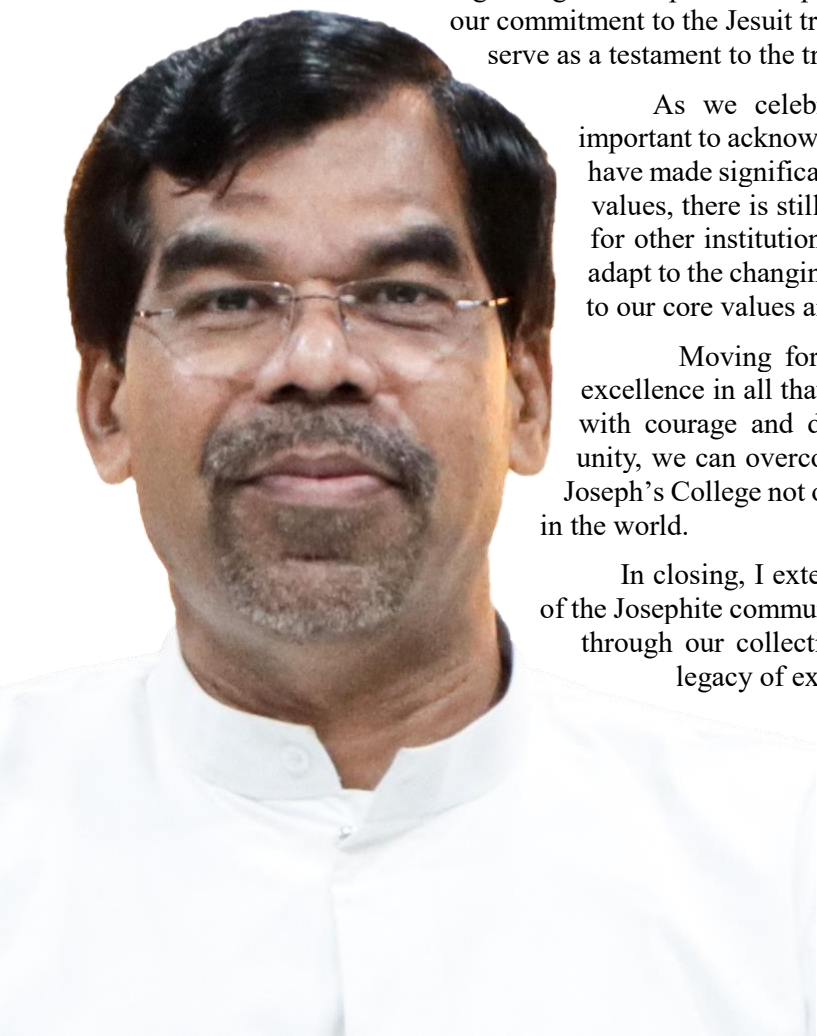

MILESTONES

Admissions

This year, a total of 2737 students out of 22080 applicants have been admitted to different programmes offered by the college. 899 students have been admitted to UG programmes in Shift I, whereas 995 were admitted to Shift II. In postgraduate programmes, 296 students have been admitted in shift I and 427 in shift II. 120 students have been admitted to the MBA programme. I sincerely thank the Admissions Committee members, headed by Rev. Dr. S. Paul Pragash SJ, for their availability and assistance.

PU-SJC MBA Twinning Programme

In 2022–2023, 163 students have been admitted to the MBA Twinning programme. 109 students belonging to the 2021 batch wrote their first semester examinations in the month of July 2022. The average pass percentage in all the subjects is 82%. 105 students of the 2021 batch wrote their second-semester examination in the month of December 2022.

International Student Exchange Programmes

During this year, a group of 15 students from Germany visited the campus on January 31, 2023, and interacted with the students of English and B.Com. Honours as part of a collaborative initiative. They discussed culture, the economy, and the educational system.

The MOUs signed with the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) and the International Skill Development Corporation (ISDC) are in functional mode. The ISDC has conducted 150 sessions during 2022–23 as part of the MOU. Similarly, ACCA organised orientation and lecture sessions for honours students. The college has a functional MOU with Fu Jen Catholic University, Taiwan.

The college has introduced a one-month international internship for interested students in association with Binary University Malaysia.

Examination Results

The overall pass percentages of the UG students in the Arts, Science, Commerce, and Vocational streams are 66.01, 79.03, 77.10, and 55.43, respectively. The overall pass percentages of the PG students in the Arts, Science, Commerce, Management Studies, and Diploma streams are 83.72, 96.70, 87.27, 98.32, and 54.84, respectively. My sincere appreciation is due to the Controller of Examinations, Dr. S. Alfred Cecil Raj and his able team for their dedicated work.

University Rank Holders

Our students have done extremely well in the University Rank Examination, conducted by Bharathidasan University for the academic year 2022-2023. Our students have 28 ranks. Postgraduate students secured twelve ranks, which include four first ranks, one second rank, and seven other ranks. Our undergraduate students have bagged sixteen ranks, which include two first ranks, three second ranks, one third rank, and ten other ranks.

Remedial Coaching Classes

The management constituted a committee with the following members to coordinate the remedial classes: Dr. L. Arockiam (coordinator), Rev. Dr. S. Arul Oli SJ, Dr.V.L. Jayapaul, Dr. J. Maria Joseph, Dr.Arockia Rajasekar, and Dr. M. S. Xavier Pradheep Singh. Following the guidelines given by the committee, the various departments conducted 24 courses in odd semesters, and 325 students benefited from these remedial classes. Almost 90 percent of the students got through the internal exam and became eligible for semester exams. In the even semester, almost 600 students joined the remedial classes in 34 courses.

UGC-NET/SET Coaching

The UGC NET/SET Cell at St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Tiruchirappalli, conducted a two-day crash course for NET Paper I on March 3 and 4, 2023. The Principal, Rev. Dr. Arockiasamy Xavier, SJ, along with the chief guest and resource person, Dr. E. Ramganes, Director, IECD, and Former Registrar, Bharathidasan University, presided over the inaugural ceremony. Many eminent faculty and resource persons were recruited to preside over the various sessions that covered the entire syllabus of NET Paper I. The college UGC NET/SET Cell Coordinator, Dr. J. Maria

Joseph, organised the event. Over 100 aspirants participated in the programme and benefited.

Rev. Fr. Siqueira Institute of English and Foreign Languages

The Certificate Course on Spoken English was conducted by the Fr. Siqueira Institute of English and Foreign Languages (SIEFL) for undergraduate students for a period of 45 hours. The course started on October 27 and ended on March 1, 2023.

IPR Cell

The IPR cell team of St. Joseph's College prepared an IPR policy for our institution, and the same will be implemented in the academic year 2023. A syllabus for the certificate course on "Intellectual Property Rights" for the forthcoming academic year is derived and kept ready by the IPRC team. An awareness talk on "Intellectual Property Rights and Their Opportunities" was organised by IPRC, St. Joseph's College, Trichy on February 28, 2023.

Archbishop Casimir Instrumentation Centre

Archbishop Casimir Instrumentation Centre (ACIC) has conducted demo sessions for college students on 15-06-2022, 10-10-2022, 14-10-2022, 18-10-2022, and 07-11-2022, respectively, other than its routine work.

ICAI-Accredited Centre for Foundation Course

In the academic year 2022-2023, 20 students registered for the CA Foundation course. Among them, 15 appeared for the CA Foundation examination, and 10 cleared the exam. The overall pass percentage is 67.

St. Joseph's Institute of Tally Education (JITE)

JITE was at the forefront of imparting the certificate course in Tally Essential, not only to our students but also to the general public, which was envisioned in the 'Naan Mudhalvan' scheme launched by the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, spearheaded by the Tamil Nadu Skill Development Corporation.

JITE completed two batches of the Certificate Course in Tally Essential, including TDS and GST. In the first batch, there were 58 students, mostly from Government Arts and Science College, Navalur Kuttapattu, Srirangam, Tiruchirapalli. In the 2 batch, the entire class of III B.Com. Hons. Took up the course. In all, 96 students completed the course and received certificates.

JITE, after completing the Certificate Course, continues to assist and aid students in enrolling them with Tally Education Private Ltd. (TEPL) in Bangalore

for online certification. This year, 100 students completed the certification exam. Of this, 52 students secured grades greater than 75 per cent, and 32 students secured grades between 60 and 75 per cent.

Counselling Centre and JASS

The Counselling Centre and JASS of the college conducted the following programmes in the academic year 2022-23: Leadership Training Programmes for the Students' Representatives on March 9, 2023; A meeting for all the higher achievers of all departments on February 22, 2023; A one-day indoor training programme in leadership skills on August 24, 2022; A special session on the topic "Make a Difference" on August 24, 2022; A six-day online faculty development programme in collaboration with St. Xavier's College of Technology and Education, Patna, Orissa, from January 31, 2023, to February 4, 2023; A two-day outdoor FDP for the faculty members of JASS at St. Joseph's Cluny Provincialate, Ariyamangalam, Trichy on December 1 and 2, 2022; A one-day outdoor FDP for the faculty members of JASS at Sisters of Silesian Provincialate, Manikandam, Trichy on October 11, 2022; a Students' Training Programme in Soft Skills on October 28, 2022, November 4, 2022, and December 12, 2023; a centralised GD for Shifts I and II on January 21, 2023, and March 1, 2023; and a centralised group discussion assessment for I PG students of Shifts One and Two.

JIM (Joseph Institute of Management)

"EXAMEN", a spiritual exercise founded by St. Ignatius of Loyola, was introduced in JIM between 1.00 pm and 1.10 pm. A good number of 30 guest lectures—online and offline—were done intermittently throughout this academic year. Logistics and supply chain management is brought in as a new specialisation area for the batch of 2022-2024. Professors underwent FDP programmes at leading management institutes such as IIM Indore and IIT Chennai in upcoming areas, viz., digital analytics and gamification. JIMSPIRE: A management meeting for PG students was organised for the first time in JIM on October 15, 2022. The Rotaract team of JIM organised a sports event for the special children on March 9, 2023. Club day activities culminated with a special programme named "Exchange, which was organised on March 11, 2023.

95 students have been placed to date, and companies are in the pipeline to recruit the remaining. The average salary to date is 5.20 lakhs per annum. The highest package is 13.00 lakhs. All 120 students

were selected by companies for summer internship placements.

The ICSSR-sponsored national conference titled “Indian Economy and Business Since Independence” was held on September 9 and 10, 2022. An international conference on “Dynamic Business Environments” was held on January 9, 2023.

The start-up mela 5.00 was organised on March 6. Around 50 teams participated, and at the end, cash prizes totalling Rs 1 lakh were given.

A total of seven articles were published in reputed journals by the faculty. Two consultancy projects, viz., Jesuit Refugee Services, Dindigul, and MPR Foods, Trichy, have been bagged by students.

JOSEPH STARTUP CENTRE (JSC)

St. Joseph’s College supports entrepreneurship among faculty, staff, research scholars, and students. It fosters creativity by encouraging, supporting, and promoting enterprises by providing an atmosphere for growth.

Jo-Lux LED Lighting was established to manufacture LED lights for indoor and outdoor lighting. This year, we have manufactured three varieties of LED bulbs. Jos-Green is an initiative established through the start-up centre of St. Joseph’s College, Trichy. As a part of JOS-GREEN, a low-cost windmill power system was installed in St. Joseph’s College, Trichy, on March 24, 2023. A team of six faculty members from St. Joseph’s College visited TREC-STEP on January 25, 2023.

JOS-ELECT This year, the electronics team took on the following tasks: BMI measurement unit; fingerprint module for midday meals; P10-based timer module; pH metre; P10 display for the museum; P10 display for Golden systems; automatic bell for the college; stabiliser service for the deputy principal office; conductivity metre service for the Chemistry Department-2 No.; and mantle service for the Botany Department.

Incubations and Innovations Cell

The Incubation and Innovation Cell conducted a motivational talk on “Technological Innovation and Entrepreneurship” on December 16, 2022, for faculty members, research scholars, and PG students; An orientation programme for UG and PG students in the theme of “Orientation for Budding Innovators” on January 28, 2023; and an inter-department Innovation Fest and national-level Innovation Fest - SJC Innovation Fest – 2023 on March 3, 2023. Twenty-

nine (29) teams participated in the Mega Event. The prototypes displayed by the participants were viewed by all the Science Department students on a time-slot basis. Winning teams were awarded cash prizes of 30,000, 20,000, and 15,000, respectively.

Arrupe Library

During the academic year 2022–23, our college library has added 1417 volumes of books, and the collection of books has risen to 1,83,856 volumes. 91 journals have been subscribed to this year. Book bank books are provided to the students throughout the semester. This year, our library collected more than 100 books from the faculty members of our college and donated the books to the Trichy District Prison Library. The library provides plagiarism reports through Original Urkundu Anti Plagiarism Detection Software. Our college library is an institutional member of NLIST-INFLIBNET, and the students and staff are using the e-resources available in the databases. We are providing training to the M.L.I.S. students of Holy Cross College.

We thank profusely Thiru Trichy Siva M.P. for his generous donation of books worth Rs. 50,000 to Arrupe Library. A good number of books are donated to the library by the faculty members Dr. S. Alfred Cecil Raj, Controller of Examinations (265 books), Dr. J. Wilfred Angello Gerald, Head of the Department of HRM (13 books and 18 journals), Dr. M. Dorairajan, Librarian (321 books), and Mr. D. Amalraj, Lab Assistant (31 books). Apart from this, Mr. J. Ramanan, Consulting Architect, Trichy (2 books worth Rs. 6,000) and Dr. M. S. Vijay, USA (36 books worth Rs. 1.0 lakh) donated books to Arrupe Library.

The Training and Placement Cell

In the academic year 2022-2023, the college has arranged placement drives through the Training and Placement Cell from July 2022 to March 2023. 61 companies visited our institution to recruit our students. Out of 61 companies, 29 visited our institution for the first time. 422 students have been placed through the campus drives as of March 10, 2023. 22 companies are yet to announce the results.

The Training and Placement Cell conducted an induction programme for first-year UG students on July 28; A transformational leadership programme on August 24, 2022; A webinar on “Where Can I Study MBA?” held on 25th August 2022; A Career Advancement Programme on CAT Exam preparation in association with MOCKAT on 25th August 2022; A special talk on “Career Avenues for BCom Honours”

on 20th October 2022; An orientation programme on “Employers Expectations” held on 7th November 2022; A corporate visit to Chennai was held on 19th and 20th January 2023; A Placement Preparatory Workshop for HRM Students on 8th February 2023; and A 3-day training programme on “Feel Employable” on 8th, 9th, and 10th March 2023.

Sports and Games

The College 179th Annual Sports Meet was held on September 3, 2022. Mr. N. Shelton Moses, Our Illustrious Alumnus, Former International Volleyball Player and Senior Manager in Indian Overseas Bank, Chennai, was the chief guest, and Mr. R. Narayanan, Our Illustrious Alumnus, Deputy Secretary of TRANTRANSCO in TNEB and Former Manager of Indian Junior Volleyball Team, was the Guest of Honour.

Our college athletics team won the 40th Bharathidasan University Championship for the 37th time, held at Anna Stadium, Tiruchirappalli. Christian Antonya 1st M.A.HRM and M.Santhosh 2nd B.A. Tamil have created new meet records in the 200 mts. as 21.1 secs. and in 400 mts. as 1.53.7 secs. respectively.

Our college athletics team continues to win the Bharathidasan University Inter-Collegiate Cross-Country Championship for the eighth time. Our College Ball Badminton team has secured the winning trophy in the Bharathidasan University Inter-Collegiate Championship from January 4, 2023, to March 5, 2023, organised by Jesu College of Arts and Science, Pudukkottai.

Our college team secured second place in the state-level intercollegiate tournament held at Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, Coimbatore, from March 3rd to March 4th, 2023. Our College Ball Badminton player, K. Saran has been selected as one of the players to represent the Tamil Nadu Boys team at the 67th Junior National Ball Badminton Federation of India in Maharashtra from March 30, 2023, to April 3, 2023.

Our college handball team has secured the winner's trophy in the Bharathidasan University Inter-Collegiate Championship from January 19, 2023, to January 23rd, 2023, organised by St. Joseph's College, Tiruchirappalli. The team secured first place in the Bharathidasan University Intercollegiate Tournament held at J.J. College of Arts and Science, Pudukkottai, on November 10 and 11, 2022.

RETIRING STAFF TEACHING AND NON-TEACHING STAFF

Dr. D. P. Jeyapalan (Associate Professor of Computer Science)

Dr. D. P. Jeyapalan was born on December 25 in Hanumanthan Patty, Theni District, to Mr. S. David Pandiyaraj and D. Maria Siromani. He was brought up in almost all districts of Tamil Nadu due to his father's employment. He was brought up briefly in Ayyampalayam (Batlagundu), his father's place, and had a chequered lifestyle till he got himself settled in Trichy. He is happily married to Dr. V. Renuga, Assistant Professor of Chemistry, National College, Trichy, and has a son, Jayanth, who is studying 12th

Standard at Amrita Vidyalayam, Trichy, and hopes to become a physician.

He had his schooling in many hill stations and villages. At one point in time, his father decided to put him in St. Aloysius School, Royappan Patty. He completed a Bachelor degree in Mathematics from Arul Anandar College, Karumathur, and then M.Sc. Computer Science in our college, M.Phil. (Maths) from National College, Trichy, and M.Phil. (Computer Science) from Regional Engineering College, Trichy. He got his doctorate from our parent university. He has studied French (A1 and A2) from Alliance Française, Chennai, and German (A1) from Goethe-Institute, Chennai. He has a PG Diploma in Marketing from IGNOU.

He was an active student in his undergraduate days and was regarded as an all-rounder. He bagged many prizes for co-curriculars at AAC. He is a player of Kabbadi and football. He was once the captain of the ball badminton team at the AAC.

Before joining our college, he had a brief stay at Bharath University, Chennai, for four months. He acted as the coordinator of the CS department, served as the head of the IT department, and headed the Department of CS. He was a two-time member of the Board of Studies (PG) and once a chairman of the BoS (PG) for Bharathidasan University. He served as a member of the BoS of many colleges, including TNPSC, and represented our university in TANSCH, Chennai, three times for computer science.

He will be retiring from service on 30th June, 2022. He is grateful to the brothers of the Sacred Heart

of Jesus, Palayamkottai, for the schooling they gave him and to all the Jesuits for their collegiate education and service.

Dr. N. Ravi (Associate Professor of Physics)

Dr. N. Ravi was born on September 6, 1962, in Pudukkottai to Mr. T. Namasivayama and Mrs. N. Saradambal. His father was a government servant under Pudukkottai Samasthan Palace and later served as a Tahsildarin in Tiruchirappalli and Pudukkottai Districts. Ravi did his primary schooling at Sri Subaramaiyer School, Pudukkottai. His high schooling was at TELC High School, Pudukkottai, where Mr. U. Sahayam IAS was his classmate. After schooling, he joined H.H. The Rajah's College, Pudukkottai, for PUC and B.Sc. in Physics. After graduation, he joined PG Physics at National College, Trichy, under the newly formed Bharathidasan University, where Prof. P. S. Mani Sundaram was the Vice Chancellor. He did his M.Phil. at the Dept. of Physics, Bharathidasan University, under the guidance of meritorious academician and Bhatnagar awardee Dr. M. Lakshmanan, and published his M.Phil. work in the *Journal of Physics A: Mathematical and General*, UK. He was appointed as the Assistant Professor, Dept. of Physics, at our institution in the month of July, 1986. During his service as NSS Programme Officer from 1991–96, Bharathidasan University awarded St. Joseph's College as the Best College. In the year 1999, the Physics Department organised an International Conference on Lasers and Their Applications (INCOLA-99) when he acted as joint secretary, and later, he organised seven international conferences as convenor and organising secretary. Dr. N. Ravi held various positions since 2003:

Dr. N. Ravi did his Ph.D. in the area of laser materials processing under FDP at Anna University, Chennai (1999–2000). He presented a research article in San Antonio, Texas, USA, organised by the American Powder Metallurgy Institute in 2000. He published 22 papers in reputed journals.

He retired on July 31, 2023, and was re-employed until April 30, 2023. By now, he has completed 37 years of experience in the educational field at St. Joseph's College. His wife, S. Kalyani, is now working as a joint commissioner in the Govt. of Tamil Nadu, HR&CE Department. His son and daughter are doing their higher studies.

Dr. S. Albert Rabara (Associate Professor of Computer Science)

Dr. S. Albert Rabara has been an Associate Professor in the Department of Computer Science at St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) in Tiruchirappalli since February 1st, 1989. He began his career at the college as a computer programmer on December 5th, 1986, after completing his post-graduate studies.

He grew up in a village named Karumpilavilai, near Marthandam in Kanyakumari District. His father, Mr. A. Sathianesan, was a Linguistic Freedom Fighter of Tamil who received a freedom fighter medal from the then Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, Dr. M. Karunanithi, in 1972. His mother, Mrs. Maria Selvi, was a craftswoman. He completed his schooling at Govt. High School, Munchirai, studied Pre-University Course, B.Sc. Physics, M.Sc. Physics at Christian College, Marthandam, and PGDCSA at Bishop Heber College, Tiruchirappalli.

He completed his Ph.D. in Computer Science at Bharathidasan University, Tiruchirappalli, in 2002, after joining the faculty of Computer Science. He did his entire research at Pondicherry Central University in collaboration with the Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore, and the Indian Institute of Technology, Madras. Since then, he has focused on research in computer science, motivating not only the faculty of the Department of Computer Science but also faculties in other colleges and universities.

He has published 228 technical papers in the areas of security in communication networks, IoT and cloud security, and security in smart services. His research papers were internationally indexed in the DBLP Library, IEEE, ACM, and Springer Science Digital Libraries. He has guided 15 PhD scholars in computer science, completed four research projects funded by UGC, and received four research awards for the best research paper publications. He has organised and conducted four international conferences and four national conferences at the college. Two national and two international conferences were conducted in the department, of which two international conferences (World Conference in Computing Science and

Communication Technology, WCCCT-2014 and WCCCT-16) were conducted in association with the IEEE Computer Society, USA. He has served as the organising chair of several international and national conferences of several colleges in Tamil Nadu and as a member of the editorial board of journals and international and national technical conference proceedings. He is a trailblazer in computer science research within universities and colleges in Tamil Nadu, with a focus on international research.

Having completed 33 and a half years of academic experience, he has motivated and promoted several students who are slow learners and also helped students coming from low economic backgrounds. He has served as a doctoral committee member and examiner for doctoral research programmes, chairman and member of the Board of Studies of universities and colleges, member of the governing council and academic council in colleges, and academic consultant in NAAC and IQAC for autonomous colleges. He has been a resourceful person and has delivered technical and invited talks at several international and national conferences and seminars.

He served as an assistant director of New Hostel from 1990 to 1994 with Rev. Dr. S. Ignacimuthu SJ and has expertise in organising various programmes and functions in the college. He was appointed as Vice Principal (Infrastructure) during the period 2001–2004. During this period, he completed numerous tasks, such as expanding the campus, refurbishing the infrastructure, building a new college gate, designing a new road layout for the Jubilee Building, and organising the Golden Jubilee Celebrations of the Jesuit Madurai Province and the 160th-year celebrations of the college. He also led the team that prepared and submitted the College with Potential for Excellence award and oversaw the installation of the statue of St. Joseph in the college, all in collaboration with the Jesuit administration.

In 2004, when there was a need to move technology transfer, the college management appointed him as the coordinator for the Fr. Jerome Cyber Centre. He headed a team of three faculty, programmers, and 15 students from computer science in designing and developing the new website for the college with complete automation. This hard and herculean task, the first of its kind in India among the colleges and universities, resulted in the college taking the lead in digital technology. Jerome Cyber Centre was renamed Fr. Jerome Centre for Information and Communication Technology (JCICT) and oversaw the

design and development of campus networking, ERP software, college automation, online library catalogues, software packages, mobile web portals, the establishment of a digital library, and video conferencing facilities in 2006. He initiated the technology transfer process of reaching ICT to the rural masses through SHEPHERD and conducted several computer and internet usage training programmes for the rural school teachers and village panchayat officials organised by the government departments. In 2008, he served as a technical consultant to the BSNL for setting up Internet kiosks in Shepherd Village Schools and establishing optical fibre connectivity to the college through the BSNL, taking the college into a digital era between 2005 and 2010.

Dr. S. Albert Rabara served as the Chief Purchase Officer for a period of three years, from 2012 to 2015. For his commitment and dedication, the management appointed him as Vice Principal (Academic) for a second term of three years in 2016 and assigned him the task of Public Relations Officer of the college. He took a lead role in organising 175th-year celebrations. His involvement in getting the highest rank in NAAC Cycle IV accreditation was highly appreciated by the management.

In June 2018, the Executive Committee of the Alumni Association selected him as Secretary of the Association. Since then, he has initiated and streamlined the process of strengthening and networking the SJC Alumni/Ae spread across the globe. He took a lead role in organising and conducting the Jesuit Alumni Association of India (JAAI) congress in January 2020. He has meticulously planned and organised the first virtual global reunion in 2021, SJC Alumni Association chapters in the Middle East, Bangalore, Chennai, and Europe, and the second global reunion in February 2023, which resulted in more alumni visiting the college whenever they got the opportunity. The SJC Alumni/Ae Association has gained a new wave and vibrations during his secretaryship.

Dr. Albert Rabara obtained numerous national and international accomplishments during his career. The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) selected him as one of the National Executive Council Members for its Indian Society of System Science and Engineering (ISSE). He served in this honourable position for two terms, from 2017–2020 and 2020–2023. He has been a life member of the Computer Society of India since 1995.

In addition to his academic and administrative roles, he has been actively involved in various activities at Our Lady of Lourdes Church. He serves as the president of the Catholic Association of Our Lady of Lourdes Church and an Executive Council Member of the Catholic Association of Tiruchirappalli Diocese, which is affiliated with the All-Indian Catholic Union. One of his most notable contributions is the creation of "Kalvari Nayakan," a multi-stage Sound and Light programme depicting the life history of Jesus, which is held on the college premises during the Lent season. This unique programme has gained immense popularity not only in Trichy but also throughout Tamil Nadu. He has been recognised with several awards for his outstanding service, including the Pope Francis Award and the St. Devasahayam Award. He is a deeply religious person who is dedicated to church activities.

Despite coming from a village and studying at a government school in Tamil, he has achieved a notable position at St. Joseph's College. After years of service, he will retire from his position on April 30th, 2023, bidding adieu to this historic temple of higher learning.

Dr. A. Paulraj (Associate Professor of Chemistry)

Dr. A. Paulraj, Associate Professor of Chemistry at St. Joseph's College, was born on April 9, 1963, in Thinaikulam village, Ramanathapuram district. His father, Mr. M. Arockiam, was an elementary school teacher, and his mother, Mrs. M. Anthoniammal, was a homemaker. Dr. A. Paulraj did his early studies at R. C. Elementary School, Thinaikulam, and later his HSC at A. V. Higher Secondary School, Paramakudi. He completed his bachelor's degree in chemistry at Dr. Zahir Hussain College, Ilayankudi, Sivagangai district, and pursued his master's degree in chemistry at St. Joseph's College, Trichy. Further, he obtained his M.Phil. degree from VHNSN College, Virudhunagar, affiliated with Madurai Kamaraj University.

He then started his career as a lecturer at St. Joseph's College on July 8, 1986, during the tenure of Rev. Dr. M. Sebastian (Principal and Secretary) and Rev. Dr. Paul C. Jesuraja (Rector). He is a renowned inorganic chemist with a specialisation in coordination chemistry, the periodic table, chemical bonding, and nuclear chemistry. Dr. M. Dorairajan (Librarian)

Dr. M. Dorairajan was born to Mr. R. Manickam Pillai, Railway Head Clerk, and Mrs. M.

Akilambal, housewife, on May 29, 1963. He has three elder brothers, two elder sisters, and one younger brother. He married Ms. D. Revathi in 1994 and has a daughter named Kayathri, who got married this year. Dr. Dorairajan did his schooling at M.N.U. Jayaraj Nadar Higher Secondary School, Nagamalai, Madurai, in the year 1979. The Department of Biochemistry has crossed three decades in leaps and bounds radiating its knowledge to the whole world with the vast experience in teaching-learning of the faculty in Biochemistry.

DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

A one-day customized regional workshop on Histopathology – 2023 was organized on 13th March 2023 as part of the collaborative activity under the Xavier Board of Collaboration. Ms. N. Navashree (20PBI816) secured the University First Rank (Gold Medal) and joined as a Junior Research Fellow at the Department of ECE, SERB Funded Lab, CMR Institute of Technology, Bengaluru. The Consultancy Service Cell of our Department has earned a sum of Rs 3600 through the histopathological sampling from other institutions, carried out by our staff members. The amount has been deposited in the management account.

Engagements and Collaborations

As part of the MoU, 15 students underwent PG-DMLT and passed the course and Two Faculty of our department passed the same PG-DMLT course with All India Second and Third Rank respectively. Two students of the II M.Sc., Ms. N. Navashree and Maria Jency, under the guidance of Mr. A. Benno Susai Vijayakumar, received a TNSCST grant (Rs 7500) for supporting their scientific quench. Collaboration with St. Xavier Board witnesses a knowledge-sharing activity with Sacred Heart College, Tirupattur. A mass of 27 students from that institution actively participated in the one-day regional workshop organized by our department on 13th March 2023 and benefited.

Mentoring and Holistic Development

The creamy layer students of our Biochemistry Department were encouraged to present research papers at national and international conferences. As a result of this motivation, our students present four research papers at the conferences. Our students of II PG Biochemistry were taken to the National Institute of Oceanography at Goa for an industrial visit. The students were exposed to various research projects, some of which involved large-scale isolation of bioactive compounds from sea

algae and sea animals. A seminar session also helped the students to gain knowledge and research activities at NIO. Students clarified their doubts and they enjoyed the industry engagement. As part of the practical/technical learning experience, the students were exposed to the demonstration of the principle and operation of the ELISA reader by the engineer from BIORAD Private Limited.

Faculty Contributions

The rich academic experience and expertise of our faculty for more than two decades have precipitated the publication of books and research papers in reputed journals. Mr. A. All India Gems:

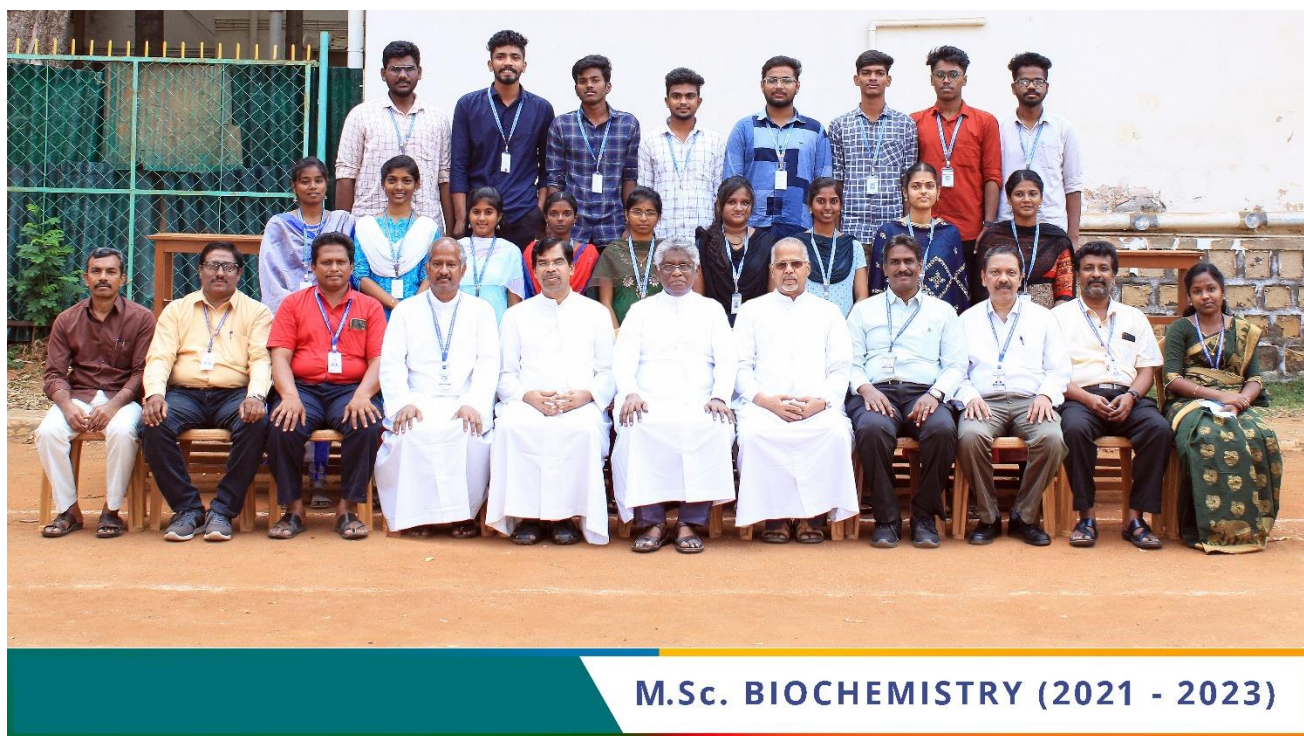

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AND CONTRIBUTIONS

In the academic year 2022-23, our Department of Biotechnology stood crucial in enhancing the academic experiences for the students. This was achieved through a variety of enriching activities, notable achievements and accomplishments.

Departmental Achievements

To create awareness about the heart attack risk factors among the student community, an Endowment Lecture titled "Dr. V. Balakrishnan Memorial CME Programme" was organized in which the students emphasized lifestyle modifications for the prevention of heart attack at a young age.

Collaborations and Linkages

The Department of Biotechnology has established research linkage with the Water and Solid Waste Processing Laboratory in the Department of Environmental Biotechnology, School of Environmental Sciences, Bharathidasan University to provide intellectual inputs to its faculties and students.

Guidance and Comprehensive Growth

Promoting student growth involves a multifaceted approach, incorporating various initiatives that foster mentoring and holistic development. The department organized "Bio-De-Fiesta," an Intercollegiate Technical Fest that attracted around 650 UG and PG students from 35 colleges who showcased their talents, fostering skill development and collaboration.

Faculty Contributions

The Department has a qualified faculty with extensive doctoral research experiences, dedicated to advancing research in various realms of Biotechnology. The faculty has published research articles in esteemed journals, book chapters and DNA sequences in NCBI (USA).

Initiatives Focused on Student Wellbeing

The department's recent graduates have achieved noteworthy placements, with 11 students securing positions across various companies and institutions. Mr. Nithiskanna is currently pursuing a PhD at Universiti Malaysia Terengganu, demonstrating the department's commitment to advancing higher education. Ms. Prakashini K achieved the 54th rank in the Bharathidasan University PhD Entrance Examination. In the cultural and sports arena, students showcased their talents, earning accolades and prizes in competitions, contributing to the department's recognition in cultural events and bringing laurels to the institution. Their active

participation in sports meets further added to the institution's achievements.

DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

Dr. S. R. Senthilkumar

Head, Department of Botany

The study of Natural Science was introduced in this college by the starting of the second group in the Intermediate course in 1912. Rev. Fr. Gombert, S.J. was in charge of handling the Botany and Zoology sections of the Intermediate class in the Initial stages. The Botany course was introduced in 1930 as a subsidiary subject to the B.Sc., pass course, but in the following year it was offered as a separate major course viz B.A. in Botany and this continued till 1952, when it was replaced by the present B.Sc. course in Botany. Rev. Fr. Rapinat was the pioneer in building up this department. He took charge of the department as its head in 1916 and continued in the same post till 1948. He made extensive collections of plants and preserved them in the herbarium. Many apparatuses fabricated by him are even today being used by the students.

When Rev. Fr. Rapinat was transferred to Loyola College, Madras in 1948, the headship of the department was entrusted to Rev. Fr. Balam, S.J. The department witnessed a rapid and multi – faceted development under his leadership. The B.Sc. degree course was started in 1952, replacing the B.A. course in Botany. He equipped the laboratories and library in view of starting post-graduate courses. The M.Sc. course in Botany was started in 1958, and this was the first college to offer the above course outside Madras city (under Madras University). When the M.Sc. course was started, Fr. Balam got an independent Botany block constructed and the department shifted to the new building in 1958. This new building with all its equipment and facilities was his making and stands as a fitting monument bequeathed by him to St. Joseph's in memory of his tenure as a professor for over a quarter century. Rev. Fr. Balam retired from teaching in 1963, handling over the headship of the department to Dr. V.K. George but he continued his services in the department till 1966, helping the teachers and students.

The Department of Botany was primarily engaged in preparing students for the B.Sc. and M.Sc. courses till 1973. Later, taking into account the importance of research in the academic curriculum, the research section was opened. Rev. Fr. J.L. Gnanarethnam, S.J. joined the department after completing his PhD degree at the University of Paris

in 1971. He and Dr. V.K. George took a special interest in developing the research wing of the department as a centre for M.Phil and PhD studies. From that year onwards the growth of the research wing has been phenomenal. From 1974 to date, 90 research scholars have completed their PhD programme and above 115 scholars have taken the M.Phil course. At present research activities are conducted in areas such as physiology, biochemistry, taxonomy, *in vitro* Conservation, phytochemistry of medicinal plants, and mycology.

The Rapinat Herbarium, a center for Plant Taxonomic research has its origin from this department. A large number of herbarium specimens, books, reprints and journals have been gifted to the herbarium and this formed the nucleus around which it expanded to the present status of international repute. Reading the signs of the times and the demand generated for job-oriented modern programs the department of Botany took the initiative to offer an M.Sc., Biochemistry as an interdisciplinary course in 1992. In 2001, an M.Sc., Biotechnology course was started. Projects funded by UGC, DST, CSIR, DBT, MoEF and NMPB have been sanctioned. The department is provided with a mushroom culture centre in which students of UG are trained in mushroom cultivation and also in its marketing strategies. The department has five research centres such as tissue culture, microscopic, cryptogamic botany, mushroom cultivation and microbial culture collections. The department obtained a Grant from the DST- FIST Programme in the year 2010 and DBT recognized the STAR department subsequently. The department has signed MoU with renowned organizations such as KS Varier's Ashtanga Ayurvedic (P) Ltd., Tiruchirappalli, National Research Centre for Banana, Tiruchirappalli, Indian Institute of Crops Processing Technology, Thanjavur. The department established a Solid waste recycling plant in the Academic year 2017-18 where the solid waste of the campus is processed and converted into vermicompost which is supplied to farmers at a concessional rate.

DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

Association Enrichment:

On 18th August 2022, the first Association meeting of the Botany Department was conducted at

Fr. Balam Hall on the topic “Medicinal Benefits of Plants” with Dr. S. Kala, Associate Professor, Department of Botany, S.R. She gave an entire outline of common diseases and difficulties that people face and cure with very simple traditional medicines.

On 17th October, an association meeting was conducted by the department of Botany on “Women Empowerment and Leadership” with Dr. Juggo Kalyani Bedeantee, Former Member of Parliament, Republic of Mauritius as our special guest of honour. She was so motivational and brought lots of thoughts on women for the vision of the future.

On 1st March 2023, an association meeting was conducted by the department of Botany on “Yoga: Introduction and Demonstration” with Mr. M. Suresh, Yoga Teacher, Amrita Vidyalayam as the chief guest. Various practices of yoga was demonstrated namely sukhāsana, vakrasana, thandasana, naukasana, kakasana, gomukhasana and bhujakasana.

On 14th March 2023, an association meeting was conducted by the department of Botany on “Gender sensitization” with Dr. M. Mahendran, Placement officer, St. Joseph’s College, as the chief guest.

A one-day workshop on “Immunological Techniques” was organized on 31st January, 2023. Mr. S. Savarimuthu, Director of Annai Theresa Biomedical Training and research centre was the resource person. III B.Sc. and II M.Sc. Botany students attended the workshop and benefitted.

A workshop on “Molecular Docking” was organized by the department on 10th March 2023 and II M.Sc Botany students attended the workshop.

Endowment Lectures and Quiz:

On 10th October 2022, the 53rd Fr. Balam Memorial lecture was conducted by the department of Botany on the topic “Biodiversity conservation in the Anthropocene Epoch” with Dr.S.Kaliyamoorthy, Scientist D, National Orchidarium and Experimental Garden, Botanical Survey of India, Southern Region, Yercaud as the special guest of honour. On 13th March 2023, Mrs. Thanapackiam Robert Jeyachandran Endowment Lecture was conducted by the department of Botany. Dr. Bakiyarani, Principal Scientist, National Research Centre for Banana, Trichy, was the

chief guest. She highlighted the biotechnological interventions for the improvement of bananas.

Dr. I. Arockiasamy Intercollegiate quiz competition was conducted at the Community Centre on 20th March 2023. Dr. D. Established in 1983, the Department of Computer Science offered with B.Sc. Computer Science and the MCA programme in 1984. Expanding further, M.Sc. Computer Science in 1988 and B.Sc. programmes were added in Shift II in 1999, followed by M.Phil. and PhD programmes in 2002. Notably, our institution pioneered the inclusion of the MCA programme in Arts and Science Colleges nationwide.

With a faculty comprising experts in academia, research, and technology, including 8 members in college administration, we maintain a commitment to excellence. Collaborations with esteemed institutes and IT industries enrich our academic environment. Our alumni's prominent positions in the global IT sector reflect our dedication to fostering innovation. A total of 22 research articles were showcased at the conference, with four articles published in prestigious Scopus-indexed journals. Additionally, our faculty members have authored six books and contributed to a book chapter. Furthermore, the department has secured one patent, with another patent currently under application, highlighting our commitment to innovation and intellectual property.

One of our esteemed faculty members has been awarded seed funding of Rs. 105,000 for a minor research project focused on the Design and Development of a Secured IoT-based Smart Health Management System (SIoT-SHMS) under the SJC Research Grant. Dr. George Gabriel Richard Roy has also received Rs. 2000 for his participation in a Faculty Development Programme (FDP), further enhancing our faculty's professional development. This year, our department has made significant contributions to e-learning, with 133 new e-content materials developed for the JosTEL portal, enriching our digital repository of 522 items. While the pass percentage for III UG and II UG (Shift II) experienced a slight decline in the even semester, II UG (Shift I) showcased strong results, with PG students maintaining commendable pass rates throughout both semesters. In collaboration with

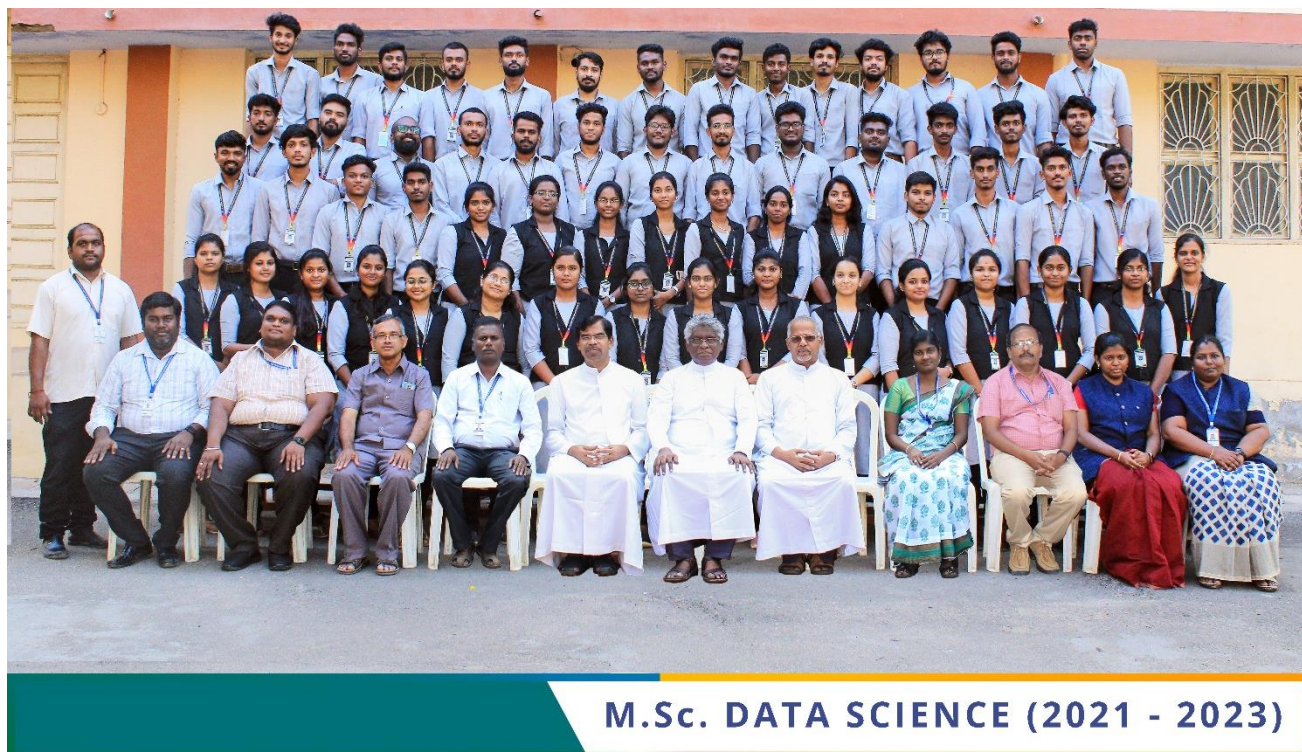

Endowments:

A remarkable number of alumni of the Department instituted various endowments in the name of their teachers/parents/family members and on their behalf to enhance the academic quality of the students. The Department of Mathematics conducts Seminars/Conferences/Workshops every year through various Endowments and organizes valuable lectures for the students to develop deeper knowledge of Mathematics.

The inauguration of the Mathematics Association (Shift I) under Shri M. Janakiraman Endowment was held on 17th Aug 2022 at the Sail Auditorium. The Inaugural Address was delivered by Rev. Fr. Secretary Dr. K. Amal, SJ. A special lecture was delivered by Dr. S. Francis Raj, Associate Professor of Mathematics, Pondicherry University, Pondicherry on the topic of Combinatorics in Pure Mathematics.

The Inauguration of the Mathematics Association of Shift II was held on 10th October 2022 at Sail Auditorium. The Inaugural Address was delivered by Rev. Fr. Secretary Dr. K. Amal, SJ. Dr. M. Mahendran, Placement Officer, St. Joseph's College delivered a lecture on Career Opportunities.

journals authored by the faculty members of our department. One research scholar was conferred with PhD degree during this academic year.

A two-day National workshop on Research Methods and Data Analysis using SPSS was organized on December 15 & 16, 2022. Our department arranged a field visit for third-year students along with two faculty members to Anbil Dharmalingam Agricultural College and Research Institute, Tiruchirappalli on January 30, 2023. On March 8, 2023, Dr. C. Muthu Endowment Lecture was organized by the department. The Parent-Teacher meeting was conducted on 18 March 2023. As per the MoU with Thanthai Hans Roever College - the Mathematics and Statistics knowledge exchange programme was conducted on March 27, 2023. All the Association activities came to an end with Valedictory Function which was held on March 31, 2023.

Faculty Enrichment

Our faculty members have published three research articles in peer-reviewed journals. Three of our faculty members completed their refresher courses at UGC-HRDC, Bharathiar University, Coimbatore, UGC-HRDC University of Calicut, and UGC-HRDC Sardar Patel University, Vallabh Vidyanagar

respectively. All the faculty members acted as Resource persons for the Value-Added Course, Research through Statistical Packages, held from February 1, 2023, to February 28, 2023. Three faculty members acted as Resource persons for the Certificate course on Applications of Statistics on October 29, 2022. The academic year 2022-2023 was yet another year of accomplishments and enrichment. The one-day national-level seminar entitled “Financial Inclusion and Cyber Securities in Digital Banking” received a high range of accolades and laurels owing to its intense exposure to quality and knowledge. It witnessed the academically enriching visits of several eminent scholars the likes of Dr. M. Selvam, Honourable Vice-Chancellor of Bharathidasan University and Mr. Ratna Kumar Matur, IRS, Joint Commissioner, GST. The disseminations initiated during the Seminar were considered as truly contemporary and immersive in tune with the realities of the business world.

The two-day workshop on Employability Skills for the final year students was a major highlight of the year. Resource persons were sourced through the internal and external expertise available. The workshop was highly beneficial for the students to sharpen their competency essential for success in the job market. The important event of the Commerce Department namely, the “Endowment Lecture in Honour of the Retired Professors of Commerce” saw Mr. T.R. Srinivasan, Group CFO, TVS Group, Chennai, Resource Person, delivering an exceptional talk on “Value System that Finance Professionals Need to Embrace”. Mr. T. R Srinivasan also generously donated Rs. 1300000 towards an endowment fund to help the three deserving poor students from different years to pursue their education without hindrance and also to honour a most meritorious student of Commerce or Honours Department to get a gold medal and prize money.

As part of the diamond jubilee year of Commerce Shift I and the golden jubilee year of Shift II, the department launched a mega one-day inter-collegiate event namely ‘Biz-Com 2023’ subsuming the erstwhile com-carnival and Bizmen forum. All twelve events relevant to Commerce and Management domains were conducted and thirty teams across Tamil Nadu participated thus making the event a grand success. One more endowment fund worth Rs.50,000 was established with the surplus of funds mobilized through the sponsors for the conduct of this event.

Engagement and Collaborations:

The Department of Commerce signed a functional MoU during the academic year with Don Bosco Alaihal Media, Tiruchirappalli to offer a certificate course on Media Studies entitled “Media and Business Development” collaboratively. The course covered photography, video editing, poster making, and digital ad creation in social media. Students were given hands-on training at Alaihal Media, Tiruchirappalli. Fifty students from the Commerce Department have benefited through this certificate course during this year. The MoU with Tally India Private Limited, Bangalore working well as 140 students enthusiastically enrolled in three different batches. This course is open to outsiders as well.

Mentoring and Holistic Development:

As part of the academic requirement, the students of II B.Com and I M.Com underwent an Internship Programme in the organization of their choice for 15 days. The department got paid internships for three M.Com students with a stipend of Rs. 16000 per month for two months.

Faculty Contributions:

The expertise and benefits contributed by the faculty members of Commerce are highly commendable as staff took part in several high-end academic and research activities. Ten Staff of the department were External Members of the Board of Studies, One was an external examiner of the PhD Viva-Voce Examination, Three were External Members of Academic Councils, One acted as Subject Expert in Staff Selection Committee, and two were Reviewers of the Reputed Journals. Besides faculty members acted as resource persons in seventy-four events disseminating lectures and invited talks at seminars, conferences, FDPs and workshops.

Student-Centric Initiatives:

The Department of Commerce has conducted various student-centric initiatives. Emotional Adjustment Problems and Solutions, Maintaining Overall Hygiene for Girl Students and Gender Sensitization were conducted. Remedial Classes are being conducted regularly to help the slow learners to perform better in academics, especially in the Accountancy courses.

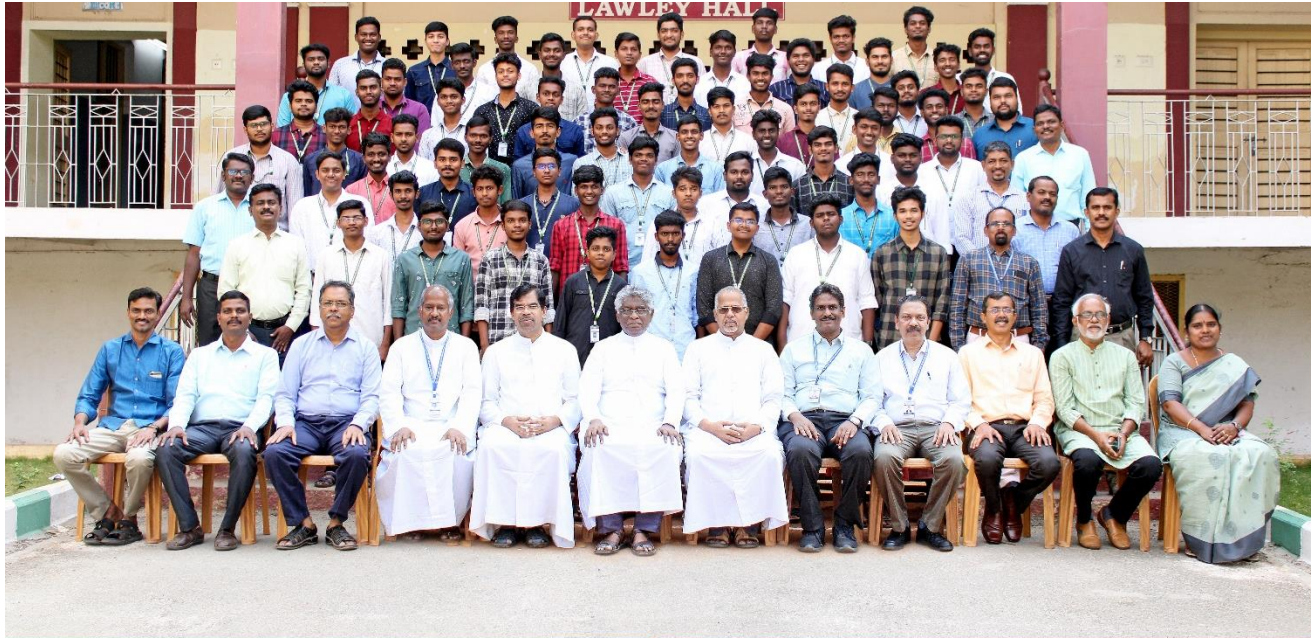

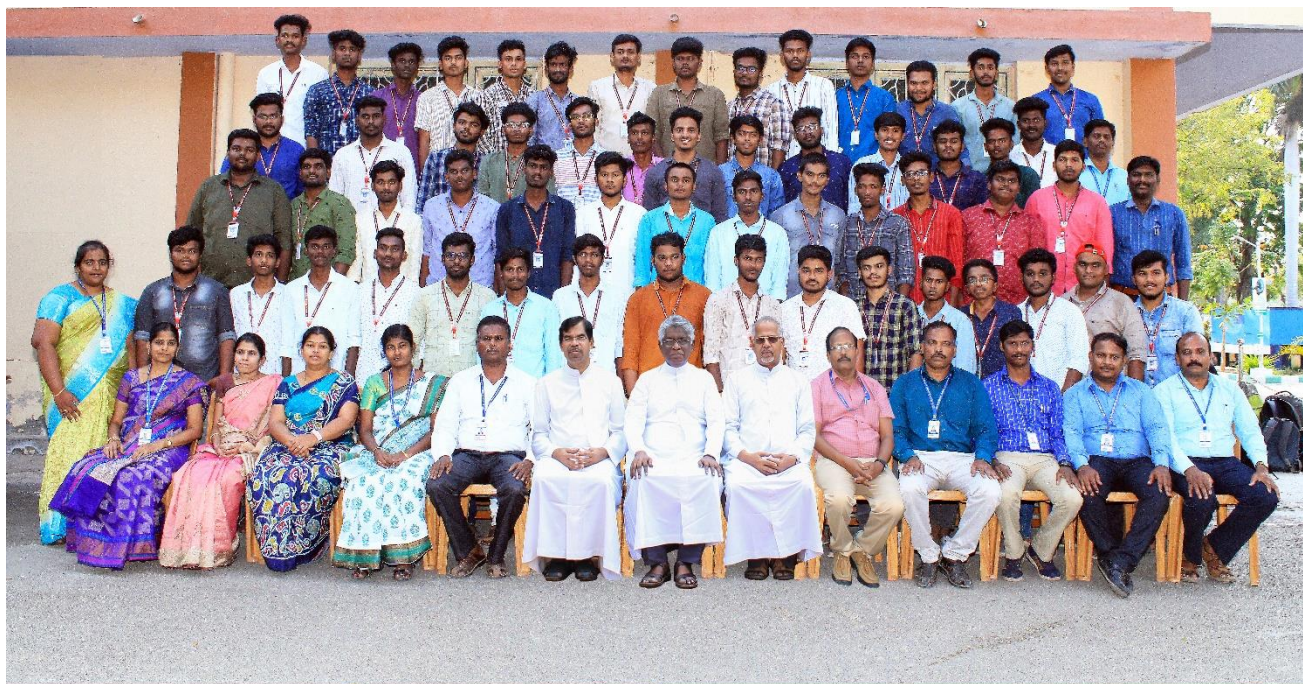
B.Com Section A (2020 - 2023)



B.Com Section B (2020 - 2023)



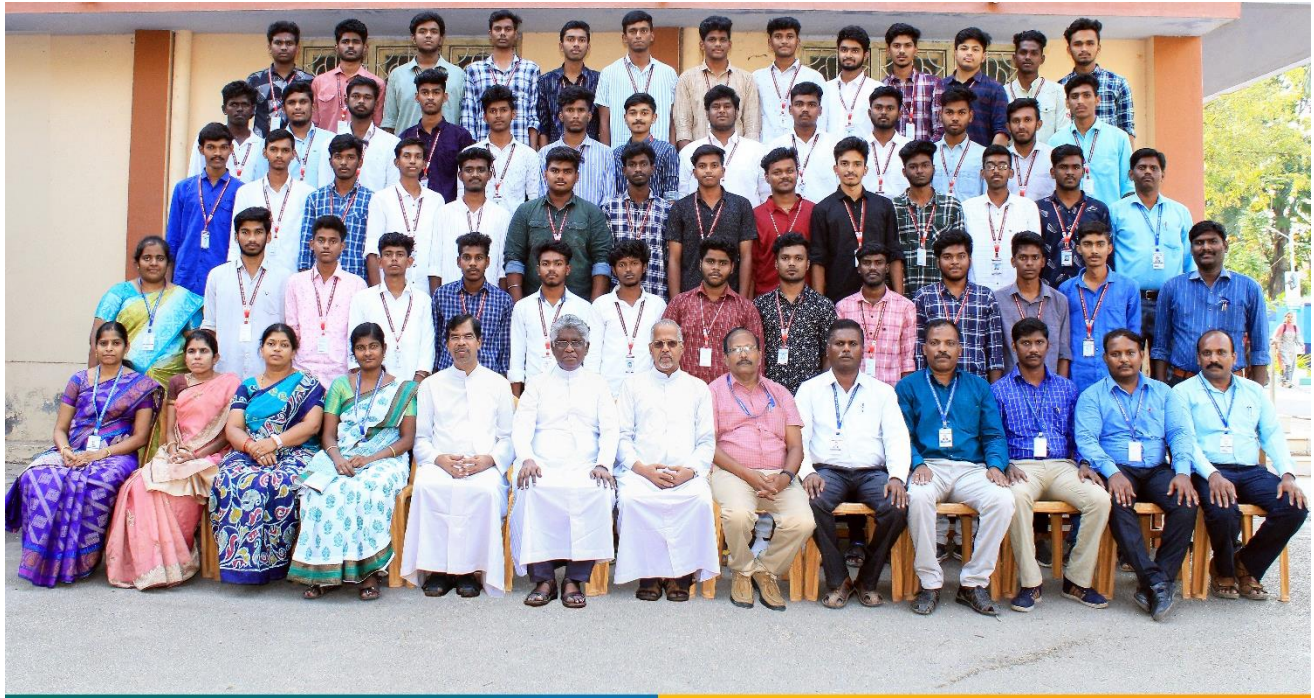

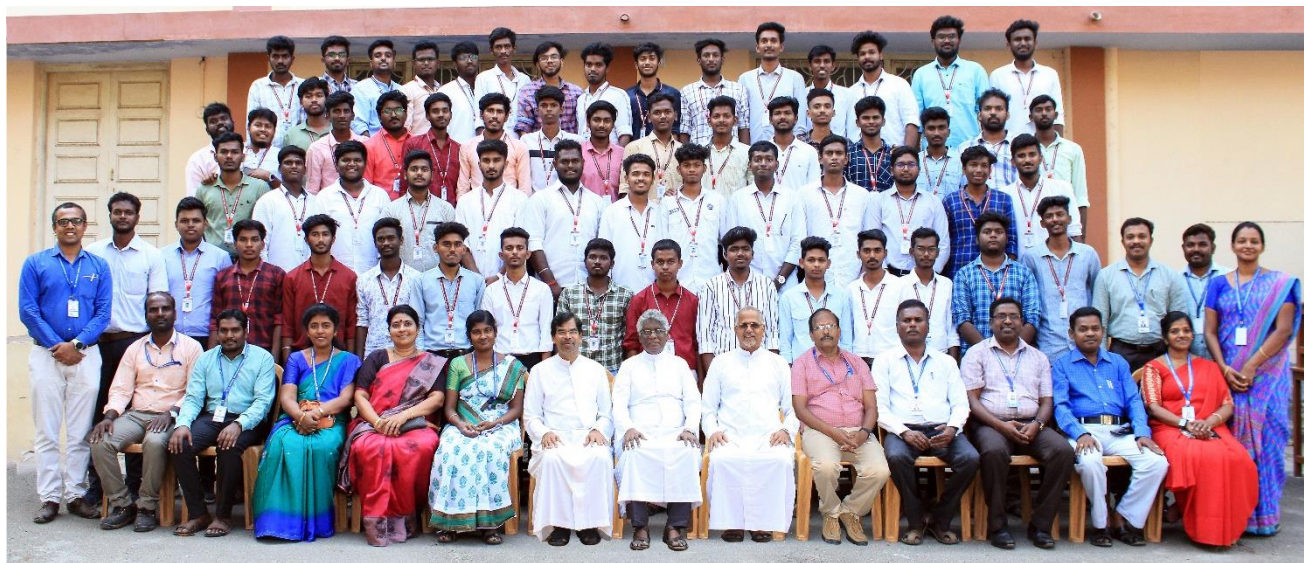

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE HONOURS

The department of Commerce Honours, full of vigour and dynamism, has embarked on a journey of developing globally acclaimed professionals by offering a comprehensive syllabus embedded with the ACCA curriculum. The emphasis of the programme is on accounting, analytics and taxation. With a demand ratio of 26:1, this merit-based honours programme has gained immense popularity and best choice among aspiring students across Tamil Nadu and neighbouring states. The department has successfully organised an online FDP on “Use of AI in Teaching and Learning” in partnership with the Institute of Analytics (IoA), UK and International Skill Development Corporation (ISDC) on 25.03.2023. The participation was made available to the faculty of Commerce and BBA as well. A one-day workshop was organised on “Goods and Services Tax” on 17.03.2023 to provide hands-on training to students on GST filing. To acquaint the students with academic writing, a lecture on Research Methodology was organised on 20.03.2023. The department conducted a session on Budget 2023 with students debating the pros and cons of the Union Budget 2023 comprehensively.

The department has a unique blend of internal, external and ISDC faculty sharing their domain expertise with the students. In all, there are 15 faculty including 11 external and one ISDC faculty. The department follows a flipped class learning technique in which students are given prior information about the subject matter to be discussed to ensure their active participation in classroom discussions.

ENGAGEMENT AND COLLABORATIONS

Inherently the honours programme is a collaborative initiative of St. Joseph’s College, ISDC, UK and ACCA, UK. The ISDC as a training partner helps in organising faculty development programmes and students’ preparation towards ACCA examinations. The ISDC empanelled faculties conducted 150 hours of online and offline classes and exam preparation classes in financial reporting, financial management and audit and assurance courses. The ISDC also conducted placement training for final-year students from 23-08-2022 to 25-08-2022 on the college campus.

As an assessment partner, ACCA enables the aspirants to have access to the ACCA portal for their examination practice. As part of the agreement, ACCA’s education hub is made available for ‘Train the Trainer’ and ‘Train the Marker’ programmes to the faculty on different dates.

MENTORING AND HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT

In the Honours department, 52 students underwent summer internships at the end of the first year and 38 students did project work at the end of the second year. Five students along with a staff attended an ACCA-sponsored panel discussion on the topic “ACCA Membership – Pathway to your Career Aspirations”. 13 students also participated in an interactive programme with students from Germany as part of a cultural expedition. Eight students also participated in the Global educational partnership programme with students of St. Aloysius College, Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh from 3rd March – 11 March 2023. Further, 38 students completed the Tally certification programme conducted by Tally Education Private Limited. The department has made it compulsory for all students to be part of the Readers Club, Fintech Club or, Business Talk Club to sharpen their perspective thinking ability essential for the ACCA examination. The students of honours have any time access to LMS platforms like ISDC connect and JOSTEL.

FACULTY CONTRIBUTIONS

The faculty members are actively involved in the preparation of e-materials. During the year, 40 video lectures and 74 e-contents were prepared by the faculty. Faculty play a pivotal role in training the students in the preparation of business plans and models before innovation mela. Prof. Camilton cleared ACCA Financial Reporting Tutor Exam, Train the Trainer (ACCA), Excel Fundamentals Formula for Finance (CFI) and Cert IFR (ACCA). Prof. Mary Magdalene completed a MOOC course entitled “How to Write an Effective Research Paper” through UDEMY and also the Train the Trainer through ACCA Education Hub. Apart from this, all the faculty attended workshops on the Implementation of OBE in Commerce Education,

the Orientation Program on Micro Teaching, and FDP on maximising learner engagement.

STUDENT-CENTRIC INITIATIVES

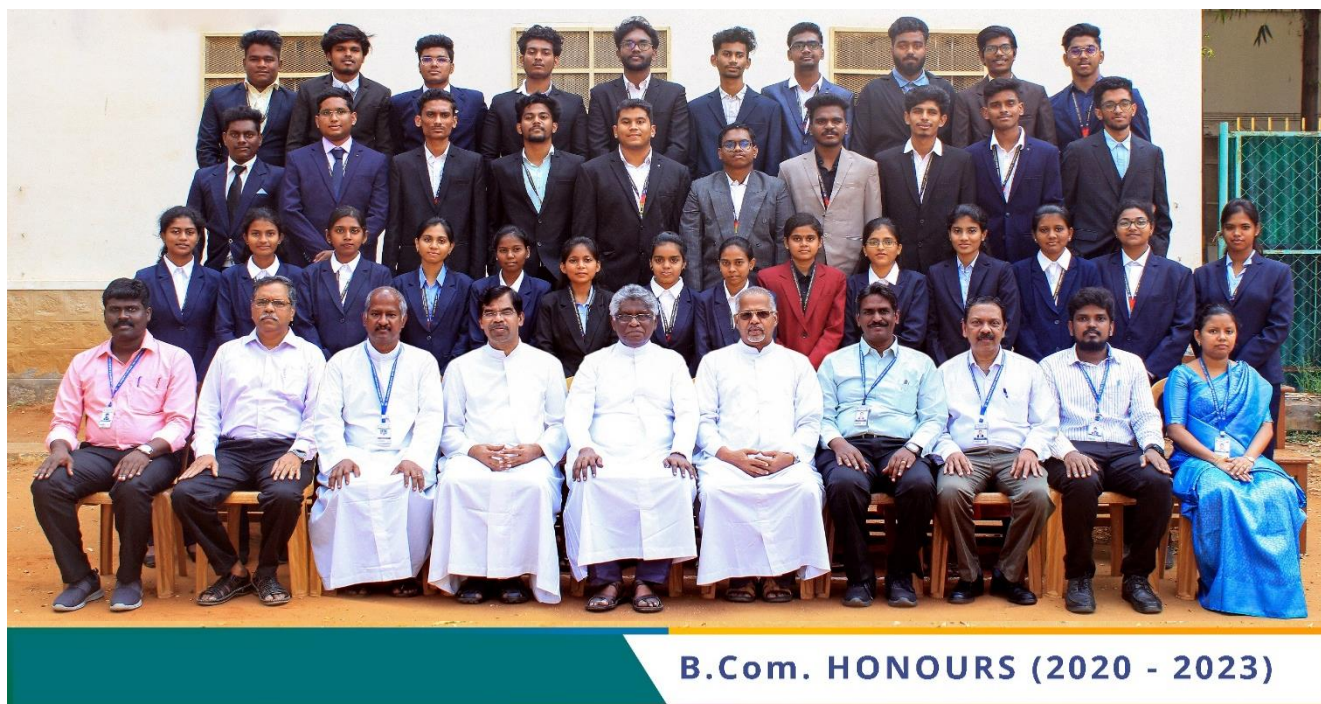
The academic performance reflects the department's commitment to excellence, with a remarkable 97% and 94% pass rate in even and odd semesters of 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 respectively. Nandakumar and Giri Prasanth of III B. Com Honours cleared their ACCA Financial Management paper and Vasanth Karthick Bharath of II B. Com Honours cleared their ACCA Financial Reporting paper. The department ensured that 124 students had done courses through online learning platforms, including Coursera, Future Skills Prime-NASSCOM, UNICEF-AGORA, UPGRAD, HP, TCS ION, Google, and Great Learning Academy. Devesh Shekar R from II B. Com Honours published a book under Yaappu Publications. Arul Jeni from III B. Com Honours earned the Best Performer award from the Income Tax Dept, Trichy. Gana Joshua from III B. Com Honours was awarded the Best Volunteer in Shepherd in the year. Arul Jeni from III B. Com Honours won the 'best pupil of the college' award.

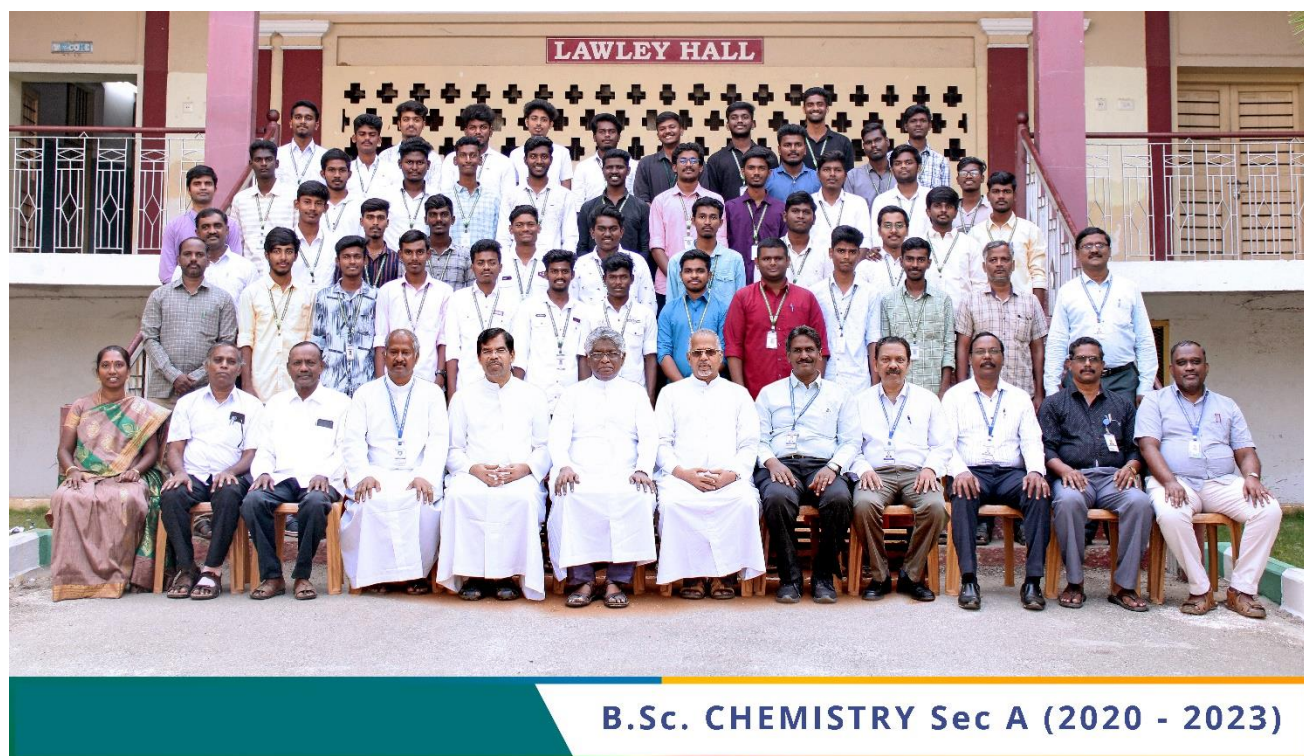
Career milestones:

Our students have excelled in securing off-campus placements in renowned organizations across

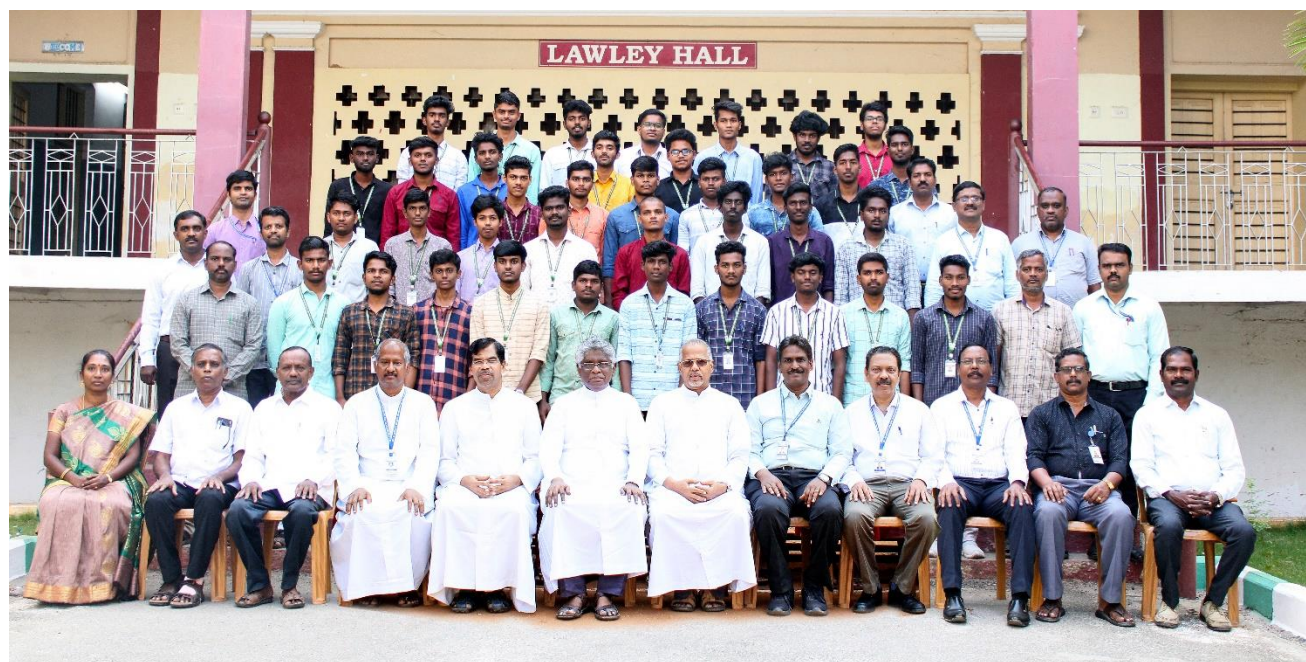

DEPARTMENT OF ELECTRONICS

Dr. B. Kanickairaj

Head, Department of Electronics

The Electronics Association was inaugurated on August 12, 2022 (Friday), with the blessings and felicitations of Rev. Dr. K. Amal SJ, Secretary, St. Joseph's College, Trichy. During his felicitations, he emphasized China's contribution to electronics and encouraged Electronics Department students to have the desire to contribute to the nation through their field of study. Dr. Arul Daniel, Professor, Higher Administrative Grade, Department of Electrical and Electronics Engineering, delivered the inaugural address. In the inaugural address, he expressed that the dynamics of mobility are moving from typical combustion engines to electric motors and drivers associated with it, and there is a lot of room for young people to work in areas like autonomous vehicles and designing drives for vehicles, and only electronics students will be deemed fit for such jobs. He encouraged the students to enhance their basic knowledge of battery charging systems, management systems, motor drivers, and charging station design, which will help them find a suitable career. To summarize, his talk focused on future trends in the electric car job market for electronics students.

Rev. Dr. Soosai Sebastian's endowment address was held on October 21, 2022. Dr. M. Pandiaraj, Scientist, CSIR - CECRI, Karaikudi, delivered an Endowment lecture on "Digital Health: Biosensors for Activity Monitoring and Early Diagnosis". Dr. B. Kanickairaj, Head of the Department of Electronics, welcomed participants and mentioned the chief guest. During the presentation, Dr. M. Pandiaraj emphasized the significance of health monitoring and electronic instruments. He remarked on two of his significant inventions: label-free electrochemical immunosensors for cytochrome C incorporating nanocomposites functionalized screen-printed electrodes and the development of a Cytochrome C biosensor using cytochrome C reductase to evaluate apoptosis. The speaker envisaged several forms of biosensors useful during outbreaks and encouraged young minds to work on biosensors for health monitoring.

The Department of Electronics organised an invited talk on industrial control and automation on January 19, 2023. Mr. J. Amlaraj, a Quality Inspection Services Engineer at Aramco Industries, delivered the

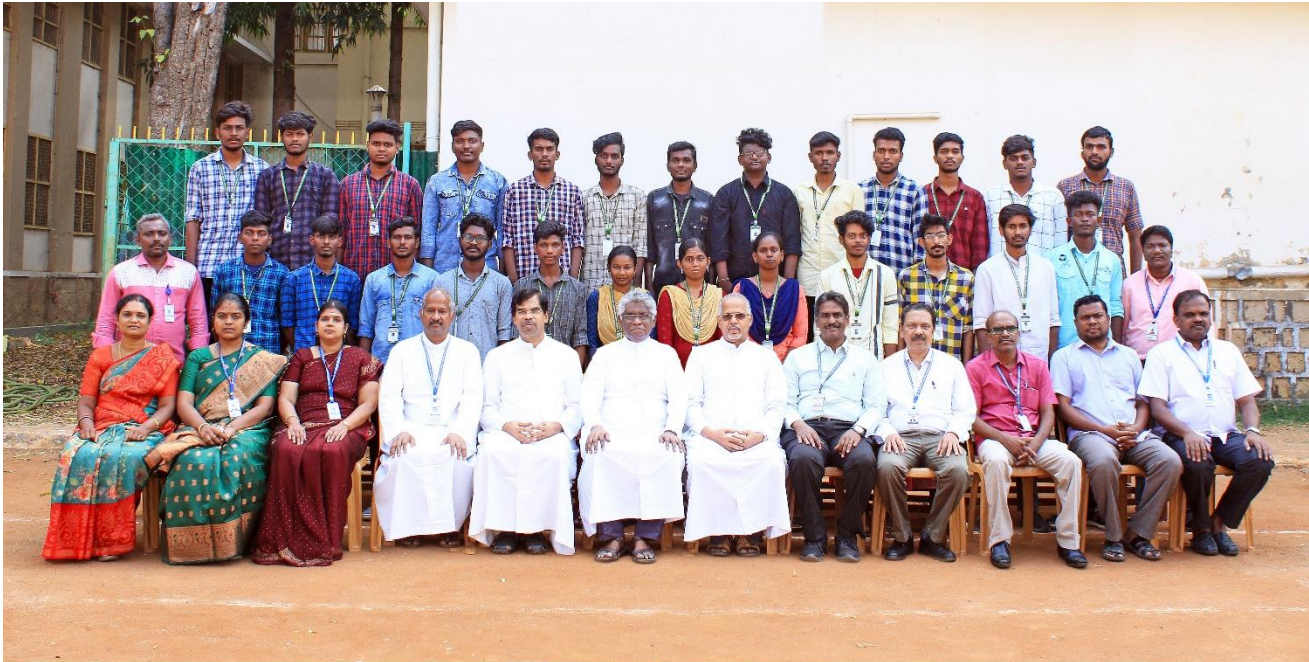
lecture. His talk discussed at great length the need for industrial automation in the petroleum industry. The speaker delivered a clear and lucid description of programmable logic controllers and communication bus protocols which include RS 485 and MODBUS. The discussions accentuated the necessity of smart instrumentation for modern control using microcontrollers. He encouraged students to study related to these challenging subjects to get ready for a job in the petroleum industry.

The intercollegiate technical symposium JOSELEX 2023 was conducted on March 10, 2023, with approximately 160 participants actively participating in project, paper, poster presentation, and quiz. Rev. Fr. Principal inaugurated the exhibit and granted felicitations and blessings to all participants. Visitors enjoyed the lamp's lighting with e-kuthuvilakku as an environmentally friendly option. Students displayed 72 interesting projects which were commended by visitors. Five teams from various colleges participated in paper presentations, poster presentations, and quizzes. The best performers in each competition undergo evaluation by two competent faculty members, and the outcomes of every competition are announced during valediction. Madurai Kamaraj University won the overall shield at JOSELEX 2023. Mr. Rajendran, Deputy Principal, issued prizes and congratulated all of the winners, as well as encouraging all students to take part actively in JOSELEX.

The Department of Electronics organized a special invited lecture titled "Towards a proof of the Riemann Hypothesis". Dr. Sundar M. Sundaramurthi from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology presented the talk. He expounded on the Riemann hypothesis as one of the millennium's most important unsolved problems. Many scientists and their perspectives on the Riemann hypothesis inspired young listeners to pay attention to the solution with inquisitiveness. He discussed his method of solving the Riemann hypothesis through the trigonometric straight-line equation $x\cos\theta + y\sin\theta = k$. Conventional straight-line equations with slope and intercept equation approaches made the problem highly unsolvable and posed a huge challenge. The unconventional approach helped him to justify why

Sigma must be $1/2$. The mysterious unsolved Riemann hypothesis and its novel solution enthused learners towards the applications of the problem. During the

interactive session, most of the questions were focused on the application of it.

DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS

Through a variety of rewarding activities and accomplishments, the Department of Physics at our college set out on a dynamic journey that elevated the academic experiences for both staff and students throughout the academic year 2022–2023. The action plans are to conduct national and international conferences, value-added courses, endowment lectures, alumni meetings, MoUs, workshops, and club activities. All the above-mentioned activities have been accomplished regularly.

DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

These programs served as cornerstones of knowledge, encouraging growth and intellectual interaction while providing insightful information and earning recognition for our department.

The Faculty Empowerment Programme was arranged for 6 days for the staff members who handle practical classes (PG & III UG). This programme was beneficial in acquiring practical and theoretical knowledge.

A webinar series on “Energy storage for sustainable growth”, “Materials for Energy and Environment” a talk on “Psychological well-being”, “Cyber Crimes and ITact 2000” and “Balance your Emotions for Positive living” for Women students, Computational Physics Experiments for PG physics students and Faculties, the importance of Language Skills in Life and Higher Education in Abroad”, a lecture on observational astronomy and archaeoastronomy were organized and talks were delivered by eminent resource persons.

The Feynman Problem Solving Club, Einstein Quiz Club and The Stephen Hawking Innovation Club for the academic year 2022-23 were inaugurated.

An International Conference on crystal growth was organised by the Department of Physics, St. Joseph’s *College, Trichy in collaboration with SSN Institutions, Chennai and Association with the Indian Association for Crystal Growth (IACG) & Indian Spectro-Physics Association (ISPA). The International Conclave on Materials, Energy & Climate (ICMEC) was organised by the International Association of Advanced Materials (IAAM), Sweden

in association with Shoolini University, Indra Gandhi Delhi Technical University for Women, India. International Conference on Current Research and Advancements in Materials Science and Spectroscopy (ICCAMS-2023) was organized by the Department of Physics, St. Joseph’s College, Trichy, Tamilnadu, India in association with the Indian Spectroscopy Association (ISPA).

The Department of Physics, St. Joseph’s College (Autonomous) conducted Dr. G.A. Savariraj, Prof. ST. Rajan endowment and Dr. S. Gunasekaran SJ Endowment on various important topics delivered by eminent resource persons.

A Three-Day Science Academies' Lecture Workshop on Recent Developments in Neutrino. The primary focus was to enhance the understanding of Astrophysics and Particle Physics at undergraduate and graduate levels.

Forging Collaborations and Acquiring Funds:

1. An MOU was established with the Institute of Advanced Materials & IAAM, Sweden for a duration of 5 years.
2. A total of 5 research projects were applied for external funding of which two were been selected and received Research Grants from UGC-DAE CSR, New Delhi, and Ministry of Education, MHRD with a total worth of about Rs. 8,20,000.
3. The St. Joseph’s College management had awarded a total sum of Rs.4,45,000 to faculty and research scholars as seed money and financial support for research purposes.
4. 10 faculty members were guiding 21 research scholars to pursue their research. 7 students were enrolled, 7 of them had completed their viva.

Stakeholder Engagement:

Parents expressed their gratitude to faculty members for their outstanding contributions to their wards' overall growth during the Parent-Teacher Meeting.

Embracing Alumni and Continuous Learning:

The alumni, pillars of our institution, graced various gatherings, showcasing their journeys and offering valuable suggestions for curriculum

enhancements. These reunions fostered nostalgia and a renewed commitment to nurturing future generations. The alumni Reunion Meet for (1978-1981) Batch students was conducted. A total of 40 alumni attended and contributed Rs. 3,25,000/- for instituting an Endowment lecture.

Enriching Beyond Classrooms:

The department has also made efforts to enrich the fast learners by conducting lecture workshops on Neutrino Astrophysics with eminent resource persons. Concern for the slow learners, the department has conducted remedial classes for analogue and digital electronics, Classical Mechanics, and Mathematical Physics-I. The department had stimulated the students to participate in various academic and cultural events and as a result of that the following prizes had been acquired by the students who participated in various events in sports and inter-college cultural competitions. The department had offered 69 courses among them 17 courses were new during the academic year 2022-2023. The department had conducted the Value-added course on solar PV installation and maintenance and a certificate course on Sci-Lab for Computation and Analysis.

FACULTY CONTRIBUTIONS AND ENGAGEMENTS

Various teaching-learning methodologies were adopted such as demonstrations, learning management systems (LMS), e-teaching, software demos, web-based courses, problem-solving, self-study and group discussions. A total of 19 government sanction posts are present in the department and all the posts are filled. Among these 14 staff members have PhD and 3 staff members have PhD with SET. The student's teacher ratio was 16:1 and they have been given mentoring sessions personally. Result analysis was done after completing each semester. It was found that internal marks (CIA) were not on par with the semester marks so necessary steps were taken to conduct remedial classes. 10 faculty members were

guiding 21 research scholars to pursue their research. 7 students had enrolled and 7 completed their viva-voce examination. A total of 58 publications were published - in CARE / SCOPUS / Web of Science – with various Impact factors - h-index-Citation index. One book was published and two book chapters were written in various publications. Constant research was carried over on LED display Fabrication and maintenance by a few faculty members. In view of the extension/outreach programme, the department contributed necessities worth Rs.10, 000 to Holy Cross Old Age Home.

STUDENT ACHIEVEMENTS AND PLACEMENTS.

University Pearls:

Two students (21UPH203 & 21UPH251) from the department have completed a MOOC course this academic year on applied optics and Aerodynamic Design of Axial Flow Compressors and Fan in the NPTEL platform for a 12-week course duration. The students have secured 49 and 43 percentage of marks respectively.

Career Milestones:

About 9 students were placed in reputed corporate and government institutions with the highest annual salary of Rs.5L /annum.

Noteworthy Accolades:

52 students are pursuing higher studies currently, 1 in NITT, 1 in IIT and 3 foreign university research centres. Two undergraduates have cleared the Joint Admission test for Masters (JAM-2023) and one GATE qualified.

Excellence on and off the Field:

280 Students have done field visits, 146 have enhanced their skills by doing Internships and 203 students have carried over Projects. Students also visited the Advanced Centre for Atmospheric Radar Research, CUSAT, Kerala; Radio Astronomy Centre, Ooty and National Institute of Oceanography, Goa.

Outstanding Accomplishments:

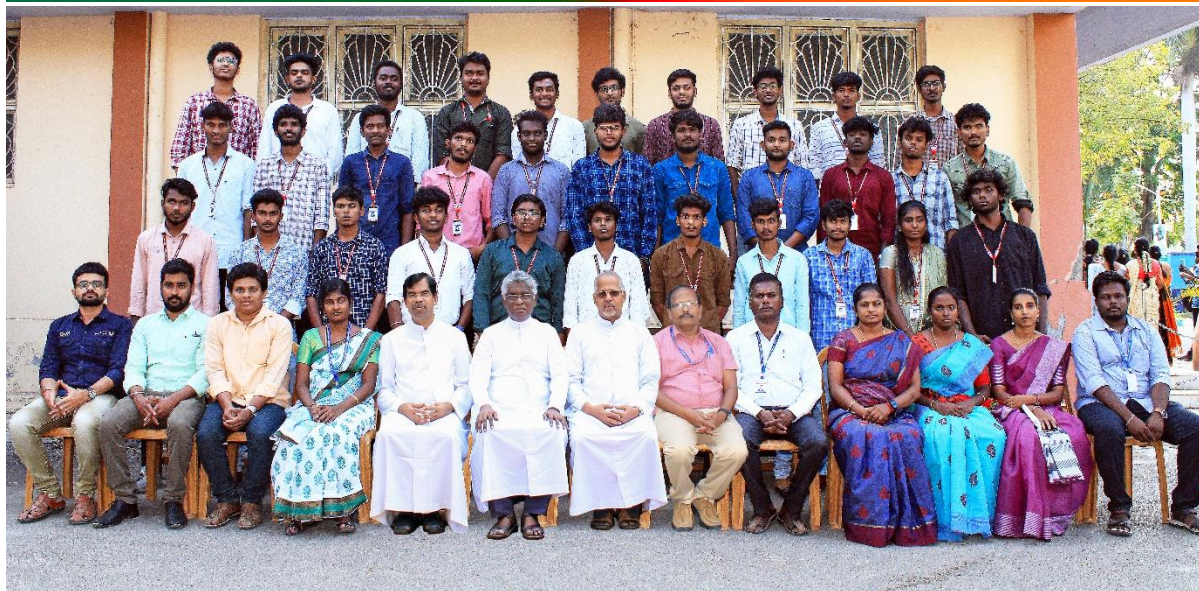

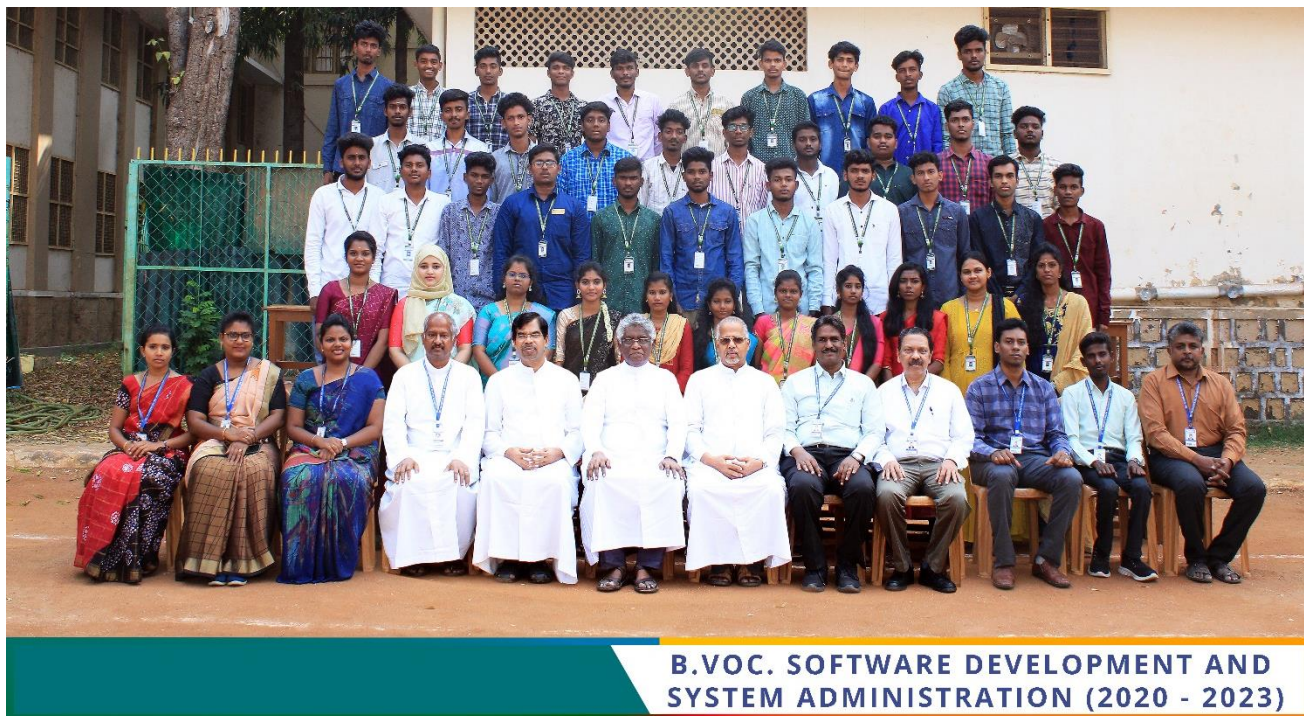

The Extension Department – SHEPHERD (Science and Humanities for People's Development) proudly presents its various extension activities in collaboration with the ever-energetic and generous students and staff of the college. Using standard operating procedures (One-day Initiation Visit, Three-day Live-in Camp, and Weekend Visits), the extension department has carried out outreach initiatives to the local slum and rural populations through the student community. It is fostering a dynamic partnership between the college and the community. The director, coordinators, and faculty in each department have adopted new approaches to carry out the work. Students have worked in 22 slums of Tiruchirappalli City Corporation and 96 villages in the Andanallur, Manikandam, and Thiruverambur blocks of Tiruchirappalli, the Thogamalai block of Karur, and the Viralmalai block of Pudukottai Districts. Community-based organizations, science popularization, education, the environment, health, and sanitation (CBOs), Lab-to-Land, and Land-to-Lab are some of the important areas of outreach activities done by the students.

2. Environment

Tree Plant saplings received from the Department of Forest

Mr. S. Lenin, Senior Coordinator gave the inaugural address. He explained He discussed the nutritional benefits of heritage foods like minor and

major millet and how they will benefit both students and women.

I MSc Bio-chemistry students' Ms Hema Lakshmi and Ms. Priyadharsini welcomed and proposed a vote of thanks respectively. Mr. Sathesh Kumar served as the master of ceremonies. Students conducted wonderful exhibits on heritage foods. Twenty different types of recipes were displayed and explained, as well as awareness chats. To present a PowerPoint presentation on mushroom culture values and cultivation to students at various schools. A college student conducted various competitions based on heritage foods for the school students and awarded prizes to the prize winners. A total of four teachers and 160 students took part.

SHEPHERD service village Profile and Data collection consolidation work

Special Assignment work for II MSc CS A & B Students to collect the complete details of selected SHEPHERD service villages belonging to Manikandam block, Trichy and Thogaimalai block of Karur District, a total of fifty villages. This work was monitored and evaluated by Mr. S. Lenin, Senior Coordinator. The students of II PG, computer science S-II consolidated the data of selected fifty (50) villages' profile details. The profiles included information on the village's elected officials, initiatives, urgent needs, and total resource information.

A. Controlling Mealy Bug on Crops by Vermi-Wash Liquid for Organic Ways of Pest Control and Management

The Extension Department-SHEPHERD, St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) organised an orientation programme on controlling mealy bugs on crops by vermi-wash liquid for organic ways of pest control and management on 29.09.2022 for the selected farmers of UBA adopted villages. The show began with Tamil Thai valthu.

The programme aimed to sensitise the farmers to protect their crops from pests on their cultivable lands because the use of synthetic fertilizer caused hazardous effects on all living things in the world. Therefore, we will move towards sustainable organic agricultural methods under this programme.

Rev. Fr. M. Arockiasamy Xavier, SJ, Principal presided over the function. "You are only our true connection to our college students while they are visiting your villages," he said in his presidential address. Treat them like your own children. "Let's talk with Anbil Dharmalingam Agriculture College and Research Institute professors about how to keep dangerous pests out of your cultivable lands and how to avoid synthetic fertilizers that harm the soil and human health." He also gave the farmers a one-litre bottle of vermi-wash liquid.

Rev. Fr. M. Berchmans, SJ, Director, Extension Department-SHEPHERD gave the inaugural address. He said that the program is one of the Unnat Bharat Abiyan project activities, and the usage of vermi-wash plays a vital role in sustainable agriculture. He asked the farmers to use the vermi-wash product for their enhanced cultivation on land. He also encouraged all the farmers and coordinators.

Dr. V. Ambethgar, Professor and Head, Department of Plant Protection, Anbil Dharmalingam Agriculture College and Research Institute, Navalur Kuttapattu participated as Chief Guest. He asked the people, "The tradition of natural farming and food systems needs to be technologically restored." He also

explained various organic pest control practices, pest-resistant crop varieties, traps in pest management, bagging techniques for fruit protection, and vermicompost production and usage.

Dr. Kalyanasundaram, Associate Professor, Department of Plant Protection (Entomology), Anbil Dharmalingam Agriculture College and Research Institute, Navalur Kuttapattu participated as a guest. He explained the management of water, weeds, fertilizers, and pest control, and he also explained that the difference between protection and management.

Dr. K. Rajan, Associate Professor, Department of Botany, gave the keynote address. He presented the production methods of vermi-wash through a powerpoint presentation and demonstrated the production methods of vermi-wash extraction in the compost yard. He explained the availability of micro- and macronutrients in vermi-wash which act as nutrition for the plants and provide growth hormone and disease resistance.

Mr. S. Lenin, Senior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD streamlined the entire programme. Mr. P. Vijayakumar, Mr. S. Raja, Senior Coordinators, Mr. T. Joseph Christu Raja, Junior Coordinator and Mr. N. Poorna Vishvanathan, Accountant and Office Assistant, helped make the programme successful. The six UBA cell members from undergraduate second-year BA English S-II played an important role in the program. The Programme Coordinator Mr. C. Jeyachandran said that the vermi-wash liquid will be given to all the farmers after extraction.

Mr. S. Jeyaseelan, Junior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD and Mr. J. Mariadoss, President, Farmers Association, Inamamthur welcomed the gathering and gave votes of thanks respectively. A total of 58 farmers from eleven villages in Manikanadam and Thogamalai Block, namely Inam Mathur, Pallapatti, Thoppupatti, Sooravalipatti, Pallapatti, Panjapor, Thuraikudi, Idayapatti, Mekkudi, V. Pallapatti and Pothavur actively participated. The programme ended with the national anthem.

B. Training and Exposure to Sustainable Agriculture and Organic Cultivation

St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) is a Participatory Institute (PI) of UBA which organised a Training and Exposure on Sustainable Agriculture and Organic Cultivation for the farmers on 22.11.2022,

Tuesday at Nammalvar Ecological Foundation (Vanagam), Kadavur, Karur. Rev. Fr. M. Berchmans, SJ, Director, Extension Department-SHEPHERD started the journey with prayer on the college campus before starting the journey.

Mr. Ramesh, Trainer cum Trustee, Nammalvar Ecological Foundation (Vanagam), Kadavur, Karur participated as resource person. He explained organic farming, raised beds, rainwater harvesting, life fencing, integrated farming, content method training, Home garden, Terrace garden, Foot care, Selection of lands, afforestation and Legacy Game, and also visited the cultivable lands.

Mr. Karthick, Trustee, Mr. M. Kumar, Managing Trustee and Mr. L. Eangals Raja, Treasurer, Nammalvar Ecological Foundation (Vanagam), Kadavur, Karur felicitated. Both Senior Coordinators of the Extension Department—SHEPHERD, namely Mr. S. Lenin and Mr. S. Raja welcomed the gathering and gave votes of thanks, respectively. Mr. C. Jeyachandran, Mr. P. Vijayakumar, Senior Coordinators, Mr. S. Jeyaseelan and Mr. T. Joseph Christu Raja, Junior Coordinators and Mr. N. Poorna Viswanathan, Accountant and Office Staff, participated. The staff of the Extension Department – SHEPHERD made all the arrangements for the programme.

A total of 51 farmers from five UBA villages of Manikanadam Block namely Inammathur, Sethurappatti, Thoppupatti, Yagapudayanpatti and Nagamangalam and interested farmers from other twelve (12) villages namely Sooravalipatti, Kochadipallam, Perumampatti, A. Pallapatti, Panjapor, Thuraikudi, Idayapatti, Melapachakudi, Mekkudi, V. Pallapatti, Sivanthanagar and Pothavur actively participated.

C. Design a small-scale windmill to run low-power devices

St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) is one of the Participatory Institute (PI) of Unnath Bharat Abiyan (UBA). The UBA projects have been carried over by the Extension Department-SHEPHERD of St. Joseph's College in the adopted village for the last five years. It installed a small-scale windmill to run low-power devices worth Rs.150000 at Government Higher Secondary School, Inammathur, Manikandam Block in Tiruchirappalli district with the help of the UBA Cell, Panchayat Council, and school management. The miniature windmill was first

installed in Tiruchirappalli district. It is a hallmark event in St. Joseph's College history. The windmill will produce clean, ecologically friendly electricity to help the school with its partial power (1 KV) requirements.

Windmill Project Orientation: The orientation session for the mini windmill project was held on May 30, 2022, in Shepherd. The wind turbines' purpose is to produce clean, green electricity from the wind for usage in Manikandam, Tiruchirappalli's chosen Inammathur hamlet. The conference for the wind farm project was organised by Mr. C. Jeyachandran, Senior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD. The Extension Department-SHEPHERD staff and Dr. Alex, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics, took the initiative to write the proposal. He discussed certain crucial facts, such as the required speed capacity of 3 M per second in the village and the wind output capacity of 1000 W per hour, while outlining the novel idea of creating small-scale windmills to drive low-power gadgets. The organisers talked about the capacity of the wind.

The UBA cell decided to visit places like Thuvakkudi and Kayatharu, identify a model windmill, and meet with the village people to implement the project. It also decided to give orientation to students (students from physics, electronics, II BA Eng. & UBA Cell) and to purchase materials with a proper budget.

Project proposal PPT presentation: Dr. A. Alexander, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics gave a PowerPoint presentation to NCI dated 11.06.2022 on the theme, "Design small-scale windmills to run low-power devices" under the title of Technology Development. Dr. A. Alexander, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics, Mr. S. Lenin, Senior Coordinator, Mr. S. Jeyaseelan, Junior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD, and members of the UBA cell went to different places to look for model windmills in and around the Trichy district. Unfortunately, the Trichy district lacks a windmill.

Geography for Implementation: The members of the UBA cell got permission from the education department to install the windmill. Although they were hesitant at first, they eventually agreed to implement the project on the school's campus. PI members went to the adopted village and measured wind speeds at five different locations: the community building, the panchayat council building, the water tank, and two

different spots on the school campus. Finally, they selected the campus of the Government Higher Secondary School, Inammathur for implementation. They also noted the possible availabilities and facilities.

Accessories Purchased and Assembled: The windmill accessories were purchased from Diamond Engineering Enterprises, a Chennai-based company, at cost of one lakh fifty thousand (Rs.150000.00). The accessories, which include the supply and installation of a 1000-watt domestic wind turbine with hub, tail, nose, charge controller, and brake, a 15-foot tilting type tower, and a tilting type tubular tower, as well as installation, labour, transportation, and electric cable wiring, among other things. They were properly assembled by the technical person and members of the UBA Cell.

Anchoring the working windmill: Mr. S. Lenin, Senior Coordinator, Dr. A. Alexander, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics, Mr. S. Jeyaseelan, Junior Coordinator, Mr. T. Joseph Christhu Raja, Junior Coordinator, the members of Panchayat Council council, the students of UBA cell including II BA English Literature Shift-II and the technical persons worked despite the rain and Mandi's cyclone. Even if it was raining, they established a 20-foot steel pole with a wind turbine motor on the terrace using iron stay rope tied safely on the four sides.

Electrical Work: The electrical work of a windmill turbine was used to store the energy in the batteries associated with an inverter. Mr. C. Jesuraja, an electrician at St. Joseph's College, completed all the electrical work successfully. The smart classroom, the headmistress room, and the staff room are all wired for electricity through the windmill turbine. Mr. Balaji, President, Rotary Club of Trichy City, sponsored a battery and inverter worth Rs.15000 for electrical power savings in the school.

Inauguration of windmill: St. Joseph's College, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and Rotary Club of Trichy City jointly conducted the inauguration of a small-scale windmill to run low-power devices on 14.12.2022 in Government Higher Secondary School, Inammathur, Manikandam Block of Tiruchirappalli district. The programme started with Tamil Thai Valthu and a welcome dance by school students. The program's goal was to educate the student community and rural population about the importance of lowering electricity costs and obtaining pollution-free, eco-friendly electricity from nonrenewable energy

sources. 665 students from the sixth to twelfth grades, 25 teachers, 5 members of the panchayat council, 10 college students from the UBA cell, and 25 rural residents took part. Before that, the chief guests planted saplings along the edge of the school playground.

Rev. Dr. M. Arockiasamy Xavier SJ, Principal, St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) presided over the function. He inaugurated the current supply from the windmill to LED bulbs first. He asked the school students to explore the functions of the windmill with the help of science teachers and the headmistress. He asked the school students to visit our college. He thanks the school students, college students and Panchayat Council for their support to the function.

Rev. Fr. M. Berchmans SJ, Director, Extension Department-SHEPHERD gave an inaugural address. He pointed out the production of windmill non-conventional energy utilised for the student's educational development. He said many people were involved in the project implementation and he expressed his gratitude to everyone who was involved in this project.

Mr. Karuppaiah, Life Partner of Mrs. Kamalam, Chairman, Manikandam Block, Mr. R. Bharathidasan, President, Inammathur Panchayat Council, Mr. Thangarathinam, President, Sethurapatti Panchayat Council felicitated. They expressed their sincere thanks to St. Joseph's College for giving them opportunities to participate in the inaugural function and that implement the windmill scheme in my operation block.

Mrs. Akila Baskar, Headmistress, Government Higher Secondary School, Inammathur felicitated. She was very supportive of getting an order from the Chief Education Officer (CEO) and District Education Officer (DEO) to install the miniature windmill on the school campus.

Mr. S. Lenin, Senior Coordinator, Senior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD, Dr. A. Alexander, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics, Mr. S. Jeyaseelan, Junior Coordinator, Mr. T. Joseph Christhu raja, Junior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD interventions are remarkable from the beginning to till the completion of the project. They are the prime movers in implementing the project successfully.

Dr. A. Alexander, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics participated as a Guest. He

explained the functioning of a working innovative windmill will be generating 1000 watts of DC electrical power and a maximum of five LED bulbs, three tube lights and two fans can be operated. He also delivered that just as we produce food from the soil, we can store 24 hours of electricity from the air.

Mr. C. Jeyachandran, Senior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD explained the historical background of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan under the Ministry of HRD including the Ministry of Rural Development, the Ministry of Panchayat Council Raj and the Department of Higher Education. He also pointed out that the functions of the National Steering Committee (NSC), National Coordinating Institutes (NCI), Regional Coordinating Institutes (RCI), District Administration, Panchayat Council Council and Participatory Institutes (PI) of effective implementation of the project in the grassroots level.

In the beginning, Mr. S. Lenin, Senior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD welcomed the gathering and Mr. I. John Kennady, Teacher, Government Higher Secondary School, Inammathur gave a vote of thanks at the end.

The UBA cell and the School management will be monitoring continuously the windmill. The school students will study and explore how the electrical energy that they studied in their lessons. We thank Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, the Ministry of HRD including the Ministry of Rural Development, the Ministry of Panchayat Council Raj and Department of Higher Education, National Steering Committee (NSC), National Coordinating Institutes (NCI), Regional Coordinating Institutes (RCI), District Administration, Panchayat Council Council, Participatory Institutes (PI) Rotary Club of Trichy City and Volunteers for implementing various project activities in UBA adopted villages.

D. Herbal medicine awareness and its training on production in increasing health & social status of temporary migrant workers

The temporary migrant workers were lack of self-hygiene, health and social status. There are numerous inadequacies in performing work as well as in caring at home. The herbal medicine awareness and training on production would enable them to improve their healthy and social standard of living with reasonable cost management in their locality. Herbal Medicine is one of the traditional therapies for curing human diseases. To aim at sensitizing the living and working

conditions of rural-urban temporary migrant workers concerning herbal medicine and its benefits.

Mr. C. Jeyachandran, Senior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD made a presentation to NCI dated 26.07.2022 on “Herbal medicine awareness and its training on production in increasing health & social status of temporary migrant workers” under the title of Sanitation and Solid Waste management.

Mr. S. Raja, Senior Coordinator and Mr. T. Joseph Christu Raja, Junior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD identified the migrant workers in UBA village Nagamangalam. The opportunity for temporary migrant workers and entrepreneurs to produce traditional herbal medicines for increasing health and social status was trained to the participants of the project of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan-UBA 2.0 under the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MoHRD) by the Participatory Institute of UBA on 20.12.2022 at Nagamangalam Herbal Garden.

Rev. Fr. M. Berchmans SJ, Director, Extension Department-SHEPHERD gave the valedictory address. He distributed certificates to everyone and he encouraged all participants who were involved in the training.

Mr. K. Vellaisamy, President, Nagamangalam Panchayat Council Council presided over the training. He appreciated the trainers who give the training in the cold seasons and also the Panchayat Council council will support all the initiatives taken for rural development through the college.

Dr. P. Rajalakshmi, Assistant Professor, CARISM, Sastra University, gave the keynote address. She suggested raising awareness among women about the importance of eating nutritious foods, keeping the environment clean, and engaging in physical activities that can lead to disease in a free nation. She explained how to use natural herbs and their products to treat seasonal diseases such as colds, coughs, diabetes, and joint pain, as well as how a balanced diet of nutritious foods can help you live a long and healthy life.

Mr. C. Jeyachandran, Senior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD trained the participants. In theory classes, he explained the Vatha, Pitha, and Kabha body types, the Green Health Movement, the Traditional Siddha System, the Human Immune System, and traditional health practices using

medicinal plants. He listed out the human diseases and curable medicinal plants available in herbal gardens and in and around villages.

A total of 46 women from Melanagangalam, Narayanapuram, Annanagar, MGR Nagar and Housing Board Alampatti actively participated. The participants prepared three types of six medicines such as Thirikadugu Chooranam, Thiripala Chooranam, Ammukara Chooranam, Kumari Lahiyam, Pinda Thailam and Minsara Thailam using the traditional way of Kalvam, Ural and Ammi in the practical classes. Mr. T. Joseph Christu Raja, Junior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD and Mr. S. Raja, Senior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD welcomed the gathering and gave the vote of thanks respectively.

Harvesting the Rain

The UBA villages have plenty of ponds in and around them. Of them, 30% of the ponds have water. Since the village is primarily an agricultural area and entirely dependent on rain for agricultural purposes and recharging water resources, Based on this, as per the norms of the Sustainable Development Goal (SDG), under the guidance of the Regional Coordinating Institute (RCI) and the support of the National Coordinating Institute (NCI), the selfie was taken with GPS near the pond for the catch the rain concept. The images of the selfie were sent to the Regional Coordinating Institute (RCI), Coimbatore and uploaded on the respective portal of UBA.

Tech4 Sava

The Regional Coordinating Institute (RCI) instructed us to work with the following institutions to demonstrate the projects: academic and research institutions, volunteer social service organizations, NGOs and CSR, facilitator organizations, and entrepreneurs to provide scientifically sustainable solutions to the issues that are identified at the grass-roots level through the convergence approach of the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA). The RCI also suggested the following: Technology can be defined as science applied to practical purposes, especially when it is applied for the greater good of the masses and to provide services. The technology will be chosen solely based on its utility/applicability in rural areas. Shortlist the top three technologies and share their names and technologies (of rural relevance) with the National Coordinating Institute (NCI) for further processing. They asked for assistance in organising and communicating with participants so that they

could demonstrate their technologies at the regional level. Each Participatory Institute (PI) is requested to initiate the programme at the earliest possible time and will expect more participation in the program. As per the norms of NCI, the Extension Department-SHEPHERD, St. Joseph's College (PI) demonstrated a project titled "an IOT-based saline bottle monitoring system" on 4th July 2022, at Tamil Nadu Agriculture University, Coimbatore.

UBA Cell Meeting

On 26.09.2022, the Restoration of UBA Cell was held at the Extension Department-Shepherd for the activities carried out by students in UBA-adopted villages. Mr. C. Jeyachandran, Senior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD explained the implementation of the activities and the role of students who were involved in UBA project activities. Mr. S. Jeyaseelan, Junior Coordinator, Extension Department-SHEPHERD and 23 students from undergraduate in BBA and math actively participated.

VI. ETHNO-BOTANICAL ACTIVITIES

Central Herbal Garden, Nagamangalam

The Nagamangalam College Herbal Garden was the site of the first ethno botanical activities (herbal promotion) in 1994. The objectives of the program were to increase accessibility to primary healthcare and popularise and promote indigenous health practices among the populace. The department organised events and training sessions at the Nagamangalam herbal farm throughout this academic year (2022-2023).

Herbal Resource Centre: The herbal resource centre has 52 plots. It comprises 220 species for medical purposes. Students assist in maintaining the garden by working to grow and water the plants in a well-managed manner. The staff of the Extension Department-SHEPHERD namely Mr. C. Jeyachandran, Mr. S. Lenin. Mr. T. Joseph Chiristhu Raja and college students have furnished the garden. The herbal remedy was prepared under the supervision of Mrs. P. Rajalakshmi, B.S.M.S. Sidha Doctor in Thanjavur.

Training and Exposure Programme: The exposure tour or training at the college herb garden aims to educate students or other beneficiaries about the benefits and uses of medicinal plants as well as the preservation and promotion of native species of herbal plants. Also, we provide herbal medicines, personal healthcare, and community health awareness to the

villages we serve. It will encourage leading a healthy lifestyle and shield you from the main health problems.

Organic fertilizer production unit: On March 13, 2023, II MSc Biotechnology students will prepare a vermicompost pit at the herbal farm Nagamangalam demonstration unit area. It will be used for demonstration purposes in farmer and student training.

Herbal species plantations in existing plots: The college students planted herbal species in existing herbal plots in the herbal garden. The aim of the herbal plantation is the conservation of rare and important herbal plants like Thiruneetru Pachilai, Thulasi, Marul, Nagathali, Insulin, Ranakalli, Kesavarthini, Vallarai, Vettilai, Acara, Pirandai, Manjal Karisalai, Omavalli, Poduthalai, and Non-bitter Aloe Vera (Sotrukatalai).

New herbal species plantation: The college students introduced and planted new herbal species in the herbal garden in separate plots like kallimudayan, poonameesai, iyampanai, mint tulasi, and Aloe barbadensis.

Introduced and raising herbal and tree species in the nursery unit: The college students introduced and grew common and rare herbal and tree species of Sembaruthi, Adothoda, Notchi, Papaya, Agathi, Sedimurungai, Malai Vembu, Poovarau, Gllaricidiya, Sorgam, Manjal Karisalai, Vallarai, Oomavalli, Thiruneetrupachilai, Insulin, Ranakalli, Kesavarthini, Poduthalai, Accara, Thandrikai, Mahagani, Pungan. Vagai, Neermaruchu, Komdrai, etc. Gradually, increase the nursery unit's availability of fruits, timber wood, herbal, shade, and fodder trees.

Herbal garden renovation work: From February 2023 onwards, our SHEPHERD department started the renovation work in progress in the college herbal garden. Nagamangalam. Rev. Fr. M. Berchmans SJ, Mr. S. Raja, and Mr. S. Lenin, senior coordinators, are involved in this programme. The aim of the renovation work to establish the herbal garden is to remove the weeds, remove unwanted shade giving trees, prune the trees, and add manure. The following activities involve ploughing; making canals and bunds function; planting wild species of trees; mass cultivation; introducing herbal plants in already-existing plots; and extending new herbal plants in newly-created plots.

Student's contribution to herbal garden development work: This academic year, 2022-23, a

total of 382 students were involved in the garden development work through trainings, exposure visits, and manual work. Mrs. R. Ariyamala, gardener, is involved in the watering and gardening maintenance work.

College Campus Herbal Farm:

Our Extension department introduced a campus herbal farm during the year 2023. We maintained 50 herbal species in the herbal garden. Rev. Fr. M. Berchmans SJ, Director, Mr. S. Lenin, Mr. S. Jeyaseelan, coordinators, and Mr. S. Ramalingam, gardener, are all involved in this garden development work.

Nursery unit: We maintained 12 tree species and 10 herbal species, and with the help of our college students, they will supply tree and herbal species to the community tree-growing activities and herbal awareness programmes of our SHEPHERD villages. The public, non-profit organisations, agencies, and the government all purchased the nursery seedlings to use in various nature conservation initiatives.

In the academic year 2022-23, the College Library witnessed significant growth. The addition of 1417 volumes increased the collection to a total of 183,856 volumes. Moreover, the library subscribed to 91 journals, enhancing academic resources for the students. Throughout the semester, book bank books were provided to students, and more than 25 students benefited from free books courtesy of the Rock City Welfare Association. Impressively, over 65 percent of students utilized the library's resources. Additionally, the library extended its services to staff, students, and research scholars from other institutions.

One notable initiative involved collecting over 100 books from faculty members and donating them to the Trichy District Prison Library, fostering a culture of learning beyond the college campus. The library also employed plagiarism detection software, Ouriginal Urkundu, to ensure academic integrity. As an institutional member of NLIST-INFLIBNET, the library facilitated access to e-resources for both students and staff. Furthermore, it provided training to M.L.I.S. students from Holy Cross College.

Gratitude is extended to Thiru Trichy Siva M.P. for generously donating books worth Rs. 50,000 to the Arrupe Library. Various faculty members contributed to the library's collection as well. Dr. S. Alfred Cecil Raj, Controller of Examinations, donated 265 books; Dr. J. Wilfred Angello Gerald, Head of the Department of HRM, contributed 13 books and 18 journals; Dr. M. SAGAS OF St. JOSEPH'S COLLEGE

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The IQAC organised various Training and Awareness Programmes for the members of the teaching and non-teaching staff. An Orientation Programme on Micro-Teaching was organised for the junior faculty on 14th July 2022, with Dr S. Amutha, Department of Educational Technology Bharathidasan University, Tiruchirappalli, and Dr S. Janaki, School of Arts, Science Humanities and Education, SASTRA University, Thanjavur as Resource Persons. 70 members of the faculty engaged in Micro-Teaching and the sessions were recorded. Experts from Educational Technology valued the performance of the faculty.

A Two-Day Orientation Programme for all the members of the faculty was organised on 15th July 2022 and 16th July 2022. Rev. Fr Leonard Fernando SJ, Rector and Rev. Fr Joseph Xavier SJ addressed the faculty on Ignatian Values for Teachers in SJC and Emerging Trends in Higher Education respectively. Ms Leema Peter, Visiting Professor & Counsellor, Anna University, Tiruchirappalli delivered a session on Imparting Life Skills to Students in the post-covid Scenario. The Deans of various schools conducted training programmes for the faculty on OBE Attainment and Question Paper Setting.

A Faculty Development Programme on LOCF – A Reformative Roadmap towards Excellence was conducted for the members of the faculty on 20th February 2023. A Faculty Development Programme for the junior faculty of the college was organised on Maximising Learner Engagement. Dr P. Bhaskaran Nair, Founder and President English Language Teachers' Interaction Forum, Kerala was the Resource Person.

The IQAC collaborated with the members of the Committee for Learning Management System in organising two workshops for faculty members on Importing Quizzes and Course Navigation on JosTEL on 29th September 2022 and 17th October 2022. A Faculty Development Programme on Course Design Matrix for UG Self-paced Courses was conducted on 25th January 2023.

An Induction Programme for the I UG students was organised on 27th July 2022 in which the Administrators and Officials of the college gave input on the academic culture of the campus to the students. Two Gender Sensitization Programmes were organised for the female students of Shift I and Shift II on 10th August 2022. Google Certification Courses, in collaboration with DEED-NASSCOM, were offered to 900 students of the college.

An International Student Interaction Programme was organised on 30th January 2022. 13 students from Germany interacted with 18 students of St. Joseph's College on Globalisation. A Student Interaction with the Administrators was also organised on 22nd February 2023. Student Representatives from all the classes interacted with the Administrators and Officials on various aspects of curricular, cocurricular and extracurricular opportunities available on the campus.

The IQAC organised a Health Awareness Programme for Non-Teaching Staff on the topic "Well-being is Wealth" on 20th February 2023. A One-Day Workshop on ICT Tools was also organised for the Non-Teaching Staff on 20th February 2023.

15 Self-Paced courses and a Value-Added Course were conducted on JosTEL, the Learning Management System of the college. Extra credits were offered to students completing 18 Certificate Courses offered by various departments. Internal and External Academic Audits were conducted to assess the performance of the departments, clubs and centres of excellence.

The Annual Academic Audit was conducted from 25.04.2023 to 29.04.2023. External Audit was conducted on 13th October 2023. Inventory Audit was conducted on 29th August 2023. Green Audit and Energy Audit were also conducted during the academic year.

An MoU was signed between the college and Nallas Software Solutions, Coimbatore for Corporate Training.

THE RESEARCH ADVISORY AND ETHICS COMMITTEE

The Research Advisory and Ethics Committee of our college organized a one-day hands-on seminar on the topic "Effective Online Search Techniques for Innovation in Research" for the PhD scholars on 29th October 2022. The programme was formally inaugurated by Rev. Fr. Secretary and Rev. Fr.

Principal. Dr R. Balasubramani, Associate Professor of Library and Information Science, Bharathidasan University was the resource person for the morning session. He spoke on the topic "Finding quality Journals and Anti-Plagiarism tools". Dr M. Surulinathi, Assistant Professor of Library and

Information Science, Bharathidasan University handled the afternoon session. He spoke on the topic “Effective Search Techniques”. The seminar was attended by 187 scholars.

A webinar through the Zoom platform was organized for the PhD scholars on 1st April 2023. Dr. Rabinder Henry, Professor & Director of IQAC, Chandigarh University, Mohali was the resource person. He spoke on the topic “Scientific and Technological Advancement in Research”. The webinar was attended by 107 scholars. Twenty-six faculty members belonging to the science departments of our college went to VIT (Vellore) for a research visit

on 15th February 2023. Dr P. Arulmozhiarman, Dean of Academic Research received our faculty and gave a presentation on the research activities carried out in VIT. The faculty of VIT (Vellore) belonging to physics, chemistry, mathematics, electronics, computer science and information technology departments shared the research activities carried out by them. There was a healthy interaction between the faculty of VIT (Vellore) and St. Joseph’s College (Autonomous), Tiruchirappalli. Later, they were taken to various centres of research excellence and agreed to carry out collaborative research ventures shortly.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMMES

Fifteen students from Germany visited the campus on 31st January 2023 and interacted with the students of English & B.Com Honors as part of a collaborative initiative. They discussed culture, the economy, and the education system. The International Skill Development Corporation (ISDC) has conducted 150 sessions during 2022-23 as part of the MOU.

Similarly, the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA), organized orientation and lecture sessions for B. Com Honors Students. The college has a functional MOU with Fu Jen Catholic University, Taiwan. The college has introduced a one-month international internship for interested students in association with Binary University Malaysia.

TOP UP PROGRAMME FOR JUNIOR FACULTY

A top-up programme was organized for junior faculties with less than five years of teaching experience on 27.08.2022. Dr. G. John, School of Management Studies presented the dynamics in which he urged the faculty members to be in sync with changing technology so that they remain relevant to the student community. Rev. Fr. K. Amal in his presidential address stressed the teaching community to use the latest ICT tools to enhance the teaching-learning experiences of students. Dr. T. Tamilarasi enlightened the audience on the topic “Inevitable Digital Skills” and Dr. Vimal Jerald spoke on “Digital Skills for Teaching and Learning”. Totally 96 faculty members participated in the programme. The second top-up programme for junior faculties was held on 04.02.2023. Rev. Fr. Principal in his introductory remarks, called upon the faculty members to stay current with changing circumstances. Rev. Fr. Joe Antony delivered a lecture on “Why should We Pursue

Excellence?”. Dr. Y. Dominic, Dean of Computing Sciences, explained the attainment computation of LOCF. Dr. V. Francis, Dean of Languages and Culture, narrated the LOCF Question Paper setting process. Seventy-six faculty members participated in this programme.

Junior faculty members generated micro-teaching modules that were video recorded by the media team of our college. The recordings were reviewed on 15.10.2022. Faculty members were divided into school-wise and for each school, a panel consisting of the Dean of the respective school and an External Expert was constituted. Each team gathered at five different venues, videos of micro-teaching were screened and faculty members were invited to give feedback. In the end, the expert panel gave personalized and general feedback to improve teaching based on the personal strengths and weaknesses of individual staff members.

INCUBATION AND INNOVATION CELL

The incubation and Innovation cell comprises Dr. A.N. Paul Angelo, Dr. P. Christuraj, Dr. S. Dinakaran and Dr. A. Arun Viveke. The cell’s first meeting was held on 06.10.2022 in the Dean of Physical Sciences’ office. They decided on the Year’s plan and ways to strengthen faculty and student involvement in innovation and incubation activities through motivation programmes. In response to the previous discussion, a motivational talk on

“Technological Innovation and Entrepreneurship” was organized on 16th December 2022 at Jubilee Hall. Dr. M. Sivakumar, Chief Technology officer and Co-founder, Ariviya Deep Tech PVT Ltd, Thanjavur, lectured on the topic. He motivated the students by displaying several innovative product examples, which are commercialized in the market. The talk was attended by 346 participants including faculty members, research scholars and PG students. The SJC-

IIC in association with Innovation and Incubation cell organized an orientation programme for UG and PG students entitled “Orientation for Budding Innovators” on 28th January, 2023 at Community Hall. The resource persons for the programme are Dr. B. Kanickairaj, Associate Professor of Physics & Head, Department of Electronics and Dr. M.S. Xavier Pradeep Singh, Assistant Professor of English, St. Joseph’s College (Autonomous), Trichy. Dr. A.N. Paul Angelo, Dean, School of Physical Sciences and President, SJC-IIC highlighted the importance of the orientation programme and briefed the instruction for SJC-Innovation Fest – 2023. Dr. B. Kanickairaj presented his talk on the topic “Innovation”. He addressed the importance of innovation and the way to become a successful innovator. Dr. M.S. Xavier Pradeep Singh emphasised the eight fields where one can be an innovator. Eighty-four students attended the programme. SJC-IIC in association with Innovation and Incubation Cell organized the Inter-department Innovation Fest “SJC INNOVATION FEST – 2023”. Thirty-four teams each comprising four members

participated from the Arts and Science Departments. The proposals of the innovative ideas were submitted online and peer-reviewed. The prototypes were exhibited on 03rd March 2023. Judges identified three winners each from Science and Arts Departments. The winners received Prize money to the tune of twenty-four thousand rupees. The Prize money was almost doubled from the last Innovation Fest SJC - IIC along with the Incubation and Innovation Cell organized a national level Innovation Fest entitled, “Innovathon 2023” an extended initiative of SJC to bring the national talents to our premises. Flyers reached Nation Wide and the response was encouraging. Rev. Dr. K. Amal SJ, Secretary initiated the mega event on 03rd March at KP Joseph Hall. The proposals of the Innovative Ideas were sought online mode and peer-reviewed. Twenty-nine teams participated in the event. The prototypes displayed by the participants were viewed by all the science students of SJC. Rev. Fr. Principal distributed the prizes, the first prize worth Rs 30,000, the second prize worth Rs 20,000 and the third prize worth Rs 15,000.

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS CELL

The IPR cell team of St. Joseph’s college prepared an IPR policy for the institution, which will be implemented in the academic year 2023. The syllabus for the “Intellectual Property Rights” certificate course is derived for the forthcoming academic year.

An awareness talk on “Intellectual Property Rights and its Opportunities” was organized by IPRC on 28th February 2023 in Sail auditorium. The programme started with 70 full-time and part-time research scholars from all the departments. The resource person of the day Dr. M. Sundararaman,

Professor, Department of Marine Biotechnology, Bharathidasan University, Tiruchirappalli enlightened the participants on the objectives and aims of IPRC to offer assistance to grass-root innovators to realize the commercial benefits of their innovations. He spoke in detail on patents, copyrights, design and trademarks. The registered Geographical Indications (GI) in Tamil Nadu was explained in detail. He also said that IP includes inventions, books, paintings, songs, names and designs. He clarified the doubts of the research scholars on the patent filing process and encouraged them to protect their intellectual property.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT CELL

The Entrepreneurship Development Cell organized a special visit to the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR), National Research Center for Banana, Athavathur on 28.02.2023. Fifty-four students from Shift 1 and Shift 2 accompanied by Dr. Arockia Rajasekar Coordinator of ED Cell and Mr.

Arputha Raj, Member of ED Cell visited the centre. Four students of ED cell took part in the QUEST 2023 conducted by XIME, Cochin on 24 and 25 March 2023. B. Herbert Nelson secured 1st place in Table Tennis and was endowed with a cash prize of ₹2000.

NET/SET COACHING CELL

UGC NET/SET Cell organized a two-day crash course for NET Paper I on the 3rd and 4th of March 2023. Rev. Dr. Arockiasamy Xavier SJ, Principal along with the chief guest and resource person Dr. E. Ramganes, Director IECD & Former Registrar, Bharathidasan University presided over the

inaugural ceremony. Eminent resource persons are recruited to preside over the various sessions that cover the entire syllabus of the NET Paper I. The college’s NET/SET Cell Coordinator, Dr. J. Maria Joseph, organized the event. Over 100 aspirants participated in the programme and benefited.

FR. SEQUEIRA INSTITUTE OF ENGLISH AND FOREIGN LANGUAGES

The Certificate Course on Spoken English was conducted by Fr. Sequeira Institute of English and Foreign Languages (SIEFL) for undergraduate students for a period of 45 hours. The Course started on 27th October 2022 and ended on 1st March 2023. 40 hours were conducted in offline mode and 5 hours were conducted through online mode (Google Meet). 44 students enrolled in this course and each paid ₹300. The course syllabus was approved by the faculty of the English Department before the conduct of the course. A pre-test was conducted at the beginning of the course for all the students who enrolled in the course. The Inauguration was conducted on 27th October 2022. Dr. V.L. Jayapaul, Assistant Professor & Head,

Department of English and the course coordinator inaugurated the course. The instructions were given by the course instructor Mr. S. Blesswin. Materials such as handouts and videos were provided for the students to learn outside the class hours. A Google classroom link was created to share the materials with the students and to assign assignments. The learners actively participated in both online and offline classes. A mock interview was conducted on 26.02.2023. The learners answered all the questions actively and enthusiastically participated in the mock interview. Two external examiners were invited to conduct the mock interview. A post-test was conducted at the end of the course on 01.03.2023.

COMMITTEE FOR CERTIFICATE COURSES

The academic interests and needs of the students are aplenty and are becoming increasingly dynamic. Owing to this, a meeting was convened by the principal on 02.09.2022. The Deans and Heads of the Departments suggested that a list of courses be identified and the syllabi discussed and passed in the respective departments. A total of 18 courses that had the potential to fill in the gap between institutions and industries had been approved by the committee. Understanding the practical skills required for today's job market, the courses were offered either offline or in blended mode. Overall, 847 students from St. Joseph's College and various other colleges benefitted

from this initiative. On successful completion of the course, a Certificate of Completion is issued to all the participants. All the applicants completed their courses. Of the courses offered, the School of Languages and Culture offered 37% of the courses, whereas, the other Schools except that of Biological Sciences offered 21% of courses each. The demand for the courses varied from 173 students in one course to 20 students in another. On average, 40 students attended a course which by any standard is an encouraging number. A few courses had been offered twice on demand too.

PONDICHERRY UNIVERSITY – ST. JOSEPH’S COLLEGE SOCIETY MBA TWINNING PROGRAMME

The Inaugural function for the MBA 2022 batch was held on 30.10.2022 at Sail Auditorium. MBA Finance, HRM, General, Operation and SCM were taken by 163 students during the academic year 2022-23. Dr. Ramaiah, Director of DDE, Pondicherry University was the Chief Guest. One hundred and nine

students belonging to the 2021 batch wrote their first semester examinations in the month of July 2022. The average pass percentage in all the subjects is 82%. One hundred and five students from the 2021 batch wrote their second-semester examination in the month of December 2022.

ICAI - ACCREDITED COACHING CENTRE FOR CA FOUNDATION COURSE

In the academic year 2022-2023, 20 students registered for the CA Foundation course. Among them, 15 students appeared for the CA Foundation

examination and 10 students cleared the exam. The overall passing percentage is 67.

ST. JOSEPH’S INSTITUTE OF TALLY EDUCATION (JITE)

Towing in line with certain salient features of NEP 2020, the Government of Tamilnadu started emphasising the skill development of students in the portals of Higher Education. Accordingly, it is heartening to note that the ‘Naan Mudhalvan’ scheme launched by the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu spearheaded by Tamil Nadu Skill Development Corporation included ‘Tally Essential’ as a compulsory course. Every student should undergo to increase employability in the job market. Though this will come into force from the 2023-24 academic year, JITE was at the forefront of spreading its wings in imparting a certificate course in Tally Essential, not only to our students but also to the general public. JITE completed two batches of Certificate Courses in Tally Essential including TDS and GST. In the first batch, 58 students, mostly from Government Arts and Science College, Navallur Kuttapattu, Srirangam, Tiruchirapalli underwent skill training and in another batch entire class of III B.Com Hons took the course.

Overall, 96 students completed and received certificates. JITE, after completing the Certificate Course continues to assist and aid students in enrolling them with Tally Education Private Ltd, (TEPL) Bangalore for online certification. Once enrolled in the portal, students have a year to deepen their skills by going through the video lessons and taking mock tests. We monitor their learning outcomes by checking their mock test performance. Once students complete a required number of mock tests, the Centre Head activates the link for the final certification examination which can be taken from anywhere. As this is a proctored online exam, we made arrangements in the Ehrhart Computer Centre assisted by Mr. Joseph and Mr. Leo to take up the final Certification Exam administered by TEPL. This year 100 students completed the Certification Exam. Of this, 52 students secured grades more than 75 percent and 32 students secured grades between 60 and 75 percent.

ALUMNI/AE ASSOCIATION

The SJC Alumni/ne Association of the college has been actively involved in the holistic development of the college by connecting and inviting the alumni who were spread across the world under the able Directorship of Rev. Dr M Arockiasamy Xavier SJ, Principal. The Executive Council of the association met frequently and shared their views on the plan of activities of the association.

It is a unique and rare privilege that the SJC Alumni has instituted ₹1,10,000/- towards conducting an endowment lecture every year in honour of Rev. Fr. Stansamy SJ. This year the lecture was organised on 15th December 2022 at Sail Hall. Rev. Dr. Philominraj SJ, Advocate, Madurai Bench of Madras High Court delivered the Endowment Lecture.

The Second Global Reunion of the SJC Alumni Association was grandly conducted on 25th February 2023. Dr. M.S. Viji, International We Serve Foundation was the chief guest and Mr. D. CAMBOULIVES BAND

The Camboulives Band of St Joseph’s College and Higher Secondary School has a history of 127 years. It was formed in the year 1896, thanks to the interest and efforts taken by Rev. Fr. Camboulives, S.J., a French Missionary. After guiding the Band efficiently for the past 2 years (2020 – 2022), Fr.A.Leolin Arockiadass SJ, handed over the baton to Fr L.Xystus Jerome S.J. on 30th June 2022.

During the academic year 2022-23, the band has admitted 5 new students from St Joseph’s College and Hr. Sec. School to the Band - (4 from the school and 1 from the college). The College Band members who are 25 in number, have put up an excellent display of their musical talents during Pilgrimage to Holy Redeemer’s Church, Feast of St Ignatius of Loyola, Corpus Christi Procession, Independence Day Celebration, Annual Sports Meet - College, ‘Carols by Candlelight’ – Christmas Programme in Bishop Heber

College Auditorium, Christmas Carols, Republic Day Celebration, INDEP – Inauguration & Valedictory, Flag Hoisting for the Annual Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, St.Joseph’s Feast of the College.

The band acknowledges with gratitude the continuous services rendered by our senior members – Mr Wilfred, Mr Bernard and Mr Michael Raj in coaching the members of the Band on various occasions and for teaching the new members to play various instruments.

We also place on record the participation of senior members in the various performances during this academic year. With a glorious heritage of 127 years in Band Music, the Camboulives College Band marches ahead into the future in the hope of bringing in more laurels to St.Joseph’s College and Higher Secondary School which are its parent institutions.

SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT

As part of an eco-friendly solid waste management initiative, the management has undertaken initiatives from 2017 onwards to establish a vermicompost yard within the campus. The bio-fertilizers (vermicompost) produced from the vermicompost yard are used for gardening purposes and the excess produce is sold to Josephites, outsiders and farmers for a subsidiary price. The college has kept more than 100 recycling bins across campus for the collection of biodegradable and non-biodegradable

solid waste separately, in tune with the Swachh Bharat initiatives by the Government of India. The campus is covered with a variety of plant species numbering 1153 in all some of which are more than a hundred years old. The litters from these trees are used for the vermicompost process. Solid waste from hostels and canteens is used as feed for fish and piglets. The average weight of the litter from the campus trees per month was 200 to 300 Kg. Within 12 months, with the help of earthworms the litters were converted into

vermicompost. Approximately 2000 kg of biodegradable waste was converted into 1544 kg of vermicompost. Approximately 65% conversion

efficiency was recorded in the college's vermicompost yard.

THE RAPINAT HERBARIUM & CENTRE FOR MOLECULAR SYSTEMATICS

During this academic year, our Herbarium was visited by 302 students, scholars and faculties from various schools, colleges and universities namely Sri Saradha College of Arts and Science for Women, Perambalur; Providence College for Women, Coonoor; Vetri Vinayaga Higher Secondary School, Karur; Government Higher Secondary School, Archalur, Erode; St. James Matriculation Higher Secondary School, Trichy; R.C. Middle School, Ariyamangalam, Trichy; Madurai Kamaraj University, Madurai; Jawaharlal Nehru Tropical Botanic Garden and Research Institute (JNTBGRI), Thiruvananthapuram; University of Calicut, Kerala; Bishop Heber College, Trichy; St. Xavier's College, Palayamkottai; Botanical Survey of India (BSI), Coimbatore; Institute of Forest Genetics and Tree Breeding (IFGTB), Coimbatore; Alagappa University, Karaikudi; St. Joseph's College, Trichy for consultation and reference.

Fifty-seven students, scholars, and faculties from various universities and colleges such as Srimad Andavan Arts and Science College, Trichy; St. Joseph's College, Trichy; Nehru Memorial College, Puthanampatti; St. Xavier's College, Palayamkottai; Srimathi Indira Gandhi College, Trichy; Bishop Heber College, Trichy; Anna University, Trichy; Thanthai Periyar Government Arts College, Trichy; Holy Cross College, Trichy; Khadir Mohideen College, Adirampattinam; Sastra Deemed to be University, Thanjavur; Kundavai Nachiyar Government Arts College for Women, Thanjavur; Rev. Jacob Memorial

Christian College, Dindigul; Jamal Mohamed College, Trichy; Alagappa University, Karaikudi; Periyar University, Salem visited the Herbarium for plant identification and authentication.

The Centre organized a One-Day workshop on Plant Identification and Herbarium Techniques on 24th February 2023. On the whole, 53 participants from various colleges such as Seethalakshmi Ramaswamy College, Trichy; Arignar Anna Government Arts College, Musiri; Bon Secours College of Arts and Science for Women, Thanjavur; J.J. College of Arts and Science, Pudukkottai and Alagappa University, Karaikudi actively participated and interacted with resource persons during the technical sessions.

During this academic year, the centre has published a new species *Theriophonumblumei* from Tamil Nadu in the Nordic Journal of Botany and submitted 3 research articles to various national and international Scopus/Web of Science indexed journals namely Revisiting the taxonomy of *Strobilanthes humilis* (Acanthaceae), an enigmatic species from the Western Ghats of India. Plant Science Today, Reinstatement of *Strobilanthescircarensis* Gamble (Acanthaceae). Phytotaxa and Taxonomy and synonyms of some south Indian *Strobilanthes blume* (Acanthaceae). Plant Science Today. Two new books namely Flora of the Coromandel Coast, Tamil Nadu, and Illustrations on the Flora of the Sirumalai Hills are getting ready for publication.

FR. NEWTON MUSEUM

Our college museum maintenance work started on 01.06.2022. New formalin was added to the preserved specimens. The LED lights were fixed inside the specimen cupboards. The insect boxes were cleaned. Various types of mineral stones were dusted and their old name cards were replaced with new plastic cards. The preserved birds were dusted and their old name cards were changed to new laminated cards, and the birds were placed into newly made 6

glass cupboards for display. The LED lights were fixed inside the Bird's cupboards. The skeletons of Bison, Sambar (Deer), Indian Tiger and Elephant (skull, jaw with teeth) were washed and cleaned neatly. After the completion of maintenance works, Josephites and the public were allowed to visit the museum to gain knowledge. On the whole, 2780 individuals visited the museum between June 2022 and March 2023.

JOSEPH STARTUP CENTER (JSC)

St. Joseph's College supports entrepreneurship among faculty, staff, research scholars, and students. JSC initiated the Joseph Startup Centre (JSC) last year to foster creativity by encouraging, supporting, and promoting enterprises by providing an atmosphere for

growth. Some of these businesses may be created entirely or partially on technologies/IP by the college, or in collaboration with it. By commercialisation of the products, the college wants to inculcate entrepreneurial thinking among the student mentees

under the guidance of each mentor. JSC in its second year has reached new milestones by having a completely renovated new office space to cater to the needs of the growing importance of start-ups inside the SJC campus

Jo-Lux LED Lighting startup was established to manufacture LED lights for indoor and outdoor lighting. This startup comprises two mentors Dr. S. Dinakaran and Dr. R. Jerald Vijay and two student associates R. Vishal Vibhakar and J. Chivanaesan. This year we have manufactured three varieties of LED bulbs. They are 7W, 9W and 9W Inverter LED bulbs. A total of fifty 7W LED bulbs, sixty 9W LED bulbs and twenty 9W inverter bulbs were manufactured. The LEDs have been sold at affordable prices and many customers turn up to purchase the products. A total of 15, 50 and 15 LED bulbs of 7W, 9W and 9W Inverter bulbs respectively were sold during the year 2022-2023. Due to the affordable price, many customers approached us for other varieties of LED lights such as LED tube lights and LED street lights. Therefore, JSC started to manufacture a 22W LED tube light and a 24W street light. JSC will bring the above product in the upcoming year. The startup provided the students with the best opportunity to expose themselves to the world of innovation. The young scientist's effort was made possible by the financial assistance, which was provided by the college management. Several young people were inspired by these students.

JOS-GREEN is an initiative, established through JSC. The aim is to generate electricity from renewable energy resources such as Wind, Solar, Hydro, etc., As a part of JOS-GREEN, a low-cost windmill power system was installed in St. Joseph's College on 24th March 2023. This start-up comprises two Mentors - Rev. Fr. Berchmans SJ and Dr. A. Alexandar and a few student associates. They designed a 1KW Windmill system and installed the same on the fourth floor of a library building. The installed windmill system can generate a power of 1000watts per hour which can power a minimum of Twenty 9watts LED lights, Five 36watts tube lights and five 70watts fans with a minimum wind speed of 3m/s. The raw materials such as generators, fibre blades, swivelling arrangements, passive tail, charge controllers and base frames were purchased from various industries. Cables, batteries, inverters, and towers were purchased from local companies and other hardware components were purchased from local shops. The 1kw power windmill design can also be installed on the roof or in the ground. Hence many customers have already contacted to purchase the

product. The windmills can be designed and installed in various output powers such as 100 Watts, 500 watts, 1000 watts, 2000 watts etc., Due to the affordable price, many customers approached JSC to order higher power. Hence, JSC has initiated to design of high-power windmills such as 5k watts and so on. JSC will bring the above products to the market next year. The start-up provided the students with the best learning opportunity to expose themselves to the scientific world of innovation and they got more interest in science subject. This effort was made possible by the financial assistance provided by the college management. Many students from various disciplines were inspired by these windmill systems.

Located in Trichy, TREC-STEP is a pioneering Organization, promoted in 1986, by the Central and State Governments of India, such as the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India, Government of Tamil Nadu, along with National Financial institutions such as IDBI, IFCI, ICICI and other institutions, for spearheading the promotion of Science and Technology, Innovations and Knowledge-based ventures, by nurturing the 'Spirit of Enterprise' among the aspiring youth of India and mentoring and hand-holding them to realize their growth targets, through their Innovative Technology Ventures, in the globalized marketplace. A team of six faculty members from St. Joseph's College visited this facility (TREC-STEP) on 25th January 2023. The team comprises Dr. F. R. Alexander Pravin Durai, Head, Department of Commerce; Dr. A. Rose Venis, Dean, IQAC; Rev. Fr. Berchmans SJ, Director, Incubation, Innovation, Start-up and IPR Cell; Dr. S. Dinakaran, Coordinator, Incubation and Innovation Cell; Dr. A. Arun Viveke, Assistant Professor of Chemistry; Dr. V. Manickam, Assistant Professor of Electronics and Mr. S. Arputharaj, Assistant Professor of Business Administration. The team was led by Dr. F. R. Alexander Pravin Durai. The team met Mr. R.M.P. Jawahar, Executive Director, Ms. Bindu Balakrishnan, Assistant General Manager and Mr. R.M. Thiagarajan, Project Manager from TREC-STEP and convened an interaction with the team. The Executive Director, R.M.P. Jawahar, provided an overview of TREC-structure STEPs and the help it offers to promote new industries, including funding sources, seed funding, subsidized central production facilities and other need-based support. Ms. Bindu Balakrishnan, Assistant General Manager briefed the facilities provided to the incubators, monitoring their progress and helping them avail of the funding. At the end of the interaction, both teams decided to have a follow-up meeting at SJC with the faculty members.

Finally, the team visited the facilities available at TREC-STEP such as laboratories, basic production facilities, classrooms, a video training theatre, etc. Mr. R.M. Thiagarajan, the project manager, coordinated

the visit. This has given the team of staff members new enthusiasm to enter into a more concrete way of taking the innovation centre to greater heights.

FR. EHRHART COMPUTER CENTRE (ECC)

Fr. Ehrhart Computer Centre, known as ECC stands very tall with 192 latest computers distributed over three different labs, catering for the essential needs of the students of Arts and Science disciplines. The ECC is proud of having the top-level IBM server called 'Blade Server' with the latest zero downtime dual set circuits and Xeon E5504 processor with 1 TB hard disk and 16 GB RAM. To distribute the high-end server power, 9 NetGear 24-port network switches and nine patch panels with power managers are installed. To switch over seamlessly among the server blades, the KVM switch is fixed with which eight blades can be attached. Lab 2 is furnished with 30 new computers having i7 latest 12th Generation Processor, 500 GB NVME M.2 SSD, 16GB DDR 4 RAM and state-of-the-art LED monitors. To maintain the processing speed in accordance with the new high-speed server and latest client machines, the ageing 100 MB/Sec network cables are replaced with CAT 6 type cables with 1000 MB/Sec speed. The EB lines are renewed and restructured for better safety of the students. For longer uninterrupted power supply, 30 KVA Alltech

UPS, 20 KVA and 15 KVA CONSUL UPS are maintained with 81 brand new 40AH tubular batteries. To facilitate the final year project image outputs better, a multifunction Canon Image Runner 2520 laser printer, Lipi T6306 and the Latest Model Printronix P8005 Line Matrix Printer were Newly Installed. The lab is specially used for the Tally Prime Academic Course for all the students including those other than St. Joseph's College, Regular Labs from 8.30 a.m. to 6.40 p.m., IOT-based practical labs by the Department of IT. It caters to the essential needs of 3500 Students of Arts and Science disciplines per semester. To catch up with the technological race, we have upgraded the following various software packages: From Windows Server 2008 32-bit version to Server 2012 64-bit version; From Linux version Fedora 3 to Fedora 11 in the server; From Windows 7 to Windows 10 Operating System in the client machines; From DotNet2008 to DotNet2010; From Microsoft Office 2010 to Microsoft Office 2013; From Sequential Query Language 2005 to SQL 2008; From NetBeans 8.0 to NetBeans 8.2; From Java 7 to Java 8.

FR. JEROME CENTRE FOR INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY (JCICT)

The centre was named after the former Principal, Rev. Fr. Jerome D'Souza SJ, who was one of the members involved in framing the Constitution of India. The centre was opened by Rev. Fr. K. P. Joseph SJ, former Rector, on 12th October 1998. Information and Communication Technology (ICT) is revolutionizing the quality of education and learning taking place from any corner of the World. A society becomes a knowledge society if the ICT tools and the e-Learning Technologies are effectively utilized. St. Joseph's College has been a pioneer in using Digital technology. The new initiatives of this academic year at JCICT are 60 Systems with i7 configuration, 6 HD CCTV Cameras, 20 KVA Fuji Electric Consul UPS 2

Numbers with Air conditioning. New ID Card Tags are introduced on the Campus for more than 7500 students including the PhD Research Scholars. From Biometric to Face Detection e-attendance is introduced for the Ph. D Scholars with report generation of the individual portal. The computer systems at various departments and administrative offices are secured with Antivirus. As per the IQAC direction, a new Appsys for self-appraisal is developed. The Department of Data Science shouldered the responsibility of Shepherd ERP. NAAN MUDHALVAN and NPTEL-SWAYAM Caption of Announcements provided on the college home page. Valanaayam cum Alumni website is revamped with PGI Integration of Bill Desk.

FR. SAVARIRAJ COMPUTER CENTRE (SCC)

Savariraj Computer Centre has 2 IBM X-series Servers (x3500 M4, x3400) housed at JCICT with the above configurations. The SCC lab has 75 nodes with Intel Core i5 processors ranging from 2nd to 6th generation, 8GB/4GB RAM, 256-SSD and 500-GB/1-TB HDD. These nodes have Windows 10 Professional 22H2 - 64-bit Operating System Installed

along with various software needed for regular practical sessions. In addition, there are 2 desktop systems available for supporting the administrator room for Remote server administration. The SCC has two UPS units, one with a capacity of 10kV and the other with 20kV. These UPS units provide uninterrupted power supply to the entire lab, ensuring

that critical equipment and systems remain functional even during power outages. Additionally, the power infrastructure includes air conditioning systems that regulate the temperature in the server room and the rest of the lab. The networking infrastructure at the SCC consists of six 24-port Ethernet switches, four of which are D-link-1024D switches and one is D-link-DEs-3026 switches. These switches enable network connectivity between various devices, including desktop computers, servers, and printers. Furthermore, the centre has a Cisco SG300-28 Gigabit Managed Switch that provides advanced network management features such as VLANs, QoS, and port mirroring.

The SCC has a Voltas Vectra Windows AC installed in the server room, which maintains a constant temperature to ensure the reliable operation of servers and other networking equipment. Additionally, there are two Carrier 1.5-ton Split AC units and two Voltas 2-ton AC units that maintain a comfortable environment for students and staff. The air conditioning systems are well-maintained to ensure their optimal performance.

The centre has a Lipi 6605 Line Matrix Printer that is used by students to take printouts. This printer is designed for high-volume printing and can print up to 500 lines per minute. The printer is well-maintained to ensure its reliability and performance.

One of the major highlights of the year was the replacement of 65 hard disk drives (HDD) with 65 solid-state drives (SSD) in our computer systems. The new SSDs have significantly improved the performance of our systems, reducing boot-up times and enhancing the overall computing experience for the students and staff. To enhance the security of our systems, we installed Kaspersky antivirus software in 75 of our computer systems. The new software provides advanced threat protection and ensures that our students' and staff's data and systems remain secure from malware and other threats. We have also updated our operating systems and other software programs to ensure that our systems are up-to-date and secure. The following software upgrades have been performed: Microsoft Windows 10 Professional H1R1 to H2R2, Oracle WebLogic Server 11g R1 from old servlet server JSDK2.1, Android Studio Arctic Fox to Android Studio Dolphin, JDK 8 to JDK 11.0.13, and an upgrade to the latest supported version of Node.js. The new versions may offer better performance, stability, and security. It may also provide better compatibility with newer versions of other software.

The Computer Centre provided a range of services to II and III UG and I and II MCA students during the academic year 2022-2023. These services

included: Regular software practicals for 1 MCA and 2 MCA conducted in SCC were successful in providing hands-on experience in JAVA, RDBMS, Programming Smart Devices, and Mean Stack Webapp. The practicals helped in enhancing the skills of the students and making them industry-ready. The practicals also helped the students to develop a deeper understanding of the concepts and their applications. Overall, the practicals were highly beneficial for the students and were conducted successfully. The JAVA practical was conducted to teach students about the basics of JAVA programming. The students were taught about classes, objects, variables, and data types. They were also taught about various operators, loops, and conditional statements. The students were then given assignments to write programs to solve different problems. They were also given a project to develop a basic application using JAVA. The RDBMS practical was conducted to teach students about the basics of RDBMS. The students were taught about tables, fields, and records. They were also taught about SQL queries and how to write them. The students were then given assignments to create tables, insert data into them, and write SQL queries to retrieve data from the tables. The practicals for Programming Smart Devices included topics such as Android Development, iOS Development, and Cross-Platform Development. The students were given tasks such as developing a simple Android application to calculate BMI, developing an iOS application to manage contacts, and implementing a cross-platform application to manage tasks. The students were able to understand the basics of mobile application development and implement various applications for different platforms. The Mean Stack Webapp Lab was conducted to teach students about the basics of Mean Stack Web app development. The students were taught about the different components of Mean Stack Webapp, including MongoDB, Express.js, Angular.js, and Node.js. They were also taught how to develop basic web applications using Mean Stack. The students were then given assignments to develop a basic web application using Mean Stack. The SCC proved to be a suitable venue for the online tests conducted by "Prodapt" and "Vavo" to recruit talented software professionals. The lab's high-end systems with the latest configuration with 5 systems, speedy internet connection, web camera, and headphones with a mic ensured that the tests were conducted seamlessly. The SCC programmers were trained to assist the candidates during the test in case of any technical glitches, which ensured that the tests were conducted in a proctored environment.

“Data Analytics using Python& Analysis using Python” lab session was conducted in SCC till the end of the course. The course aimed to equip participants with the necessary knowledge and skills in Python programming language and Data Analytics to help them develop their analytical and computational abilities.

The lab session for the Skill Enhancement Course (Between School) “Data Analysis using Spreadsheet” was conducted in SCC for II UG students from various departments.

The lab session for the skill-based Elective (within School) “E-Commerce” was conducted in SCC for III UG students from various departments. The extra lab for IDC web design was organized as a bridge course for 1st-year MCA students from other class major students. The objective of the course was to provide an opportunity for the students to learn web design and development concepts and technologies. The lab sessions were conducted in a well-equipped computer lab, which had all the necessary software and tools for web design and development.

The online tests for comprehensive examinations, 3rd component, and self-paced learning courses, including mid, end, and semester

examinations for all undergraduate (UG) and postgraduate (PG) students were conducted using “JosTEL”, a web portal designed for the conduct of online tests. The SCC provided the necessary infrastructure and technical support to ensure the smooth conduct of the tests on various dates.

The Semester Arrears Practical Examinations for all UG and PG students in our college were conducted successfully in the SCC. The SCC programmer and staff worked tirelessly to ensure the smooth conduct of the exams, and the students were cooperative and followed all necessary instructions.

“Staff evaluation” was conducted at SCC, where students were asked to provide feedback on the staff members. The evaluation process involved logging into the ERP system using their credentials and providing their assessments of the staff’s performance.

“TECHX23”, a state-level technical symposium, was organized by the Department of Computer Science and featured various technical events and workshops for the students. One of the technical events held in SCC during the symposium was “Web Fusion,” which focused on web design and development.

FR. MATHEW MOOLEL

HARDWARE & NETWORKING LAB (MMHNL)

IoT experiment kits have been purchased during the academic year 2022-2023 and they were all used by the second year UG students both shift 1 & shift 2 for hardware practicals. These kits, which include a breadboard, USB power cable, Node MCU, and HC-SR04 ultrasonic sensor, were purchased to enhance the learning experience of second-year undergraduate students. Throughout the academic year, these IoT experiment kits were used by students to develop and implement various projects related to the Internet of Things (IoT). The students utilized the breadboard to create various circuits and connect different components. The Node MCU, an open-source microcontroller, was used to program and control the connected components. The HC-SR04 ultrasonic sensor was integrated into projects to detect the presence of objects and measure distances. The availability of the IoT experiment kits had a significant impact on the student's learning experience. By

providing access to these resources, the students were able to gain a deeper understanding of the concepts related to IoT. Additionally, the practical applications of these concepts helped students to better appreciate the real-world implications of IoT. By using these modules, the students can gain hands-on experience with designing and testing logic circuits, and they can also learn about important concepts such as Boolean algebra, logic gates, and digital signals. The MMHNL for III B.Sc. students has successfully implemented several hardware experiments including multiplexers, de-multiplexers, flip flops, memory devices, 4-bit and BCD adder, 8085 programming 1&2, OS installation & CMOS setup, network cable crimping, peer-to-peer, and Wi-Fi bridging & routing. These experiments have been designed to provide hands-on experience to students in various hardware components of computer systems.

ARCHBISHOP CASIMIR

INSTRUMENTATION CENTER (ACIC)

The main objective of the centre is to make access to research-level equipment for all the science scholars belonging to both physical and life sciences. Towards this goal, a spacious air-conditioned

laboratory has been established and housed with costly research-level equipment. This centre is rendering its service not only to the scholars on the campus but also to all the scholars of the cluster colleges of

neighbouring districts in the southern part of Tamil Nadu. The centre is upgraded with new research-grade equipment periodically. From our record, more than 127 colleges, 18 universities and 25 Engineering colleges have benefited from this centre for the last 17 years. All the equipment is fully automated with

computer support. The centre is managed by Rev. Dr M.Arockiyasamy Xavier SJ as Director, Dr. S. Soosai Raj and Dr. S. Mangalraj as staff coordinators, Mr. Y. Vincent Sagayaraj as Lab Administrator and A. Arockia Iruduayasamy as a full-time technician.

NEW HOSTEL

The academic year 2022-23 on 18th July 2022. Almost a regular academic year commenced after a gap of two years of irregular academic years. A little more than eight hundred hostellers were admitted for the current academic year. Rev Dr S Paul Pragash SJ and Bro Savarimuthu SJ continued as the Director and the Deputy Director. The induction programme for the first UG students was held on 28th July 2022. Dr. M. Mahendran, Dr. Christy, Dr. Iruthaya Jothi and

Dr.Vimal Jerald were the resource persons. The resource persons oriented the first UG students “on the importance of communication skills, aptitude skills, group discussion, interview practices and employers’ expectations”. Around 1600 students participated in this induction programme.

Transformational Leadership programme was held on 24th August 2022. Mr.Nicholas Francis, Director & CEO of CAN HR, Madurai, was the resource person. Around 100 PG students participated in this programme.

A Webinar on where can I study MBA? held on 25th August 2022. Mr.Sivakumar, CEO of Trichy Plus, was the resource person. Around 125 UG final-year students participated.

A Career Advancement Programme on CAT Exam preparation was organised in association with MOCKAT on 25th August 2022. Mr.Vignesh Srinivasan, Director, MOCKAT was the resource person. Around 350 students in the final and second year from Shift – II participated.

Vimal Jerald, Ms. Virgil Marian Garret, Ms. Iswarya, Ms. Valentine Nancy and Ms. Jansi Morton were the resource persons. Dr. D. Ravindran, Vice Principal delivered the valedictory address. Around 200 students participated in this programme.

ST. JOSEPH’S IAS ACADEMY

The St. Joseph’s IAS academy was inaugurated on 28th October 2022, Rev. Dr. K. Amal SJ, secretary and Rev. Dr. M. Arockiasamy Xavier SJ, principal felicitated the gathering. The Rotary Club of Trichy sponsored books and Television to the academy and some eminent persons from the club participated in this inauguration. Mr. P. Suresh Kumar, Deputy Director (Rtd), Employment office, Trichy and Prof G. Balakrishnan, former vice principal & Head Dept of English, St. Joseph’s College, were the chief guests. They motivated and provided suggestions to young

aspirants. The first class was handled by Dr. M. Maruthai, former professor and Head, Bharathidasan University, Trichy. He also shared his experience of how he cleared prelims and mains. Nearly thirty students are undergoing training in this academy. The topics of Aptitude, Logical reasoning, Indian History, Polity and Governance, Geography, Environmental Studies, Indian Economics, etc., are discussed by eminent faculty members. Dr J. Maria Joseph Coordinates the programme.

INTERNSHIP CELL

The III UG students of both shift – I (963) and shift – II (1123) have undergone an internship in the month of December 2022. The students, with a total strength of 2086, have completed their internship with a minimum period of 15 days, between 5th December and 31st December 2022. After completing the

internship, the III UG students returned on 3rd January 2023. Students of II MCA, II MSc (Data Science) and II MSc (Computer Science) also went for the internship / Project from January 2023 onwards. A few students of II MSc (Chemistry) have completed their internship at CECRI, Karaikudi.

JOSTEL: JOSEPH'S TECHNOLOGY ENHANCED LEARNING

Two workshops were conducted for our faculty members on importing quizzes and course navigation on JosTEL. These workshops were aimed at enhancing their understanding of the platform and its various features. They were held on 29th September 2022 and 17th October 2022 respectively. Mock tests were conducted for Component II and Component III on JosTEL on 8th October 2022 and 27th October 2022 respectively. These tests provided an opportunity for our students to practice and prepare for the upcoming exams.

Research scholars were given a workshop on accessing JosTEL for Bridge course activities on 27th October 2022. The students were then able to access the platform for their bridge course activities.

An online MCQ test was conducted for the final MCA-comprehensive course and B.Sc computer science Self-Paced Learning course on JosTEL on 28th October 2022. This test provided an efficient and convenient way for students to take their exams. Level exams for I UG of B.Voc SD & SA were conducted on JosTEL on 8th November 2022.

Two certificate courses were conducted during the academic year 2022-2023. The Mathematics Certificate Course and Information Technology Certificate Course provided students with additional skills and knowledge in these areas.

The Self-Paced/Comprehensive Semester Examinations were held on 19th November 2022. These exams tested the students' understanding of the course material and their ability to apply it. An Internship Programme was conducted from 15th December 2022 to 27th December 2022. This programme provided students with valuable industry experience and helped them gain practical skills that will benefit them in their future careers.

A Faculty Development Programme on CDM was conducted on 25th January 2023. This programme provided our faculty members with an opportunity to enhance their knowledge and skills in this area. The CDM review sessions were conducted from 8th February 2023 to 10th February 2023. This review provided an opportunity for our faculty to reflect on their progress and identify areas where they needed improvement.

In conclusion, the academic year 2022-2023 was filled with numerous events and activities that were conducted to enhance the learning experience of our students and faculty members. These activities provided valuable opportunities for our students to improve their skills and knowledge, and for our faculty members to enhance their understanding of the latest teaching technologies. We look forward to continuing these efforts in the future to provide the best possible educational experience for our students.

BRIDGE COURSE

The Department of English conducts a Bridge Course every year for incoming undergraduate students, aiming at bridging the gap between high school and undergraduate curricula. Its primary objective is to equip students with the required English language skills for a seamless transition to college. This academic year, the Bridge Course underwent significant changes in its conduct.

On 21 June 2022, an Advisory Committee was constituted by Rev. Fr. Principal to frame the guidelines for the conduct of the Bridge Course for the academic year 2022-23. The following professors were on the committee: Rev. Dr. S. Paul Pragash (Coordinator of the Advisory Committee); Rev. Dr. Arulanandam (Vice Principal-Shift I); Dr. John (Dean, School of Management Studies); Dr. V. L. Jayapaul (Head, Department of English); Dr. Francis (Dean, School of Language and Culture); Dr. J. John Love Joy; Dr. Qurshid Begum (Additional Dean, IQAC); Dr. M. S. Xavier Pradheep Singh; Dr. A. Johnson Francis;

Dr. Loyola Innaci (Coordinator, Department of English – Shift II).

The Bridge Course titled “Communicative English” is a 4-credit compulsory Ability Enhancement Course for first-year undergraduate students. It is 90 hours in duration. 70 hours of classes were held in face-to-face mode and the remaining 20 hours were online practical sessions delivered through JosTEL, our college LMS.

The Bridge Course was conducted for all the freshmen who had been admitted to the undergraduate program. They needed to secure 80% attendance and 40% marks in the Bridge Course. A total of 1840 students (914 from Shift I and 926 from Shift II) from all disciplines attended the course.

To meet the language needs of the students, it was decided to stream students according to their language proficiency levels and train them appropriately. Hence, an Entry-level English language proficiency test was conducted on 1 and 2 August 2022

to check students' levels in the following areas: listening, speaking, reading, writing, grammar and vocabulary.

Based on their performance, students were divided into three streams: Basic, Intermediate, and Advanced. Each stream was further divided into sections, and the sections were designed to be small to ensure that each student received individual attention from the staff members. On average, Basic stream sections had 30 students, Intermediate stream sections had 40 students, and Advanced stream sections had 45 students.

A textbook prepared by Dr. V. L. Jayapaul, Assistant Professor and Head, Department of English, was followed for the Basic stream. For the Intermediate stream, a textbook titled Learning to Communicate by Dr. J. John Love Joy, Assistant Professor of English, was followed. For the Advanced stream, materials prepared by a team of Assistant Professors from the Department of English (Dr. D. R. Edwin Christy, Dr. J. Amalaveenus, Dr. S. Sajeev, and Ms. K. Primrose) were used.

A total of 89 staff members handled classes for Shift I and II. Of these 89 staff members, 36 were professors from the Department of English and 35 were professors from other departments. Professors from other departments were identified by the Deans of respective schools, based on their English language skills. 18 Ph.D. Researchers from the Department of English were also selected by the Advisory Committee to handle classes.

The staff members were responsible for delivering lectures, conducting continuous internal assessments, and providing individual attention to the students who needed extra help in learning the English language. The following table summarises the break-up of the staff members.

A one-day orientation programme was conducted on 08 August 2022 for the staff members who were to handle classes for the Bridge Course. A total of 71 professors from both Shift I and II, and 18 Ph.D. Researchers attended the programme. Apart from the entry-level test, students were periodically assessed on the following language skills for the continuous internal assessment. Different question papers were set for the three streams of the Bridge Course. Students were expected to secure a minimum of 40 out of 100 marks in the Bridge Course CIA.

The following table summarises the result of the CIA for the Bridge Course:

Student absenteeism was a serious issue in the Bridge Course. Around 10 % of students were absent throughout the Bridge Course as they did not realise the importance of the course. For the students to view it seriously, it was decided that students who had attendance between 60% and 80% had to pay a fine of Rs 200. In the same manner, students who had attended less than 60% of the classes were asked to repeat the course in the even semester. For such students, a separate Bridge Course for 50 hours was conducted from 21 February to 27 March 2023.

A Review Meeting was conducted on 16 March 2023 to evaluate the conduct of the Bridge Course and thank all the staff members who were involved in organising and teaching the Bridge Course. Around 70 professors from both Shift I and II and 18 Ph.D. researchers attended the meeting. Rev. Fr. M. Arockiasamy Xavier, the principal, convened the meeting. Dr. A. Johnson Francis welcomed the gathering. Dr. M. S. Xavier Pradheep Singh presented a detailed report on the Bridge Course. Staff members shared their feedback and suggestions for the improvement of the Bridge Course. Rev. Dr. S. Paul Pragash shared his perspectives as the coordinator of the Bridge Course Advisory Committee. Rev. Fr. Principal thanked everyone for their involvement in the conduct of the Bridge Course. Dr. V. L. Jayapaul proposed a vote of thanks. Certificates were distributed to all the staff members who handled the Bridge Course classes.

The bridge course for first-year undergraduate students was a successful program that helped to prepare the students for their undergraduate program. The course was well-designed and conducted by a team of experienced staff members. The students were engaged and motivated throughout the course, and they gained valuable knowledge and skills in the English language that would be helpful for their future academic and professional pursuits. The course helped to bridge the gap between high school and college and provided the students with a solid foundation for their undergraduate program.

REMEDIAL COACHING CLASSES

The main objective of the remedial classes was to cater to the needs of the weaker sections of the students who did not get through the internal and external examinations and to provide academic support to the slow learners. The Management constituted a committee with the following members for coordinating the remedial classes: Dr. L. Arockiam (Coordinator), Rev. Dr. S. Arul Oli SJ, Dr. V.L. Jayapaul, Dr. J. Maria Joseph, Dr. Arockia Rajasekar and Dr. M. S. Xavier Pradeep Singh.

Each department identified a minimum of 1 and a maximum of 3 remedial courses, depending on the number of failures in the courses offered by the department. Each department assigned a faculty staff member for the identified courses for conducting the remedial coaching classes. The faculty fixed the duration of the classes as 20 or 25 hours. The assigned faculty member maintained attendance and submitted a brief report to the committee at the end of the course.

The procedure for evaluation was decided by the department and the concerned staff. They conducted two tests for 10 marks each with a gap of 10 days to analyse the progress of the students.

There were 24 courses held in the odd semester and 325 students benefitted through these remedial classes. Almost 90 per cent of the students got through the internal exam and became eligible for semester exams. In the Even semester, almost 600 students joined the remedial classes in 34 courses.

Most of the Professors expressed that they fulfilled the expectations of the students. Many professors spend a lot of time for the benefit and welfare of the students. All the professors were very positive about the classes and its outcome. The classes were very helpful for the slow learners to get through the CIA exams. The management spent about two and a half lakhs rupees in the year 2022 – 2023.

MENTORING

Mentoring is a structured and trusting relationship that brings young people together with caring individuals who offer guidance, support and encouragement aimed at developing the competence and character of the mentee. Mentoring is a unique healthy practice of SJC. It is a valuable strategy designed to offer the Mentees (students) with BASIC ID (Behaviour, Affective, Spiritual, Imaginative, Cognitive, Integrative and Dependent tendencies). By providing information, guidance, accompaniment and encouragement, mentors play a very significant role in nurturing and shaping the lives of the college. A teacher as a mentor provides a young person with support, counsel, friendship, reinforcement and constructive examples that a young person is longing for. Mentoring for students in St. Joseph's College is directed toward helping them feel connected to the campus community and experience a sense of belonging that optimizes for improved student outcomes.

In SJC, a Mentor serves as a teacher, guide, advocate, counsellor, friend, and colleague who shares the mission of moulding responsible citizens who can be good human beings, and good leaders. It is a social responsibility to accompany the students closely and

help them to grow as mature and happy persons in society. The catchword for Mentoring is captured in the acronym "CARE"- Caring, Accompanying, Reflecting and Experiencing. Teacher as Mentor is committed to helping the students to develop "BASIC ID"- Behaviour, Affective, Social, Imaginative, Cognitive, Integrative and Dependent Tendencies of student life. Formal mentoring: Mentor meetings are arranged during class hours. Schedule and agenda are sent in advance to the mentors of all the departments.

During the allotted hours, Mentors meet the students in the allotted places. We have organized four formal mentor meetings during the academic year 2022-23 to date. Feedback Files are shared with the Principal, Vice-principal and IQAC Coordinator. Informal Mentors: Students are highly encouraged to meet their mentors according to their felt needs and the proceedings are recorded in the student's workbook given to them. The outcomes reflect on various relevant themes, Self -awareness, Team Building, Career guidance, Group counselling, Interpersonal living, sharing professional expertise, Forum for student sharing, identifying slow learners and assisting them and Enhancement of mentor-students' repertoire.

BUSINESS AWARENESS CLUB

The Department of Business Administration has conducted the activities of Business Awareness Club on 13th August 2022 titled 'Logo and tagline – Identification & Designing'. This activity was aimed to foster their awareness on brands, their logos, taglines and business acumen. A quiz was conducted

CAREER GUIDANCE CLUB

The Career Guidance Club of the Department of Business Administration conducted the following activities exclusively designed for III BBA students. On 13th August 2022, a group discussion was arranged. The aim of the GD was to provide students with an opportunity to develop their communication and critical thinking skills, as well as to help them understand the importance of teamwork and collaboration. The topics covered in the GD are: Russia-Ukraine war, Sri Lanka's Economic crisis, E-learning – Pros & Challenges, Post-Covid world and how social media is taking away our social skills. The discussions were monitored by a panel of three faculty members who evaluated the students on their communication skills, clarity of thought, ability to work in a team, and overall performance. The students actively participated in the discussions and presented their viewpoints on the topic. They raised valid arguments and counter-arguments, which led to a healthy and constructive debate. The panel of faculty members provided valuable feedback to the students, highlighting their strengths and areas for improvement. Overall, the GD was a success and helped the students to develop their communication and critical thinking skills. It also provided them with a platform to showcase their talents and work collaboratively with their peers.

On 7th February 2023 a panel discussion on “Union Budget 2023 - 2024” was conducted in a seminar-style format. The students were divided into smaller groups, and each group was given a budget-related case study to discuss. The case studies were designed to simulate real-life budget scenarios, and the students were asked to analyse the situation and develop a budget plan. Dr. S. Clemence Jenifer has mentored this activity. The students demonstrated a good understanding and analysis of the current Budget proposed by the Indian Government and evaluated the pros and cons of it. The panel discussion provided an excellent opportunity for the students of Business Administration to learn about the current affairs of the country and its impact on public and personal life.

On 22nd February 2023, the career guidance club has arranged a case discussion on the “Stock market Scams” with the purpose of enlightening the students on how Indian stock market was manipulated. STEPHEN HAWKING INNOVATION CLUB

The Stephen Hawking Innovation Club is aimed at promoting innovation and research in the fields of Physics and Astronomy. The club was inaugurated in August 2022 and is headed by Dr. N. Ravi, the Head of the Department of Physics. The club's coordinators, Dr. P. Christuraj and Dr. R. Antony Raj, mentor students on academic and research projects, and encourage them to develop a scientific approach to problem-solving. The club organizes various events and programs, including lunar observation with NASA, stellar spectroscopy research, and the International Asteroid Search Campaign, among others. Through these initiatives, the Stephen Hawking Innovation Club aims to inspire and motivate students to pursue a career in Physics and Astronomy and contribute to the advancement of scientific knowledge.

One of the significant achievements of the club was the successful collaboration with NASA's Lunar Observation Program. In October 2022, St. Joseph's College, in partnership with NASA's public outreach program, organized a lunar observation program through the Messier Telescope of the Stephen Hawking Innovation Club. The event was a grand success, and everyone who participated received certificates from NASA.

Another notable achievement was the International Asteroid Search Campaign. The campaign trained students from the Physics Department on how to identify and discover asteroids in space through the NASA-collaborated IASC program. Thirty students participated, learned scientific techniques and software knowledge to discover asteroids, and made eight preliminary asteroid discoveries. Three discoveries were promoted to provisional status, and students received honours from NASA through their certificates, and their names were registered in the Minor Planet Centre (MPC), NASA.

The Stephen Hawking Innovation Club also initiated a Stellar Spectroscopy Research project. Under the project, students aim to study the chemical compositions of stars and their spectral lines. This research is a promising opportunity for students to understand the universe's evolution, origin, and structure. In addition to the above, the club also made significant progress in organizing various events and programs, such as the Sun Spot Observation, the Star Party, and the National Science Day celebration. These events have helped inspire and motivate

students to pursue a career in Astronomy and to take an interest in STEM innovation.

The Stephen Hawking Innovation Club was inaugurated on August 24th, 2022 in the Smart Room of the Physics Department, and nearly 50 students from shift I and II, including girl students, participated. The event was headed by Dr. N. Ravi, the Head of the Department, and the club coordinators, Dr. P. Christuraj and Dr. R. Antony Raj, mentored the students on how to get started with academic and research projects. Dr. P. Christuraj gave a speech explaining what innovation thinking is and how students should approach projects and problems, create proposals, and present their ideas. Dr. R. Antony Raj delivered a talk on developing a scientific mentality and how to frame questions that would develop into research and innovation. Future goals and programs of the club include Lunar Celebration with NASA space outreach programs, a workshop on discovering asteroids from the Pan-Stars Observatory, Hawaii, a public course on Observation Astronomy and open sky observation sessions, practical small sessions for third-year undergraduate students to learn more about self-based study paper on astrophysics, and getting proposals for new innovative ideas from students to implement.

In the International Asteroid Search Campaign, students from the Physics Department are trained to identify and discover asteroids in space through the NASA-collaborated IASC program. Thirty students participated and learned scientific techniques and software knowledge to discover asteroids. Eight preliminary asteroid discoveries were made, and three were promoted to provisional status. Students received honours from NASA through their certificates, and their names were registered in the Minor Planet Centre MPC, NASA.

The Sun Spot Observation conducted on September 23rd, 2022, was a novel initiative of the Stephen Hawking Innovation Club to make students see the sun and its structures through the Messier Telescope built by club members last year. A special talk on the sunspot cycle was arranged by Mr. Aazhimukilan from the club, and a Q&A session was arranged for students to interact and ask questions.

The NASA Lunar Observation Program was conducted on October 6th, 2022 where St. Joseph's College in collaboration with NASA's public outreach program, organized a lunar observation program through the Messier Telescope of the Stephen

Hawking Innovation Club. The event was a grand success, and everyone received certificates from NASA.

The Star Party conducted on January 9th, 2023, was a state-level star-gazing program conducted by the Stephen Hawking Innovation Club for students all over the state to observe the beauty of the night sky with sophisticated telescopes like the club's Messier Telescope.

The National Science Day celebration was conducted on February 28th, 2023. The talk aimed to introduce students to the world of Observational Astronomy and Archeoastronomy and highlight the contributions of ancient Indian astronomers in these fields. The talk aimed to inspire students to pursue a career in Astronomy and to motivate them to take an interest in STEM innovation.

ALBERT EINSTEIN QUIZ CLUB

The main objective of the Einstein Quiz Club is to ignite the young minds towards current affairs in science. The club inauguration for the academic year 2022-2023 was held on 07 September, 2022. The smart room (Department of Physics). Dr. A. Irudhaya Jothi delivered a special talk on the title "Why Quiz?". 44 quiz club members and 17 other participants benefitted from the interactive session.

The club conducted quiz on 05 January 2023. Nearly 30 participants attended this event. Certificate was given to the winner students. From the winners we have chosen two students and that students were taken to attend the quiz conducted by INDEP 2023.

In conclusion, the Stephen Hawking Innovation Club has made significant strides in promoting innovative thinking and research in the field of astronomy and astrophysics.
